CURRENCY RESTRICTIONS EXEMPTION ORDER, 1939.

The Treasury, in pursuance of their power under Regulation 3 of the Defence (Finance) Regulations, 1939 (which imposes restrictions, inter alia, on the export of foreign currency), by order to make exemptions from that Regulation, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby make the following Order:—

I. There are hereby exempted from the said Regulation all transactions which would be excluded from the operation thereof if the last two references in sub-paragraph (b) of paragraph (I) of that Regulation to the United Kingdom and the Isle of Man included references to every part of His Majesty's dominions, except Canada, Newfoundland and Hong

Kong, to every territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty, and is being exercised by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom or in any Dominion, and every British Protectorate or protected state.

- 2. The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 3. This Order may be cited as the Currency Restrictions Exemption Order, 1939.
