PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS in accordance with the Promissory Oaths Act, 1868, the Oath of Allegiance and the official Oath as to England are required to be tendered to and taken by each of the officers named in the first Part of the Schedule to the said Act in the presence of His Majesty in Council or otherwise as His Majesty shall direct:

And whereas the said Act has by subsequent enactments been made applicable to other Ministers of the Crown as if they were included in the said Part of the said Schedule:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, by virtue of the powers conferred on Him by the said Act and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf is pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. The Oath of Allegiance and the official Oath as to England shall, in the case of any officer named in the first Part of the Schedule to the said Act, other than the Chancellor of the Duchy of Lancaster, or of any officer to whom the said Act has been or is hereafter so made applicable as aforesaid by any subsequent enactment, be tendered to and taken by him, if he be a member of the Cabinet, in the presence of His Majesty in Council, or, if he be not a member of the Cabinet, in the presence of the Lord Chancellor or the Lord President of the Council or one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

2. The Oaths to be tendered to and taken by the Chancellor of the Duchy of Lancaster shall, whether he be a member of the Cabinet or not, continue to be tendered and taken as heretofore.

3. This Order may be cited as the Promissory Oaths Order, 1939.

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Order in Council bearing the date the 6th May, 1938, sanction was given, *inter alia*, to the institution of a branch of naval ratings entitled the Air Fitter and Air Rigger branch:

"And whereas we consider it desirable to abolish the title of Air Rigger and to institute a new branch of personnel to be entitled the Air Fitter branch, to include all personnel at present serving in the Air Fitter and Air Rigger branch:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty by Your Order in Council may be graciously pleased to sanction the institution, with effect from a date to be determined by us, of the Air Fitter branch, with grades of Air Fitter, Leading Air Fitter, Petty Officer Air Fitter and Chief Petty Officer Air Fitter; the rates of pay and allowances, transfer arrangements, and conditions of service to be as at present laid down for corresponding ratings of the Air Fitter and Air Rigger branch; service in the latter branch to be allowed to reckon towards progressive pay and for all other naval purposes as if it had been served in the Air Fitter branch."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 7th day of July, 1939 (C.W. 3517/39), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas the status and remuneration of Master Tailors at Royal Marine Establishments is as laid down in Order in Council bearing date the 3rd day of March, 1936:

"And whereas we consider it desirable that the conditions of service of the aforesaid Master Tailors should be amended:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the revised conditions of service set forth in the Schedule annexed hereto.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.

"SCHEDULE.

"*Rank*.—Master Tailors to be given Acting Warrant Rank on appointment, remaining on probation for two years when they would be confirmed as Warrant Master Tailors, if satisfactory in all respects, with their original

seniority. Promotion to Commissioned Officer from Warrant Rank to be at 10 years' seniority as Warrant Officer and subject to the usual recommendations. Master Tailors at present holding such appointments to be granted seniority from their date of entry as Master Tailor.

"*Pay*.—Pay and allowances to be on the scale for Warrant Officers, Royal Marines (and Officers promoted therefrom).

"In addition to service pay and allowances, Master Tailors at present holding such appointments to receive a fixed and non-pensionable salary of £310 per annum, and a variable bonus not exceeding £50 per annum, as an incentive to minimising cutting and other expenses.

"For future entrants, the fixed and non-pensionable salary to be at the rate of £160 per annum only, in addition to service pay and allowances and the variable bonus not exceeding £50 per annum.

"*Non-effective pay*.—Retired pay, widows' pensions and allowances to children and other relatives to be at the rates and subject to the conditions laid down in respect of other Warrant Officers and Commissioned Officers from Warrant rank. Master Tailors at present holding such appointments to be eligible for retired pay on the scale for Warrant Officers or Commissioned Officers from Warrant rank but service for this purpose to count only from the date of this Order in Council.

"*Retirement*.—Compulsory retirement to be at 60 years.

"*Uniform Allowance*.—As for other Warrant Officers.

"*Title*.—Warrant Master Tailor.

Commissioned Master Tailor."

"And whereas under Order in Council bearing the date the 2nd day of February, 1937, it was provided that the junior Sergeant Major at each Royal Marine Division and the Depot,

Deal, should have status equivalent to that of Army Sergeant Major, and that other Sergeant Majors should be styled Staff Sergeant Majors with pay, status and general conditions equivalent to those of Naval Warrant Officers:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the abolition of the condition that, in order to qualify for promotion to Staff Sergeant Major, Sergeant Majors, Royal Marines, should be required to have completed two years' service in the junior rank.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

Your Order in Council to authorise us, at our discretion, to make promotions to ranks of Commissioned Officer from Warrant rank accordingly in the following branches, within the establishments shewn:—

Commissioned Superintending Clerk—3.

