

make Regulations under Section 71 (2) of the Factories Act, 1937, for factories in which the sole or principal industry carried on is one or a combination of the following, namely:—

The spinning of cotton, woollen or worsted yarn, or the weaving of cotton or woollen or worsted cloth or carpets.

The proposed Regulations which are entitled The Factories Act (Weekly Hours of Young Persons under Sixteen) (No. 1) Regulations, 1939, provide that the total hours, exclusive of intervals allowed for meals and rest, that may be worked in any week by young persons who have not attained the age of sixteen employed in any such factory in processes in or incidental to the processes specified, shall be forty-eight. The Regulations will not apply to young persons who have not attained the age of fifteen and who were not so employed in any such factory prior to the coming into force of the Regulations.
