PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 1 of the Forestry (Transfer of Woods) Act, 1923, it is enacted that His Majesty on the joint representation of the Forestry Commissioners and of the Commissioners of Woods may by Order in Council make provision for the transfer to and vesting in the Forestry Commissioners of any estate interest rights powers and liabilities of the Crown and of the Commissioners of Woods in or in connection with any woods and forests under the management or control of the Commissioners of Woods; and for any property transferred under the Act being held and dealt with by the Forestry Commissioners in like manner in all respects as property acquired by them under the Forestry Act, 1919; and for such consequential and supplemental matters as appear necessary for giving full effect to the Order:

And whereas in the said Act the expression "woods and forests" includes any land used or capable of being used for afforestation or for purposes in connection therewith:

And whereas by the Forestry (Title of Commissioners of Woods) Order, 1924, made under Section 4 of the said Forestry (Transfer of Woods) Act, 1923, the Commissioners of Woods were from and after the 31st day of December 1924 to be styled and known as the Commissioners of Crown Lands:

And whereas by Section 5 of the Crown Lands Act, 1936, it is enacted that subject to the provisions thereof His Majesty on the joint

representation of the Commissioners of Crown Lands and the Forestry Commissioners may by Order in Council transfer to and vest in the Forestry Commissioners all the estate and interest of His Majesty in any land in Great Britain purchased by the Commissioners of Crown Lands within six months before the date of the Order; and that the provisions of the Section shall be in addition to and not in derogation of the hereinbefore recited provisions of Section 1 of the Forestry (Transfer of Woods) Act, 1923:

And whereas the land the subject of this Order more particularly described in the Schedule hereto and hereinafter referred to as the said land, being land used or capable of being used for afforestation or for purposes in connection therewith, was purchased by the Commissioners of Crown Lands on the ninth day of February, 1939, and a joint representation has been made to His Majesty by the Commissioners of Crown Lands and the Forestry Commissioners to order the transfer to and vesting in the Forestry Commissioners of the said land on the terms hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Forestry (Transfer of Lands from the Commissioners of Crown Lands) Order, 1939.

2. The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies for the purposes of the interpretation of this Order in like manner as it applies for the purpose of the interpretation of an Act of Parliament and as if this Order were an Act of Parliament.

3. As from the day of the date of this Order, and by virtue thereof, all the estate interest rights powers and liabilities of His Majesty and

of the Commissioners of Crown Lands in or in connection with the said land is transferred to and vested in the Forestry Commissioners.

4. The sum of £11,500 (hereinafter referred to as the capital sum) being a sum equal to the price at which the said land was so purchased together with the expenses incurred by the Commissioners of Crown Lands in connection with the purchase, shall be paid out of the Forestry Fund to the Commissioners of Crown Lands at such time (not being later than the expiration of ninety-nine years from the date of the purchase of the said land) as the Forestry Commissioners think fit, and of which time the Forestry Commissioners shall give six months' previous notice in writing to the Commissioners of Crown Lands.

5. Until the capital sum is paid out of the said Fund there shall be paid annually by equal half yearly instalments on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in each year out of the said Fund to the Commissioners of Crown Lands the sum of £460 (being the sum which the Commissioners of Crown Lands and the Forestry Commissioners have, with the approval of the Treasury, agreed to be equivalent to a reasonable rent for the said land), the first of such half yearly instalments or a proportionate part thereof commencing from the date hereof to be made on such of the said half yearly days for payment of the said sum of £460 as shall happen next after the date hereof.

6. The capital sum when paid shall be carried to the account of the capital of the Land Revenues of the Crown and applied accordingly, and the said annual sums shall be treated as annual income of the Land Revenues of the Crown and applied accordingly.

7. The said land shall be held and dealt with by the Forestry Commissioners in like manner in all respects as property acquired by them under the Forestry Act, 1919.

8. Nothing in this Order shall have effect so as to transfer to the Forestry Commissioners any estate, interest, rights, powers or liabilities of the Crown or of the Commissioners of Crown Lands in or in connection with any foreshores, mines royal, or other prerogative rights of the Crown or arising otherwise than by reason of the purchase of the said land.

