FACTORIES ACT, 1937—SECTION 71.

HOURS OF YOUNG PERSONS UNDER 16.

Among the industries for which the Secretary of State for the Home Department directed Public Inquiries to be held under Section 71 (2) of the Factories Act, 1937, in relation to the question of allowing the working hours of young persons to exceed 44 a week, are the flax textile industry, the rope twine and net industry, and the electrical cable making industry.

The Secretary of State has received the reports on the Public Inquiries in the case of the first two industries mentioned above; in the case of the electrical cable making industry the Cablemakers' Association subsequently intimated that they desired that their application for regulations under the section should be taken as withdrawn, and the Secretary of State has directed that the Inquiry in relation to that industry should not be proceeded with.

The Secretary of State, not being satisfied that the conditions mentioned in Section 71 (2) of the Act are fulfilled in the case of the three industries mentioned, has made Orders appointing the 3rd September, 1939 as the date on which the section is to have effect (i.e. as the date on which the maximum of 44 hours for young persons under 16 will become operative) as respects the industries in question.
