FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) SPECIAL ORDER No. 41 OF 1939.

SUBJECT.

I. Contracts the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area around Keighley, Yorks, W.R., as from 15th July, 1939, so as to comprise only the area described in the Schedule.

II. Releases the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area around Clayton, Yorks, W.R., from restrictions and revokes Order No. 5856 as from 19th July, 1939.

SCHEDULE.

Contracted Infected Area around Clayton, Yorkshire, West Riding.

IN THE COUNTY OF THE WEST RIDING OF YORKSHIRE.

The city and county borough of Bradford
The county borough of Halifax
The boroughs of Brighouse and Pudsey
The petty sessional division of East Morley (including its detached parts), and so much of the borough of Keighley as lies to the south-west and south of the following boundary namely:—the road running from Hebden Bridge via Hard Nese, Oxenhope Mill, Royd House, Moor End, Cross Roads and Whins Wood to Keighley as far as the point where the said road crosses the Halifax, Thornton and Keighley branch line of the London and

North Eastern Railway, thence in a northerly direction along the railway line to its junction with the London Midland and Scottish Railway line running from Skipton via Keighley to Bingley and thence in an easterly direction along that railway line.

In the petty sessional division of Otley.

The parish of Baildon.

In the petty sessional division of West Morley.

The parish of Queensbury and Shelf.

In the petty sessional division of Keighley.

So much of the parish of Bingley as lies to the south of the road running from East Morton via Eldwick Crag, Knappley Ing and Intake Gate to the Hawksworth—Burley road.