WHEREAS by Section 659 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (which is a Section in Part XI of that Act) it is (amongst other things) enacted that His Majesty may by Order

in Council fix the establishments to be maintained by each of the General Lighthouse Authorities on account of the services of light-houses, buoys and beacons or the annual or other sums to be paid out of the Mercantile Marine Fund in respect of those establishments:

And whereas by Section 738 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, it is (amongst other things) enacted that where His Majesty has power under that Act or any Act thereafter to be passed amending the same to make an Order in Council His Majesty may from time to time make that Order in Council and by Order in Council revoke, alter or add to any Order so made:

And whereas by Section 1 of the Merchant Shipping (Mercantile Marine Fund) Act, 1898, it is (amongst other things) provided that references in Part XI of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, to the Mercantile Marine Fund shall be construed as references to the General Lighthouse Fund by the now reciting Act constituted:

And whereas, by the Northern Lighthouse Board (Establishment) Order, 1936, and the Northern Lighthouse Board (Variation of Establishment) Order, 1937, the establishment to be maintained by the Commissioners of Northern Lighthouses being one of the General Lighthouse Authorities referred to in the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and the salaries to be paid out of the General Lighthouse Fund in respect of that establishment were duly fixed:

And whereas it is expedient to fix such additional sums to be paid out of the General Lighthouse Fund to the present holders of the posts of Secretary, Accountant, and Senior Clerk respectively as are hereinafter provided:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Him by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and of any other powers Him thereunto enabling, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Northern Lighthouse Board (Establishment) Order, 1939, and shall come into operation on the date of publication in the London Gazette.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Northern Lighthouse Board (Establishment) Order, 1936, and the Northern Lighthouse Board (Variation of Establishment) Order, 1937,

(a) the salary of Mr. J. Glencorse Wakelin, at present Secretary, shall be £1,350 per annum with effect from the 1st day of January, 1939, rising to £1,400 per annum on the 1st day of January, 1940;

(b) Mr. Robert Johnston, at present Accountant, shall be granted an allowance of £50 per annum with effect from the 1st day of January, 1939;

(c) the salary of Mr. John Simpson, Senior Clerk, shall be £695 5s. per annum with effect from the 1st day of January, 1939, rising by annual increments of £25 to a maximum of £730 per annum.

3. The sums payable under the provisions of this Order shall be paid out of the General Lighthouse Fund.

4. The Interpretation Act, 1889, shall apply to the interpretation of this Order in like manner as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of Section 84 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (57 & 58 Vict. c. 60) it is enacted that whenever it appears to His Majesty The King in Council that the tonnage regulations of the said Act have been adopted by any foreign country and are in force there, His Majesty in Council may order that the ships of that country shall, without being remeasured in His Majesty's dominions, be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry or other national papers, in the same manner, to the same extent and for the same purposes as the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of a British ship is deemed to be the tonnage of that ship:

And whereas by sub-section (2) of the said Section it is (amongst other things) provided that His Majesty in Council may make the Order subject to such conditions and qualifications (if any) as His Majesty may deem expedient:

And whereas it appears to His Majesty that the tonnage regulations of the said Act have been adopted by the Government of the Kingdom of Egypt and are now in force there:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in virtue of the powers vested in Him by the said Section, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(a) This Order may be cited as the Egyptian Tonnage Order, 1939.

(b) The Interpretation Act, 1889 (52 & 53 Vict. c. 63) shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. Ships of the Kingdom of Egypt the certificates of registry or other national papers of which are dated on or after the 31st December, 1935, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such certificates of registry or other national papers in the same manner, to the same extent and for the same purposes, as the

tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of a British ship is deemed to be the tonnage of that ship.

3. This Order shall apply to ships of the Kingdom of Egypt when in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, Newfoundland, Burma, British Colonies or Protectorates or mandated territories in respect of which the mandate is exercised by the Government of the United Kingdom.

