His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to Bernard Fisher, in recognition of his gallantry in the following circumstances:—

In the early morning of April 26th, 1939, a fire occurred in the cabin of an electrically driven gantry crane running at a height of about 55 feet above the ground level in the Templeborough Steel Melting Shop of Messrs. Steel, Peech & Tozer Ltd., Sheffield. The driver—William Hird—shouted and then lost consciousness. Fisher, who was the driver of a travelling jib crane in the same department, heard the shout and saw the fire. He promptly climbed from his own box and ascended the ladder to the crane track. He crossed the 80 feet span of the gantry and descended the vertical ladder into the cabin, which by that time was blazing. He carried Hird through a trap door and up a vertical ladder for a distance of approximately 12 feet. Fisher's action, which was carried out at great risk to himself and showed intelligence and initiative, almost certainly saved Hird's life.