Commissioned Staff Sergeant Majors—2.

Commissioned Bandmasters—2.

Commissioned Royal Marine Gunner—1.

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council dated the 13th August, 1920, sanction was given to the payment of Marriage Allowance for the wives and legitimate children of married Seamen, Marines and Reservists borne on the books of Your Majesty's Ships, and of Marines on shore strength, and of ratings of the Shore Signal Service and Shore Wireless Service of the age of 25 years and over:

"And whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council dated the 27th October, 1936, the qualifying age for Marriage Allowance for certain Reservists was reduced to 21 years:

"And whereas we are of opinion that the qualifying age for Marriage Allowance in respect of married Seamen, Marines and Reservists should be reduced to 20 years of age:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction with effect from the 29th June, 1939, the payment of Marriage Allowance in respect of Seamen, Marines and Reservists of the age of 20 years and over.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

WHEREAS by section one of the Civil Defence Act, 1939 (2 & 3 Geo. 6. c. 31), it is enacted that His Majesty may by Order in Council transfer all or any of the functions of the Secretary of State under the Air-Raid Precautions Act, 1937 (1 & 2 Geo. 6. c. 6), to such other Minister of the Crown as may be specified in the Order, and that, as respects any period during which the Order is in force, references in the Air-Raid Precautions Act, 1937 (1 & 2 Geo. 6. c. 6), to the Secretary of State shall, except as otherwise expressly provided in the Order, be construed as references to the Minister so specified:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. All the functions of the Secretary of State under the Air-Raid Precautions Act, 1937 (1 & 2 Geo. 6. c. 6), shall be transferred to the Lord Privy Seal.

2.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Civil Defence (Transfer of Functions) Order, 1939.

(2) This Order shall come into force forthwith.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the Air Navigation Act, 1920, His Majesty in Council was pleased to make the Air Navigation (Consolidation) Order, 1923 (S.R. & O. 1923 (No. 1508) p. 13) (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order"):

And whereas the Air Navigation Act, 1920, has been amended by the Air Navigation Act, 1936:

And whereas the principal Order has from time to time been amended by subsequent Orders (See S.R. & O. 1925 (No. 1260) p. 4; 1927 (No. 263) p. 4; 1928 (Nos. 36, 588, 591 and 900) pp. 20-32; 1929 (Nos. 984 and 1001) pp. 59-60; 1930 (No. 334) p. 31; 1931 (Nos. 84, 85 and 419) pp. 19-33; 1932 (Nos. 585 and 851) pp. 67-77; 1933 (No. 743) p. 346; 1934 (Nos. 712, 905 and 1102) I, pp. 123-30; 1935 (No. 513) p. 100;

1936 (No. 571) I, p. 61; 1937 (Nos. 96, 639, 700 and 951) pp. 72-100; 1938 (Nos. 503 and 1458) and 1939 (No. 392)):

And whereas it is expedient that the principal Order should be further amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

And whereas the provisions of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Amendment of Article 9.

1. Article 9 of the principal Order shall be amended as follows, that is to say:—

(a) In sub-paragraph (c) of paragraph (2) after the word "property" there shall be inserted the words in brackets "(including animals)"; and

(b) The following proviso shall be inserted at the end of paragraph (6):—

"Provided that in no case shall an aircraft be so used or towed at night or during conditions of bad visibility except in so far as may be expressly authorised in those circumstances by special permission in writing of the Secretary of State."

Amendment of Schedule II.

2. In sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph 9 of Schedule II to the principal Order the following two sub-paragraphs shall be substituted for sub-paragraphs (a) and (b):—

"(a) the aircraft is equipped with the prescribed instruments and equipment and the aircraft and its instruments and equipment are fit in every way for the proposed flight;

(b) provision as may be necessary in the circumstances of the proposed flight has been made for any prescribed devices to be used and for any prescribed precautionary measures to be taken in the aircraft for the purpose of promoting the safety thereof."

Amendment of Schedule V.

