PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it is expedient that the exportation of certain goods should be prohibited:—

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in Him by section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879 (42 and 43 Vict. c. 21), as amended by section 17 of the Finance Act, 1921 (11 and 12 Geo. 5 c. 32), and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. Subject as hereinafter provided, the exportation from the United Kingdom of the goods described in the Schedule hereto is prohibited:

Provided that the said prohibition shall not apply to any exportation of any such goods which shall be expressly permitted by a licence given by the Board of Trade and in accordance with the conditions (if any) of such licence.

2. This Order may be cited as the Export of Goods (Prohibition) Order, 1939.

OPEN GENERAL EXPORT LICENCE.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Export of Goods (Prohibition) Order, 1939, the Board of Trade do hereby authorise and permit the exportation from any port in Great Britain or Northern Ireland of any of the goods specified in the aforementioned Order to the destinations set out in the Schedule hereto upon the following conditions—

(1) That the owner or shipper of the said goods, if so required by the Commissioners of H.M. Customs and Excise, shall produce to them, within such time as they may allow, proof to their satisfaction that the said goods were duly delivered at a destination to which this licence applies.

(2) That this licence shall be deemed void and of no effect in the event of non-compliance with condition (1) as set out above.

(3) That this licence may be modified or revoked at any time by the Board of Trade without reason given.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. FACTORIES ACT, 1937.

In pursuance of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Home Department proposes, at the expiration of forty days from the publication of this notice, to make Regulations under Section 71 (2) of the Factories Act, 1937, for factories in which the sole or principal industry carried on is one or a combination of the following, namely:—

The spinning of cotton, woollen or worsted yarn;

The spinning or throwing of silk or rayon yarn;

The weaving of cotton or woollen or worsted cloth;

The weaving of carpets;

The weaving or printing of silk or rayon fabrics (not including smallwares, ribbons, labels, badges or similar goods);

The bleaching or dyeing of cotton, rayon or woollen yarn;

The bleaching, dyeing, printing or finishing of cotton, rayon or woollen piece goods (except hosiery).

The Regulations will also apply to the operations known as legging and stripping in the finishing of hosiery.

The proposed Regulations, which are entitled the Weekly Hours of Young Persons under Sixteen in Factories (Various Textile and Allied Industries) Regulations would provide for a 48 hour working week for young persons over 15, as recommended by the Commissioners who held public Inquiries under the Section in relation to these industries.

These draft Regulations are in substitution for the draft Factories Act (Weekly Hours of Young Persons under Sixteen) (No. 1) Regulations, which were gazetted on the 30th June and which applied only to the cotton, woollen and carpet industries.

BOARD OF TRADE ANNOUNCEMENT.

WAR RISKS INSURANCE ACT, 1939. (PART II.)

Insurance of Goods in the United Kingdom.

The Board of Trade have, pursuant to section 8 of the War Risks Insurance Act, 1939, designated the undermentioned corporations as the persons who are authorised to receive, on behalf of the Board, applications from persons carrying on business in the United Kingdom as sellers of goods to be registered as desiring to be insured under the commodity insurance scheme in the event of its being put into operation. These corporations will act as the agents of the Board for the purposes of Part II of the Act.

Producers and traders in the United Kingdom who desire to avail themselves of the registration facilities provided in the Act may, on and after 28th August, obtain from any of the corporations named a copy of the form of application for registration, together with the instructions to applicants for registration. An application for registration should normally be made to the corporation (if an agent of the Board of Trade for the present purpose) with whom the applicant has principally insured his goods against fire risks (or, in the case of ships under construction, against construction risks).

SUSPENSION OF OUTSTANDING EXPORT LICENCES FOR WAR MATERIAL FOR FOREIGN COUNTRIES.

Whereas by the Arms Export Prohibition Order, 1931, the export of certain goods is prohibited except under a licence of the Board of Trade;

And whereas it is desirable in the interests of Imperial security that all licences (with certain exceptions) hitherto granted by the Board of Trade for the export of goods should be reviewed and for that purpose their validity forthwith suspended;

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade in the exercise of all powers enabling them in that behalf do hereby direct and declare as follows:—

1. Subject to the exceptions enumerated in the next following paragraph hereof all licences granted by the Board in connection with the said Order before the date hereof for the export of any goods shall be suspended and of no effect during the period commencing on the date hereof and ending on the 1st October, 1939.

2. Nothing in the preceding paragraph hereof shall be taken as suspending or affecting the operation of any of the following licences, that is to say:

(i) any licence authorising the export of any goods to any destination in any part of His Majesty's dominions, in any British protectorate or British protected state, or in any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty and is being exercised by the Government of any part of His Majesty's dominions;

(ii) the open General Export Licences Nos. G.L. 168 (dated 14th July, 1937), G.L. 169 (dated 8th June, 1937) and G.L. 170 (dated 8th June, 1937);

(iii) any other licence if and in so far as it authorises only the export of aircraft (not being aircraft included in the Air Ministry list of military types);

(iv) any other licence if and in so far as it authorises only the export of (a) shotguns or components of shotguns, (b) shot cartridges, or (c) smokeless gunpowder or explosives of any of the descriptions enumerated in the aforesaid Open General Export Licence No. G.L. 169; or

(v) any other licence if and in so far as it authorises only the export of (a) not more than 25 rifles, revolvers or pistols and/or

(b) not more than 500 rounds of rifle, revolver or pistol ammunition and/or (c) component parts of rifles, revolvers or pistols.
