“ Whereas under the Cathedral Measures, 1931 and 1934, and by virtue of an Order of Your Majesty in Council made under the provisions of the said Measures, bearing date the 21st day of December, 1937, whereof notice was

duly published in the London Gazette of the 31st day of the same month, and confirming a Scheme prepared by the Cathedral Commissioners for England for the said Cathedral Church of Hereford a copy whereof is annexed to the said Order in Council, certain lands manors corn payments miscellaneous payments and other hereditaments which then belonged to the said Dean and Chapter of Hereford and which are more particularly described in the Schedule hereunto annexed were transferred to and became absolutely vested in us to be held by us in the same manner and for the same purposes as the property of which the rents and profits are to be carried over to our Common Fund:

“ And whereas the properties aforesaid are not subject to any outstanding beneficial lease or grant but are in possession and we are desirous of selling the same or some portion thereof for the improvement of our Common Fund:

“ Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty that we may be authorised and empowered to sell or dispose of and duly to transfer or convey from time to time all or part of the said properties transferred to and vested in us as aforesaid for such consideration as shall appear to us to be just and reasonable.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 20th day of July 1939, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the Parish of Cole Orton and of the New Parish of Saint George, Whitwick, both in the County of Leicester and in the Diocese of Leicester:

"Whereas it has been represented to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and it appears to us to be desirable that the boundaries of the said Parish and New Parish should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Benefices of Cole Orton and Saint George, Whitwick, are now full, the Reverend Herbert Edward Stevens being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Cole Orton, and the Reverend Laurence Willy Wray being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint George, Whitwick, and the said Herbert Edward Stevens and Laurence Willy Wray have signified their consent to the proposals hereinafter mentioned by signing this Scheme:

"And whereas the Diocesan Committee of the Diocese of Leicester appointed pursuant to the first section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have by a Resolution passed at a meeting of the said Diocesan Committee held on the 28th day of November, 1938, signified their consent to the alteration of boundaries herein proposed:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Cyril Charles Bowman, Bishop of Leicester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said Parish of Cole Orton and of the said New Parish of Saint George, Whitwick, shall be altered so that all those portions of the said New Parish of Saint George, Whitwick, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured pink shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said Parish of Cole Orton.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure

of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The territory to be annexed to the Parish of Cole Orton, in the County of Leicester and in the Diocese of Leicester, comprising:—

"I. All that detached portion of the New Parish of Saint George, Whitwick, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon the west, upon the south, upon the south east and upon the east by the said Parish of Cole Orton and upon the north by the Parish of Worthington, in the said County and Diocese.

II. And also all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint George, Whitwick, which is bounded upon the west by the said Parish of Cole Orton, upon the south by the Parish of Ravenstone, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point in the middle of the road leading past the southern side of Swannington Colliery where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Ravenstone from the said New Parish of Saint George, Whitwick, meets the boundary which divides the Civil Parish of Swannington from the Civil Parish of Cole Orton, and extending thence first northward, then eastward and then again northward along such Civil Parish boundary for a distance of 55 chains to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint George, Whitwick, from the said Parish of Cole Orton."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Leicester has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Leicester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme, bearing date the 20th day of July, 1939, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the Parish of Tottenham and partly out of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint Aldhelm, Edmonton, both in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Tottenham and the said New Parish of Saint Aldhelm, Edmonton, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it appears to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said Parish of Tottenham and of the said New Parish of Saint Aldhelm, Edmonton, which are mentioned and described in the Schedule to this Scheme and are delineated on the map or plan annexed to this Scheme should be constituted a separate District for ecclesiastical purposes in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

"And whereas by an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 8th day of June, 1937, and published in the London Gazette on the 11th day of the same month, the Benefice of Saint John the Baptist, Great Marlborough Street, and the Benefice of Saint Thomas, Regent Street, both in the said County and Diocese, were united into one Benefice; And it was by the same Order provided (*inter alia*) (1) that out of the proceeds of the sale or sales of the site and materials of the Church of Saint John the Baptist, Great Marlborough Street, a Church or Churches shall be built for an ecclesiastical district or ecclesiastical districts to be constituted within the Diocese of London, (2) that one of such Churches shall be dedicated to Saint John the Baptist, and that the Patronage thereof shall be vested in the Patron of the said Benefice of Saint John the Baptist, Great Marlborough Street (that is to say, the Rector or Incumbent for the time being of the Rectory of the Parish of Saint James, Piccadilly, in the said County and Diocese)

and (3) that an annual payment of £300 formerly made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint John the Baptist, Great Marlborough Street, shall be appropriated by us towards the endowment of the said proposed new ecclesiastical district of which the Church is to be dedicated to Saint John the Baptist as from the date upon which it ceases to be made by us to the Reverend Thomas Henry Passmore the former Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint John the Baptist, Great Marlborough Street, under Clause 3 of the said Order:

"And whereas the District hereinafter proposed to be constituted has been selected as the District for which a Church shall be built and endowed as provided by the above mentioned Order in Council:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a temporary grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors, such temporary grant to continue payable until the date upon which the above-mentioned sum of £300 per annum becomes available towards the endowment of the said proposed separate District:

"And whereas the said temporary grant of £200 per annum will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of Tottenham and of the said New Parish of Saint Aldhelm, Edmonton, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day upon which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes by the name of 'The District of Saint John the Baptist, Tottenham.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of such New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall, as provided by the said Order in Council bearing date the 8th day of June, 1937, be vested in and exercised by the Rector or Incumbent for the time being of the Rectory of the said Parish of Saint James, Piccadilly, and his successors in the same Rectory for ever.