3. The following amendments shall be made in Schedule V to the principal Order:—

(1) In paragraph 4 the existing paragraph shall be sub-paragraph (1) and be so numbered and the following sub-paragraph shall be inserted:—

"(2) As from such day as the Secretary of State may direct, upon an application being made for a pilot's licence to fly public transport or aerial work flying machines, such a licence shall be granted in respect of not more than one type of such flying machine, but any such licence may be extended to cover the flying of additional types in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 5A of this Schedule."

(2) The following paragraph shall be inserted after paragraph 5:—

"5A. Upon application being made for an extension of a pilot's licence to fly public transport or aerial work flying machines to cover the flying by the holder of such licence of a type of such flying machine additional to the type or types in respect of which the licence was granted

the licence may be so extended provided that the applicant shall undergo such technical examination and practical tests as the Secretary of State may require for the purpose of demonstrating his ability to fly the additional type of such flying machine to which the application relates. Any particular extension shall cover the flying of not more than one additional type and, if any single application is made for more than one extension, such application shall be deemed to be a separate application in respect of each additional type to which it relates."

(3) The paragraph numbered and lettered "5A" shall be numbered and lettered "5B".

Amendment of Schedule VI.

4. The following amendments shall be made in Schedule VI to the principal Order:—

(1) The following paragraph shall be inserted after paragraph 6c:—

"6d. In respect of every application for an extension of a pilot's licence to fly public transport or aerial work flying machines under paragraph 5A of Schedule V to this Order there shall be chargeable a fee of £2 2s. and every such application shall be accompanied by a remittance for the amount of the fee or, in the case of a single application for more than one extension, the fees chargeable."

(2) The paragraph numbered and lettered "6d" shall be numbered and lettered "6E".

Citation and commencement

5.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1939.

(2) The provisions of this Order other than the amendment lettered (b) in Article 1 and the provisions of Article 2 thereof shall come into operation forthwith, and the amendment lettered (b) in Article 1 and the provisions of Article 2 of this Order shall come into operation on the first day of September, 1939.

WHEREAS by Section 1 of the Forestry (Transfer of Woods) Act, 1923, it is enacted that His Majesty on the joint representation of the Forestry Commissioners and of the Commissioners of Woods may by Order in Council make provision for the transfer to and vesting in the Forestry Commissioners of any estate interest rights powers and liabilities of the Crown and of the Commissioners of Woods in or in connection with any woods and forests under the management or control of the Commissioners of Woods; and for any property transferred under the Act being held and dealt with by the Forestry Commissioners in like manner in all respects as property acquired by them under the Forestry Act, 1919; and for such consequential and supplemental matters as appear necessary for giving full effect to the Order:

And whereas in the said Act the expression "woods and forests" includes any land used or capable of being used for afforestation or for purposes in connection therewith:

And whereas by the Forestry (Title of Commissioners of Woods) Order, 1924, made under Section 4 of the said Forestry (Transfer of Woods) Act, 1923, the Commissioners of Woods were from and after the 31st day of December 1924 to be styled and known as the Commissioners of Crown Lands:

And whereas by Section 5 of the Crown Lands Act, 1936, it is enacted that subject to the provisions thereof His Majesty on the joint representation of the Commissioners of Crown Lands and the Forestry Commissioners may by Order in Council transfer to and vest in the Forestry Commissioners all the estate and interest of His Majesty in any land in Great Britain purchased by the Commissioners of Crown Lands within six months before the date of the Order; and that the provisions of the Section shall be in addition to and not in derogation of the hereinbefore recited provisions of Section 1 of the Forestry (Transfer of Woods) Act, 1923:

And whereas the land the subject of this Order more particularly described in the Schedule hereto and hereinafter referred to as the said land, being land used or capable of being used for afforestation or for purposes in connection therewith, was purchased by the Commissioners of Crown Lands on the twenty-second day of March, 1939, and a joint representation has been made to His Majesty by the Commissioners of Crown Lands and the Forestry Commissioners to order the transfer to and vesting in the Forestry Commissioners of the said land on the terms hereinafter appearing:

Now therefore His Majesty by and with the advice of His Privy Council is pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Forestry (Transfer of Lands from the Commissioners of Crown Lands) Order, No. 2 of 1939.

2. The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies for the purposes of the interpretation of this Order in like manner as it applies for the purpose of the interpretation of an Act of Parliament and as if this Order were an Act of Parliament.

3. As from the day of the date of this Order, and by virtue thereof, all the estate interest rights powers and liabilities of His Majesty and of the Commissioners of Crown Lands in or in connection with the said land is transferred to and vested in the Forestry Commissioners.

