WHEREAS by the Military Manœuvres Acts, 1897 and 1911, it is enacted that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, authorize the execution of military manœuvres within specified limits during a specified period not exceeding three months:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, by virtue of the power for this purpose given to His Majesty by the said Acts, and of every other power hereunto enabling Him, doth hereby authorize the execution of military manœuvres within the limits specified in the Schedule to this Order during the period of two calendar months commencing from the 15th day of August, 1939.

And the Right Honourable Leslie Hore-Belisha, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

SCHEDULE.

All those parts of Yorkshire lying within a line drawn as follows, excluding where any road, track, waterway or railway line is named as a boundary, such road, track, waterway or railway line:—

On the North, from the cross-roads about $\frac{1}{4}$ mile southwards of Catterick Bridge railway station, eastwards along the road through

Scorton, over Atley Hill, skirting North Cowton and Markstone House to High Entercommon; thence eastwards along the road to Soursike Farm; thence north-eastwards along the road by High Worsall Moor, Worsall Grove, Kirklevington Grange through High Leven, Maltby and Hemlington, by Gunnergate Hall to the road junction near Marton Grange; thence south-eastwards along the road to Marton Moor House; thence north-eastwards to the road junction about $\frac{1}{4}$ mile north-east of East Hambleton; thence north-westwards along the road to the road junction about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile northwards of Ormesby; thence north-eastwards along the road through Eston and Kirkleatham to Marske; thence due east to the coast at Stone Gap.

On the East, from this point south-eastwards along the coast to Spurn Head.

On the South, from this point westwards along the north bank of the River Humber to the railway bridge across the River Ouse between Goole and Skelton; thence south-westwards along the railway line through Goole and Thorne to Stainforth Junction; thence westwards along the railway line to the point about 1 mile south-eastwards of Hampole station where the line passes under the road from Adwick-le-Street to Skellow.

On the West, from this point northwards along the road through Skellow to the cross-roads at Barnsdale Bar; thence north-westwards along the road through East Hardwick, Pontefract and Glass Houghton to Castleford; thence northwards along the road through Aberford, Bramham, Wetherby, North Deighton and Little Ribston to Knaresborough; thence north-westwards along the road to Ripley; thence generally northwards along the

road through Wormald Green, Ripon and North Stainley to the cross-roads at West Tanfield; thence north-westwards along the road by Masham station to Burton House; thence north-eastwards along the road by Firby Grange through Bedale to the road junction at Leeming Bar; thence north-westwards along the Roman road through Catterick to the cross-roads about $\frac{1}{4}$ mile southwards of Catterick Bridge station.

Which area surrounded on all sides by a continuous red line is delineated on a map, signed by one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, copies of which are deposited in the War Office and the Privy Council Office.

SAFEGUARDING OF INDUSTRIES ACT, 1921.

AMENDMENT OF LIST OF ARTICLES CHARGEABLE WITH DUTY UNDER PART I.

(SAFEGUARDING OF KEY INDUSTRIES.)

1. Section 1 (5) of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, provides that for the purpose of preventing disputes arising as to whether any goods are or are not chargeable with duty under Part I of the Act, the Board of Trade may from time to time issue lists defining the articles which are to be taken as falling under any of the general descriptions set out in the Schedule to the Act, and where any list is so issued defining the articles which are to be taken as falling under such general description, the said Schedule shall have effect as if the

articles comprised in the lists were therein substituted for that general description.

2. Section 5 (3) of the Finance Act, 1936, provides, amongst other things, that the power of the Board of Trade under sub-section (5) of Section 1 of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, to issue lists defining articles which are to be taken as falling under any of the general descriptions set out in the Schedule to that Act shall include power to amend any list so issued.

3. The Board of Trade hereby amend List H issued in 1921 by deleting mercury chloride and substituting mercury subchloride.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT BY COMPETITIVE SELECTION OF CARTOGRAPHERS (UNESTABLISHED) IN THE HYDROGRAPHIC DEPARTMENT OF THE ADMIRALTY.

N.B.—Competitions under these regulations are open both to men and women. The regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. Candidates should be under 25 years of age on the last day fixed for the receipt of applications, but consideration will be given to those with special qualifications up to the age of 30 years.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalisation or by any other voluntary and formal act.

The consent of the authorities of the Admiralty is required before the child of a naturalised British subject can be appointed to that Department.

3. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for appointment.

No person actually serving in the Navy, Army or Air Force will be eligible for consideration unless he produces, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to apply for appointment, dated before his appearance before the Selection Board, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Candidates must possess a knowledge of the principal map and chart projections, of the methods and principles of surveying, and of physical geography, and should be accurate, though not necessarily highly-finished, draughtsmen. Experience of field surveying and knowledge of a modern language will be additional recommendations.

7. When the list of applications in respect of a competition has been closed, the credentials of all the candidates will be examined by the Civil Service Commissioners, who may, if they so desire, invite the assistance of officers of the Admiralty; and those candidates who appear to have the requisite qualifications and to be best fitted for appointment will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board, who will recommend for the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications. The decision of the Selection Board will be final. The Board will be constituted by the Civil Service Commissioners in consultation with the authorities of the Admiralty, who will be represented on the Board.

8. Female candidates must be unmarried or widows and will be required to resign their appointments on marriage.

9. Candidates may submit with their application for admission to the competition reports or recommendations on their experience or qualifications from previous employers or the authorities at the colleges or schools at which they have been trained.

Any attempt, direct or indirect, on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through persons other than those mentioned in the previous paragraph will disqualify them for appointment.

10. The necessary number of candidates will be appointed in a temporary capacity, subject

to their satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners that they are eligible in respect of age, nationality, health and character, and to the payment of a fee of £3. They will be eligible for subsequent appointment to the established grade of Cartographer as vacancies occur therein.
