HE Medway, Captain Baker Commander, is come in here from Tangier; and has brought with him two Moorish Officers as Hostages for Captain Delavall and Carain Watkins, who are appointed to Treat with that Go rement for the Redemption of the English Captives at Sallée.

Warfam, Jan. 21. An Express arrived here this day from the Congress at Carlowitz in Hungary, with the welcome News, that the Treaty for a Truce of 25 Years between this Crown and the Port was figned on the 15th Instant, and the King has ordered, that the Ratifications of the same be forthwith dispatched. This Treaty is very advantageous to Poland, being by it restor'd to the Possession of Caminies in the Condition 'twas when the Turks took it, and of all Podolia; which will secure our Frontiers against the Excursions of the Tartars. The Negociations for adjusting the Differences between the Cardinal Primate and the Bishop of Cujavia are continued, wherein a good Progress is already made; but the Meeting of the General Diet is put off till the Month of May. The Baron of Welling arrived here on the 19th Instant with the Character of Envey from Sueden, and has had Audience of the King of Poland, to whom he offered the King his Master's Mediation for accommodating the Affair of Elbing; and we expect, that the King of Poland will shortly appoint his Ministers to treat with those of the Elector of Brandenbourgh for an amicable Composure of this Affair.

Vienna, Jan. 28. Our Letters from Carlowitz of the 20th Instant give an Account, that the principal Points in Dispute between the Venetians and the Turks, concerning the demolishing of Le-panto and Castel-Novo, were in a manner adjusted, and that rhe Mediators and the Imperial Ambassadors continued to employ their Offices for adjusting the remaining Difficulties between them, which relating only to the regulating of the Fron-tiers of Dalmatia, and the Morea, 'tis probable they will not by either fide be thought of Consequence enough to hinder their figning their Treaty at the same time the Ambassadors from the Emperor and the Czar of Muscovy sign theirs, which was agreed to be on the 26th In-stant. The Count of Windifgratz, who was sent some days ago to Modena, with a Procuration for that Duke to marry the Princess of Hanous as Proxy from the King of the Romans, is returned hither, and has brought Advice, that that Ceremony was performed on the 15th Instant; and on the 17th, the Queen begun her Jour-ney hither, being accompanied by the Duke of Modena, who intends to conduct her as far as Roveredo, on the Borders of the Emperor's Territories, where she is to be received by the Prince of Lobkowicz her High-Steward, and the Count de Paar her Master of the Horse, who are gone this ther with a very great Retinue to wait for her arrival. The Czar was gone to Norowitz, a Place where his Ships are building, distant about 100 Leagues from Moscow, and was expected back in 10 or 12 days.
