REGULATION MADE IN PURSUANCE OF SECTION 13
OF THE ARCHITECTS (REGISTRATION) ACT,
1931, AMENDING THE EXISTING REGULA-
TIONS.

Amendment to Regulation 26.

Add the following paragraph at the end of the Regulation:—

"or (5) if his application for registration be made before August 1st, 1940, and if having served before August 1, 1938, as an architectural assistant in an architect's office in the United Kingdom for a period of not less than one year, he proves to the satisfaction of the Admission Committee that on August 1st, 1938, he was an architectural assistant and that he had been engaged in the study of architecture and execution of architectural work in any part of His Majesty's Dominions for at least seven years, and had received an architectural education and training equivalent in value to that normally received by an architect in the United Kingdom."

At the end of 44 (1) insert the following paragraph:—