4. The sum of £2,775 (hereinafter referred to as the capital sum) being a sum equal to the price at which the said land was so purchased together with the expenses incurred by the Commissioners of Crown Lands in connection with the purchase, shall be paid out of the Forestry Fund to the Commissioners of Crown Lands at such time (not being later than the expiration of ninety-nine years from the date of the purchase of the said land) as the Forestry Commissioners think fit, and of which time the Forestry Commissioners shall give six months' previous notice in writing to the Commissioners of Crown Lands.

5. Until the capital sum is paid out of the said Fund there shall be paid annually by equal half-yearly instalments on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in each year

out of the said Fund to the Commissioners of Crown Lands the sum of £114 10s. (being the sum which the Commissioners of Crown Lands and the Forestry Commissioners have, with the approval of the Treasury, agreed to be equivalent to a reasonable rent for the said land), the first of such half-yearly instalments or a proportionate part thereof commencing from the date hereof to be made on such of the said half-yearly days for payment of the said sum of £114 10s. as shall happen next after the date hereof.

6. The capital sum when paid shall be carried to the account of the capital of the Land Revenues of the Crown and applied accordingly, and the said annual sums shall be treated as annual income of the Land Revenues of the Crown and applied accordingly.

7. The said land shall be held and dealt with by the Forestry Commissioners in like manner in all respects as property acquired by them under the Forestry Act, 1919.

8. Nothing in this Order shall have effect so as to transfer to the Forestry Commissioners any estate, interest, rights, powers or liabilities of the Crown or of the Commissioners of Crown Lands in or in connection with any foreshores, mines royal, or other prerogative rights of the Crown or arising otherwise than by reason of the purchase of the said land.

Edw. 7. c. 15; 22 & 23 Geo. 5. c. 39; 25 & 26 Geo. 5. c. 25), it was, amongst other things, enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas a Treaty was signed on the 31st day of March, 1873, between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and His late Majesty the King of Denmark for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals which treaty applies to Iceland:

And whereas the said Treaty was duly ratified (See S.R. & O. Revised 1904. V.):

And whereas a supplementary Convention was signed on the 25th day of October, 1938, between His Majesty and His Majesty the King of Iceland and Denmark, which Convention is in the terms following:—

His Majesty The King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India (hereinafter referred to as His Majesty The King and Emperor), and His Majesty The King of Iceland and Denmark.

Desiring to make further provision for the reciprocal extradition of fugitive criminals,

have resolved to conclude a Supplementary Convention to this end, and for this purpose have appointed as their plenipotentiaries:

His Majesty The King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India:

For Great Britain and Northern Ireland:

The Rt. Hon. the Viscount Halifax, K.G., G.C.S.I., G.C.I.E., T.D., His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs;

His Majesty The King of Iceland and Denmark:

For Iceland:

Count Eduard Reventlow, His Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary in London;

Who, having communicated to each other their full powers found in good and due form, have agreed as follows:—

ARTICLE 1.

From the date of the coming into force of the present Convention Article 1 of the Extradition Treaty signed at Copenhagen on the 31st March, 1873, shall be amended by the addition of the following clause:—

"Extradition may also be granted at the discretion of the High Contracting Party applied to in respect of any other crime or offence for which, according to the laws of both of the High Contracting Parties for the time being in force, the grant may be made."

ARTICLE 2.

The foregoing amendment shall apply to extradition proceedings between Iceland on the one hand, and, on the other hand, the following territories of His Majesty The King and Emperor, that is to say, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, Newfoundland, British Colonies, British Protectorates to which the Extradition Treaty of the 31st March, 1873, applies, and mandated territories to which the said Treaty has been or may be extended, and in respect of which the mandate is exercised by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

ARTICLE 3.

The High Contracting Parties agree that His Majesty The King and Emperor may accede to the present Convention in respect of any other Member of the British Commonwealth of Nations, whose Government may desire that such accession be effected, by a notice given to that effect by the appropriate diplomatic representative of His Majesty The King and Emperor at Copenhagen. From the date that such notice comes into force the amendment set forth in Article 1 shall apply to extradition proceedings between Iceland on the one hand, and, on the other, the territory of the Member of the Commonwealth concerned.

Any notice given under the first paragraph of this Article in respect of any Member of the British Commonwealth of Nations may include any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty The King and Emperor and is exercised by the Government of the Member concerned.

