Cadiz, Jan. 19. N. S.

THE *Medway*, Captain *Baker* Commander, is come in here from *Tangier*; and has brought with him two Moorish Officers as Hostages for Captain *Delavall* and Captain *Watkins*, who are appointed to Treat with that Government for the Redemption of the English Captives at *Sallee*.

Warsaw, Jan. 21. An Express arrived here this day from the Congress at *Carlowitz* in Hungary, with the welcome News, that the Treaty for a Truce of 25 Years between this Crown and the Port was signed on the 15th Instant, and the King has ordered, that the Ratifications of the same be forthwith dispatched. This Treaty is very advantageous to *Poland*, being by it restor'd to the Possession of *Caminiec* in the Condition 'twas when the *Turks* took it, and of all *Podolia*; which will secure our Frontiers against the Excursions of the *Tartars*. The Negotiations for adjusting the Differences between the Cardinal Primate and the Bishop of *Cujavia* are continued, wherein a good Progress is already made; but the Meeting of the General Diet is put off till the Month of *May*. The Baron of *Walling* arrived here on the 19th Instant with the Character of Envoy from *Sueden*, and has had Audience of the King of *Poland*, to whom he offered the King his Master's Mediation for accommodating the Affair of *Elbing*; and we expect, that the King of *Poland* will shortly appoint his Ministers to treat with those of the Elector of *Brandenbourg* for an amicable Compofure of this Affair.

Vienna, Jan. 28. Our Letters from *Carlowitz* of the 20th Instant give an Account, that the principal Points in Dispute between the *Venetians* and the *Turks*, concerning the demolishing of *Leopanto* and *Cassel-Novo*, were in a manner adjusted, and that the Mediators and the Imperial Ambassadors continued to employ their Offices for adjusting the remaining Difficulties between them, which relating only to the regulating of the Frontiers of *Dalmatia*, and the *Morea*, 'tis probable they will not by either side be thought of Consequence enough to hinder their signing their Treaty at the same time the Ambassadors from the Emperor and the Czar of *Muscovy* sign theirs, which was agreed to be on the 26th Instant. The Count of *Windisgratz*, who was sent some days ago to *Modena*, with a Procuracy for that Duke to marry the Princess of *Hanover* as Proxy from the King of the *Romans*, is returned hither, and has brought Advice, that that Ceremony was performed on the 15th Instant; and on the 17th, the Queen began her Journey hither, being accompanied by the Duke of *Modena*, who intends to conduct her as far as *Roveredo*, on the Borders of the Emperor's Territories, where she is to be received by the Prince of *Lobkowitz* her High-Steward, and the Count de *Paur* her Master of the Horse, who are gone thither with a very great Retinue to wait for her arrival. The King of the *Romans* designs to go himself to meet her about a day's Journey, and her Entry into this City is to be on the 24th of the next Month, for which very splendid Prepa-

rations are making. Our Letters from *Croatia* say, that they had received Advice that the *Turks* of *Bosnia* were assembling in order to make an Incursion into the *German* Territories, upon which the Forces quartered in those Parts, and the Militia of that Province, were in motion to oppose them, but that great Rains were fallen, which very much swelling the Rivers, and spoiling the Passages, had prevented the Enemies Design.

Berlin, Febr. 3. The Elector of *Brandenbourg* returned to this Place on the 31st of the last Month; and the same day the Sieur *Leyonstedt*, Envoy from *Sweden*, had an Audience of his Electoral Highness, in which he delivered a Letter from the King his Master, offering his Mediation for adjusting the Affair of *Elbing*, which 'tis believed his Electoral Highness will accept. The Emperor, the Crowns of *France* and *Denmark*, and the States-General of the United Provinces, will also take part in this Mediation; and *Brillaw* is agreed upon to be the Place of Treaty, whither the Emperor has declared he will send his Plenipotentiaries by the 15th of *March*, and desires that all the other Parties concerned will do the like. We have Letters from *Moscow* of the 31st of *December*, which give an Account, that above 200 Persons had been put to Death, being accused of a Conspiracy against the Czar of *Muscovy*, in which the Princess *Sophia*, his Sister, was suspected to be likewise concerned. The Czar was gone to *Norowitz*, a Place where his Ships are building, distant about 100 Leagues from *Moscow*, and was expected back in 10 or 12 days.

Frankfort, Febr. 4. Baron *Tettau* is appointed by the Landgrave of *Hesse-Cassel* to go with the Character of his Envoy Extraordinary to *Vienna*, to make his Compliments at that Court on the Marriage of the King or the *Romans*. They write from *Wirtzburg*, that great Interest is making there against the Election of a Bishop of that Diocess, which is appointed to be on the 9th Instant; The Elector of *Mentz*, and the Baron of *Greiffenklau* Dean of *Voices*.

Brussels, Febr. 8. The Electoral Prince of *Bavaria*, after a Sickness of 8 or 10 days of a violent Fever, died on *Friday* the 6th Instant, in the 7th Year of his Age. He was Son of the present Elector of *Bavaria*, and of the Arch-Duchess *Maria Antonia Jospha* his former Wife, who was Daughter of the present Emperor, and the Princess *Margareta Theresa*, first Wife to his Imperial Majesty, and Daughter to *Philip IV.* King of *Spain*. The Elector and this whole Court and Country are extremely afflicted at so great and unexpected a Loss, and his Electoral Highness is retired for some days to a Monastery at *Trevesure*. The Count de *Monasterol* is appointed by his Electoral Highness to notify the Prince's Death to the King of *Spain*; the Baron *Simoni* to the King of *England*, and Don *Andreas Benito* to the most Christian King; and they are accordingly preparing to depart from hence in a few days.

Hague, Febr. 10. Mr. *Hill*, His Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary to the Elector of *Bavaria*, arrived here last *Sunday* from *England*, and is gone for *Brussels*. An Express arrived here last *Saturday* from *Vienna* with Letters of the 30th past, giving an Account that the young Count de *Strassman* was come thither from the Congress at *Carlowitz*, to give the Emperor an Account, that the Truce of 25 Years with the *Turks* was actually signed on the 26th of the last Month by the Ambassadors from his Imperial Majesty, the King of *Poland*, and the Czar of *Muscovy*, and that the *Venetians*, who are comprised therein, had in a manner finished their Treaty, and would likewise sign in few days. The Deputies from the Colleges of the Admiralty of *Rotterdam*, *Amsterdam*, and *North-Holland*, continue assembled, but will separate in a day or two.

Dublin Jan. 26. This day the Lords Justices went with the usual Ceremony and Attendance from the Castle to the House of Lords, and gave the Royal Assent to
