I declare that owing to the state of Public Affairs and the demands upon Our Naval Forces for the protection of the Empire an occasion has arisen for ordering and directing as in the circumstances by Statute provided.

A PROCLAMATION

For calling out Officers of the Royal Naval Reserve.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS by the Regulations for the Royal Naval Reserve (Officers) made pursuant to the Naval Reserve (Officers) Acts, 1863 and 1926, it is provided that Officers of the Royal Naval Reserve shall be called out for actual service by Royal Proclamation, and that they shall be liable to serve during the continuance of any national emergency or until they are regularly discharged by the direction of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty:

And whereas a case of national emergency has arisen:

We do hereby order and direct that the said Officers of the Royal Naval Reserve be called out for actual service.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this twenty-first day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine, and in the Third year of Our Reign.

WHEREAS by the fourth section of the Royal Naval Reserve (Volunteer) Act, 1859, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for Us on such occasions as We shall deem fit (the occasion being first communicated to Parliament