ARTICLE 4.

The present Convention shall be ratified. The ratifications shall be exchanged at London as soon as possible.

ARTICLE 5.

The present Convention shall enter into force three months after the exchange of ratifications, and shall have the same duration as the Extradition Treaty of the 31st March, 1873.

The Chapters Numbered 1 and 3 of the Statute sealed on July 28th, 1871, and mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereto shall be read and construed as if the words set forth in the second column were inserted in the stead of the words of the sections of those Chapters mentioned in the third column.

3. The Chapter Numbered 2 of the said Statute sealed on July 28th, 1871, shall be deleted.

4. The Regulations made and sealed the 4th day of August, 1874, by the Special Commissioners appointed for the purposes of the Public Schools Act, 1868, shall be repealed.

To prescribe a basic amount which may be divided among the shareholders of the Company out of the profits of the gas undertaking and to empower the Company in certain circumstances to apply the profits of the gas undertaking in the division among the shareholders of an amount in excess of the basic amount and in forming or increasing a reserve fund and for the benefit of all or some of the employees of the Company and to make provision for determining the amount of the said profits to be applied as aforesaid.

To empower the Company or the directors thereof to establish a Reserve Fund, a Special Purposes Fund and a Renewal Fund, to provide for the application of those funds respectively and to make provision with respect to the appropriation of the amounts standing to the credit of the existing general reserve account and the existing special plant renewals account of the Company.

To make provision as to the period in which gas supplied in the limits of supply shall be deemed to have been supplied by the Company in case meter indices are read on, before or after such date or dates as the intended Order may prescribe.

To make special provisions as to the supply of gas to premises abutting on streets forming the boundary of but outside the limits of supply and as to the breaking up of such streets for the purpose of affording such supply.

To make provisions with respect to the following matters:—the laying of pipes in private streets, the laying of pipes for ancillary purposes, the specification and regulation of the materials, size and position and the laying of pipes, fittings and appliances on the premises of consumers, the position of meters, the relief of the Company from obligation to supply gas in certain circumstances, the prevention of the improper use of gas, the notice to be given by consumers before discontinuing a supply, the inspection and testing of meters and the charges to be made for special readings of meters.

To authorise the Company for the purposes of the gas undertaking to supply gas fittings etc., and to provide that fittings etc. let for hire shall not be subject to distress or execution or proceedings in bankruptcy and though fixed or fastened to the premises or to the soil thereunder shall remain the property of and removable by the Company.

To provide for the setting up of schemes for enabling employees of the Company to participate in the profits of the gas undertaking; for

the issue to the trustees under any such scheme and the employees of shares of the Company and for the payment out of the revenue of the gas undertaking of interest on sums deposited with the Company by employees.

To authorise the application of the revenue of the gas undertaking for making provision for gratuities, pensions and allowances to employees and dependants of deceased employees and for making subscriptions and donations to funds raised in cases of national emergency and to hospitals and other institutions and to the benevolent and sick funds of the employees of the Company.

To make provisions in respect of the authentication and service of notices by the Company, the recovery of sums due or payable to the Company in respect of the sale or hire of apparatus and fittings for or in connection with the consumption or use of gas or the provision of materials and work in connection therewith or the fixing, setting up, repairing, altering, maintaining or removal thereof, the recovery of demands and penalties and the inclusion of several sums in one summons.

The Order will vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would impede or interfere with its purposes and confer other rights and privileges.

To incorporate with the Order with or without modification or to amend in their application to the Company or render inapplicable all or some of the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts, the Gasworks Clauses Act, 1847, and the Gasworks Clauses Act, 1871.

Any local or other public authority, company or person desiring to bring before the Board of Trade any objection to the draft Order may do so by registered letter addressed to the Director of Gas Administration, Board of Trade, Great George Street, London, S.W.1, and despatched on or before the 28th day of September, 1939.

Any such objection shall state—

- (a) the specific grounds of objection; and
- (b) the omissions, additions or modifications asked for.

A copy of the objection must at the same time be forwarded to the Company or the undermentioned Parliamentary Agents.

A copy of the draft Special Order and an Ordnance Map showing the proposed area of supply and the situation of the existing works and an Ordnance Map showing the lands to be used by the Company for the construction of works have been deposited for public inspection at the offices of the Company at 17, Newgate Street, Morpeth, and with the Clerk of the County Council of the administrative County of Northumberland at his office at the County Hall, Newcastle-upon-Tyne.