"And we further recommend that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending or proposing any other measures relat-

ing to the matters aforesaid or to any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint John the Baptist, Tottenham, comprising:—

"I. or thereabouts to the point where it meets the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of Harehills Cemetery, and extending thence first south-eastward and thence south-westward along the walls or fences forming the eastern and southern boundaries of Harehills Cemetery for a distance of 24 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the northern end of the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the houses and premises situate on the western side of Brander Drive, and extending thence southward to and along the last mentioned wall or fence and generally southward along the walls or fences forming the northern and western boundaries of the houses and premises situate on the northern side of Brander Drive and on the western side of Brander Approach for a distance in all of 21 chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned wall or fence reaches the northern side of Gipton Approach, and extending thence first south-eastward to and thence south-westward along the middle of Gipton Approach for a distance of $3\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with York Road upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Agnes, Burmantofts, from the said New Parish of Saint Philip, Osmondthorpe."

That, subject to the provisions of Clause 6 of this Scheme, upon the said unions taking effect (a) there shall be annexed or appropriated to the said United Benefice of Sandhutton with Gate and Upper Helmsley a part of the endowments now belonging to the said United Benefice of Gate and Upper Helmsley with Holtby and Warthill, that is to say, (i) all the glebe lands now belonging to the said United Benefice and situate in the Parishes of Haxby and Gate Helmsley, at East Cottingwith in the Parish of Cottingwith and at High Dunsforth in the Parish of Dunsforth, all in the County of York and (ii) a part, that is to say, a sum of £4,744 8s. 11d. part of the sum of money appropriated or to be appropriated by the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty to the said United Benefice pursuant to the provisions of Part II paragraph 2 of the Third Schedule to the Tithe Act, 1936, and paragraph 1 of the Eighth Schedule to the same Act and (iii) the following several sums of stock now held by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners on behalf of the said United Benefice, that is to say, the sums of £2,000 Local Loans £3 per cent. Stock, £592 18s. 3d. £3½ per cent. Conversion Stock, £674 5s. 6d. £3 per cent. Redemption Stock (1986-96), £690 4s. 7d. £3 per cent. Redemption Stock (1986-96), £612 5s. 7d. £3½ per cent. Conversion Stock, £1,015 4s. 6d. India £3 per cent. Stock and £2,000 Local Loans £3 per cent. Stock, and the three sums of Stock firstly hereinbefore referred to shall be held discharged from any of the trusts imposed by an Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council dated the 27th day of February, 1930, and published in the London Gazette on the 4th day of March in the same year for constituting certain Stock (new represented by the three

Upper Helmsley, a sum of £2,500 £3 per cent. "And whereas the said United Benefice of Welsh Newton with Llanrothal and the Benefice of Dixton Newton are both now full, the Reverend James Douglas Smith being the present Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Welsh Newton with Llanrothal and the Reverend Thomas William Henry Chisholm being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Dixton Newton:

"And whereas the patronage of the said Benefice of Dixton Newton is vested in the Bishop of Hereford and his successors in the See:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Lisle, Bishop of Hereford, and with the consents also of the said James Douglas Smith and of the said Thomas William Henry Chisholm (testified by their signing this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"3. That there shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the said United Parish all that detached part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Dixton Newton which lies within the boundaries of the Civil Parish of Llanrothal:

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the

matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Hereford has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Hereford.

effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Bath and Wells signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices are now full, the Reverend Ernest George Haskins being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Haselbury Plucknett and the Reverend Philip Audley Brown being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of North Perrott:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Francis, Bishop of Bath and Wells (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Haselbury Plucknett and the said Benefice of North Perrott shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Haselbury Plucknett with North Perrott,' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of North Perrott only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Haselbury Plucknett and the then Incumbent of North Perrott shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and if the said Benefice of Haselbury Plucknett only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of North Perrott and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of North Perrott if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Haselbury Plucknett shall have been instituted to Haselbury Plucknett subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall have been instituted to the said Benefice of Haselbury Plucknett before that date and shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the said Benefice of Haselbury Plucknett following such avoidance of the said Benefice of North Perrott and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of North Perrott shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Haselbury Plucknett shall become and be the house of residence for the

Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of North Perrott and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient for the benefit of the United Benefice.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bath and Wells.
