SUBJECT.

I. Contracts the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area around Thorganby, Lincoln (Parts of Lindsey) as from the 16th September, 1939, so as to comprise only the area described in the Schedule.

II. Releases the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area around Thorganby, Lincoln (Parts of Lindsey) from restrictions, and revokes Order No. 5862, as from the 23rd September, 1939.
