The KING has been graciously pleased to approve of the award of the Medal of the Military Division of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire to the undermentioned:—

For Gallantry.

No. 4388265 Corporal Thomas Atkinson, 1st Battalion, The Green Howards (Alexandra, Princess of Wales's Own Yorkshire Regiment).

Corporal Atkinson, who was in charge of the mechanical transport when a truck caught fire at Jinsafut Camp, Palestine, on the 15th March, 1939, organized the removal of the remainder of the Mechanical Transport to a point clear of the burning truck.

Without his initiative and energy in rallying the drivers, and assisting them to move their trucks out of danger, the remainder of the transport must have caught fire as well; and a general conflagration throughout the camp would have been inevitable.

Corporal Atkinson was subsequently indefatigable in his efforts to subdue the fire right up to the time that he was severely burnt in endeavouring to save the life of one of his comrades.

No. 2926326 Private Thomas McAvoy, 1st Battalion, The Green Howards (Alexandra, Princess of Wales's Own Yorkshire Regiment).

At Jinsafut Camp, Palestine, on the 15th March, 1939, a truck in the centre of the mechanical transport caught fire. Private McAvoy was amongst those endeavouring to put out the flames of the burning truck, working beside the near-side petrol tank, which was alight.

To relieve the pressure in the petrol tank, and to save a possible explosion, he took up a pick-axe and pierced the petrol tank, without any thought for his own safety, though he must have been fully aware of the appalling risk he was taking.

The jet of burning petrol, which immediately rushed out, caused him to be badly burnt.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS RESPECTING AN OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION FOR THE SITUATION OF DRAUGHTSMAN (UNESTABLISHED) IN THE HYDROGRAPHIC DEPARTMENT OF THE ADMIRALTY.

N.B.—*A Competition under these Regulations is open to candidates of either sex.*

1. The limits of age for this situation are 18 and 30; candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the examination. A candidate who attained the age of 18 on the first day of the examination would be admitted, but a candidate who attained the age of 30 on that day would not be admitted.

In reckoning age for competition the following allowances will be made:—

(i) Persons who have served or are serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served.

(ii) Persons who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied; in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

The consent of the authorities of the Admiralty is required before the child of a naturalized British subject can be appointed to that Department.

3. No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for admission to the examination unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination before the commencement of the competition.

4. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character. Female candidates must be unmarried or widows and will be required to resign their appointments on marriage.

5. The examination will be in the following subjects, viz.:—

1. Drawing.
2. English.
3. Arithmetic.
4. Geography.
5. Mathematics.

Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners in drawing and in the aggregate. A high standard of draughtsmanship is required.

6. Application for permission to attend an examination must be made in the writing of the candidate, at such time and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

7. A fee of 15s. will be required from each candidate attending the examination.

8. The successful candidates will be appointed in a temporary and unestablished capacity, subject to their satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners that they are eligible in respect of age, nationality, health and character; they will be eligible for subsequent appointment to the established grade of Draughtsman as vacancies occur therein. Appointment to the established staff is conditional on the issue by the Civil Service Commissioners of a certificate of qualification; a fee of 15s., being the balance of the prescribed fee of £1 10s., is payable before the certificate of qualification can be issued.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competitive Examination will be held under the foregoing Regulations, commencing on the 24th October, 1939.