"Whereas the property, particulars whereof are set forth in the Schedule hereunder written, is now vested in us not subject to any outstanding beneficial lease or grant but in possession and we are desirous of selling the same or some portion thereof for the improvement of our Common Fund:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty that we may be authorised and empowered to sell or dispose of and duly to transfer or convey from time to time all or part of the said property described in the said Schedule for such consideration as shall appear to us to be just and reasonable.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been

duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the Diocese of Southwark.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve of the Award of the Medal of the Military Division of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire to the undermentioned:—

*For Gallantry.*

Mulazim Theodore Bogdanovitch, Trans-Jordan Frontier Force.

On the 11th March, 1939, this officer was in charge of a mechanised troop despatched from Irbid to the Zemal area, to locate a reported armed band. Mulazim Bogdanovitch succeeded in finding the band, and "pinned" it in a Wadi, until the arrival of air and land reinforcements. He then, though under heavy fire, displayed outstanding powers of leadership in advancing to the attack under cover of his skilfully disposed Light Machine Guns. When Mr. Macadam was killed, he took charge of the situation, and gallantly led his men down the side of the steep Wadi, inflicting many casualties on the

band, and driving the remainder on to the reinforcing troops.

His dogged determination to defeat the band, his complete contempt of personal danger, and the tactical skill he displayed, were an inspiration to his men, and contributed in no small measure to the success of the action. This Officer has, on many other occasions, displayed outstanding qualities of leadership and loyalty.

#### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

#### WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION ACT, 1925-1930.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that on the 28th June, 1939, he made a Scheme under Section 47 of the Workmen's Compensation Act, 1925, as extended by the Workmen's Compensation (Silicosis and Asbestosis) Act, 1930, extending and varying the Silicosis and Asbestosis (Medical Arrangements) Scheme, 1931, as amended by the Silicosis and Asbestosis (Medical Arrangements) Amendment Scheme, 1934. The Scheme extends the requirements contained in the 1931 Scheme that workmen employed in certain specified processes shall submit to medical examination on being engaged for work in the processes and thereafter at the prescribed intervals to certain additional processes in the Pottery Industry.

Consequent on this extension the Secretary of State has also made a Scheme varying paragraph 15 of the Various Industries (Silicosis) Scheme, 1931.

Candidates for the Consular Service or the Assistant Officer Grade in the Department of Overseas Trade must be natural-born British subjects and born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions of parents also born within those territories, except when the circumstances are such as to justify a departure from the general rule, in which case they can be allowed to compete by special permission of the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, provided they fulfil the conditions of the rule in respect of nationality prescribed for candidates for admission to His Majesty's Civil Service as a whole, viz.:—

Candidates for the Assistant Officer Grade in the Export Credits Guarantee Department must fulfil the conditions of the above-mentioned rule prescribed for candidates for admission to His Majesty's Civil Service as a whole.

4. 7. Candidates must take up subject 68 French Language, and reach a high standard in it. They must also take either subject 27 General Economics, or subject 3 Elementary Economics, but they may not take both.

8. In Section B a candidate who wishes to offer subjects the aggregate value of which exceeds 750 marks (or 800 marks if Russian Language be selected) must name a subject to be valued on a reduced maximum in order to bring the aggregate to 750 (or 800). JUNIOR ACCOUNTANTS IN THE INLAND

*N.B.—Competitions under these Regulations are open both to men and women. The Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.*

1. The Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken by the Department by public advertisement in the Press or otherwise to make known the existence of vacancies have been such as to secure all desirable publicity. The advertisement will fix the last day on which applications can be received and the date by which the age limits will be reckoned.

2. Applications will be addressed to the Department on the appropriate form. After the last day for application has been reached, the authorities of the Department will scrutinize all the applications received and recommend to the Commissioners such candidates as appear to them to be best qualified for the duties. They will at the same time forward to the Civil Service Commissioners the application forms of the candidates recommended, together with the forms of any candidates not recommended who are employed in a Government Department; and the list of candidates to be interviewed by the Selection Board will then be settled by agreement between the Department and the Civil Service Commissioners, who may, if dissatisfied with the candidates recommended, take such steps in consultation with the Department as they think fit to obtain other candidates.
