THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS ACT, 1868.

THE GOVERNING BODY OF ST. PETER'S COLLEGE, WESTMINSTER, commonly called WESTMINSTER SCHOOL having, on the 18th day of July, 1939, in virtue of the powers conferred upon them by the above-named Act, made a Statute in the terms appended hereto amending the existing Statutes of the School, the said Statute is hereby published in the London Gazette in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Act.

And Notice is hereby given, that any person, body of persons, or body corporate, authorized in that behalf by the said Act, may, within two months after the publication of this notification, petition His Majesty in Council to withhold His approval from the whole or any part of the said Statute.

STATUTE made by the Governing Body of St. Peter's College, Westminster, commonly called Westminster School on the eighteenth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine.

We, the Governing Body of St. Peter's College, Westminster, commonly called Westminster School, in virtue of the powers vested in us by the Public Schools Act, 1868, and of all other powers enabling us in that behalf, do hereby make the following Statute, amending the Statute sealed with our Corporate Seal July 28th, 1871, Approved by the Queen in Council November 6th, 1871, and amended March 26th, 1878, and February 26th, 1880, and repealing the Regulations relating to Westminster School made by the Special Commissioners under the provisions of the Public Schools Act, 1868, Section 19, on August 4th, 1874, the said Regulations having become obsolete or incapable of observance.

STATUTE.

- 1. This Statute shall take effect from and after the approval thereof by His Majesty in Council.
- 2. The Chapters Numbered I and 3 of the Statute sealed on July 28th, 187I, and mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereto shall be read and construed as if the words set forth in the second column were inserted in the stead of the words of the sections of those Chapters mentioned in the third column.
- 3. The Chapter Numbered 2 of the said Statute sealed on July 28th, 1871, shall be deleted.
- 4. The Regulations made and sealed the 4th day of August, 1874, by the Special Commissioners appointed for the purposes of the Public Schools Act, 1868, shall be repealed.
