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**TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.**

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 25th August, 1939, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914 to 1919, to the amount of £30,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 28th August, 1939, to Saturday, the 2nd September, 1939, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

**DANGEROUS DRUGS ACTS, 1920 TO 1932.****WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORITIES.**

(ALFRED JOHN BECKETT.)

Whereas Alfred John Beckett, M.B., B.Ch., 1923, U.Dubl., whose registered address is Brynhyfyd, Kidwelly, Carmarthen, has been convicted of an offence against the Dangerous Drugs Acts, 1920 to 1932:

And whereas the said Alfred John Beckett cannot, in my opinion, properly be allowed to be in possession of or to supply any drug or preparation to which the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937, or any drug to which the Raw Opium, etc. Regulations, 1937, apply:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Regulation 7 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937, and by Regulation 5 of the Raw Opium, etc. Regulations, 1937, I hereby withdraw from the said Alfred John Beckett the authorities conferred by the said Regulations upon him to be in possession of and to supply the drugs or preparations to which the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937, and the drugs to which the Raw Opium, etc. Regulations, 1937, apply:

And I hereby direct that it shall not be lawful for the said Alfred John Beckett to give prescriptions for the purposes of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937.

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE APPOINTMENT BY COMPETITIVE SELECTION OF WOMEN TRANSLATORS IN THE WAR OFFICE AND THE AIR MINISTRY (ESTABLISHED AND NON-ESTABLISHED).

N.B.—*These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.*

1. Application for appointment shall be made in the first instance at such time and in such manner as may be fixed by either the War Office or the Air Ministry. When a vacancy occurs in either Department, the Department concerned will cause notice to be given by advertisement in the Press, which will include a statement of the last day fixed for the receipt of applications.

2. A candidate must have attained the age of 21 on the last day for the receipt of applications, and must be unmarried or a widow.

3. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject.

Provided that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied, in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

The consent of the authorities of the War Office or of the Air Ministry is required before a candidate either of whose parents was of other than British nationality at birth can be appointed to those Departments respectively.

4. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for appointment.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent

cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

5. The candidates should have such a knowledge of at least two modern foreign languages as will enable them to translate with facility and accuracy both from the foreign languages into English and conversely.

6. The completed application forms will be scrutinized by the Department advertising the vacancy, and such candidates as appear to be best qualified will be invited to attend before a Board consisting of representatives of the War Office or the Air Ministry, and of the Civil Service Commissioners. The Board will select for appointment to the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications provided they find so many suitable; and the decision of the Board will be final. The Board may require all or any of the candidates to undergo such practical tests of translation in languages as they may think fit.

Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's previous work.

7. While temporary additions to the permanent complements are employed, the necessary number of candidates will be appointed on a non-established and temporary basis.

8. Candidates appointed on a temporary basis will be eligible to be considered for appointment in an established capacity, as vacancies arise, provided they are then under 50 years of age and are unmarried or widows. Appointment to the established staff is conditional on candidates satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners that they are eligible for appointment in respect of age, nationality, health and character, and is conditional on the issue by the Commissioners of a certificate of qualification. A fee of £1 5s. is payable before the certificate of qualification can be issued.

9. In the event of vacancies occurring in the permanent complements for which no candidate appointed under Clause 7 of these Regulations is available, selected candidates may be appointed in an established capacity from the outset subject to the conditions prescribed in Clause 8.
