

The parish of Countesthorpe except so much of that parish as is bounded on the north and part of the east by the boundary between the parish of Countesthorpe and the urban district of Wigston and on the west and south and the remainder of the east by an imaginary line commencing at a point on that boundary coincident with the centre of the Countesthorpe to Wigston Road and drawn thence in a southerly direction along the centre of that road to a point opposite the south-western corner of the enclosure numbered 43 on the ²⁵⁰⁰ Ordnance Map (Edition of 1930) Leicestershire Sheet XXXVII. 14, thence in an easterly direction to and along the southern boundaries of the enclosures numbered respectively 43 and 42 on the said Ordnance Map, thence in a northerly and easterly direction along the western and northern boundaries of the enclosure numbered 58 on the said Ordnance Map and terminating at the point at which the boundary between the said parish of Countesthorpe and the urban district of Wigston meets the northern boundary of the said enclosure numbered 58.

In the rural district of Lutterworth:—

The parishes of Broughton Astley, Dunton Bassett, Ashby Magna, Willoughby Waterless, Peatling Magna and Arnesby.

In the rural district of Market Bosworth:—

The parishes of Nailstone, Barlestone, Osbaston, Market Bosworth, Cadeby and Peckleton.

In the rural district of Blaby:—

The parishes of Leicester Forest West, Thurlaston, Potters Marston, Stoney Stanton, Sapcote and Kilby.

In the rural district of Market Harborough:—

The parish of Fleckney.

In the rural district of Billesdon:—

The parishes of Wistow, Kings Norton, Galby and Frisby.

In the rural district of Barrow-upon-Soar:—

The parish of South Croxton.

In the rural district of Melton and Belvoir:—

The parish of Gaddesby.

So much of the urban district of Oadby as is not within the existing limits for the supply of gas by the Corporation.

To authorise the Corporation to exercise within the added areas all or some of the powers exercisable by them within their existing limits for the supply of gas.

To provide that so much of the added areas as is comprised within the limits for the supply of gas by the Kibworth Gas Company Limited shall cease to form part of such limits and to prohibit that Company from exercising in any such part of the added areas any powers conferred on them in respect of their undertaking.

To transfer to and vest in the Corporation the undertaking of the Narborough, Blaby, Enderby and Whetstone Gas-Light and Coke Company Limited (hereinafter referred to as "the Company") upon and subject to the

terms and conditions contained in the intended Special Order, and to confirm and make binding on the parties any agreement or agreements which may have been entered into between the Company and the Corporation with respect to such proposed transfer and vesting and the payment of compensation for loss of office to directors and officers of the Company.

To repeal all or some of the provisions of the Narborough and District Gas Order, 1936, and to make all such other provisions as may be deemed necessary or expedient for the purposes of or in connection with or in consequence of the said proposed transfer and vesting.

To empower the Corporation upon the lands hereinafter described (being lands upon which the Company are authorised to erect gasworks and to manufacture and store gas and manufacture and work up residual products) to maintain, erect, alter, improve and renew gasworks with all necessary machinery and apparatus and to make and store gas and to work up and convert residual products and to purchase and use material required to work up and convert residual products.

The said lands are:—

A triangular piece of land containing by admeasurement one acre, two roods and twenty-two and two-thirds perches or thereabouts situate in the parish of Whetstone in the rural district of Blaby in the county of Leicester consisting of that part of the enclosure numbered 27 on the ²⁵⁰⁰ Ordnance Map (Edition of 1930) Leicestershire Sheet XXXVII. 9 which is bounded on the north by the London Midland and Scottish Railway, on the east by an accommodation road and on the south as to part by the road leading from Whetstone to Desford and as to the remainder by the embankment of the approach to the bridge which carries the said road over the said London Midland and Scottish Railway.

To authorise the Corporation to purchase or take on lease houses, cottages and buildings for persons employed by them in connection with their gas undertaking and offices, showrooms and other buildings for the purposes of that undertaking; to erect fit up maintain and let any such buildings; and to fit up showrooms and offices and exhibit specimen installations and give demonstrations of the uses to which gas can be put.

To make further provision with regard to the gas undertaking of the Corporation and in particular to relieve the Corporation from obligation to supply gas in certain circumstances; to empower the Corporation to cease to supply gas to persons improperly using or dealing with the same; to authorise the Corporation to lay pipes for ancillary purposes; to empower the Corporation to inspect, take off, remove, test, repair and replace meters; to provide that fittings let for hire shall not be subject to distress, or to proceedings in bankruptcy and that such fittings shall continue to be the property of the Corporation although fixed to premises or the soil thereof and shall be removable by the Corporation; and to enable the Corporation to compel consumers to repair gas fittings and apparatus in cases of danger.
