FURTHER REGULATIONS AS TO ADVANCES BY THE PUBLIC WORKS LOAN COMMISSIONERS.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893 (56 & 57 Vict. c. 66), that it is proposed by the Public Works Loan Commissioners with the approval of the Treasury, after the expiration of at least forty days from this date, to make further regulations under Section 41 of the Public Works Loans Act, 1875.

And notice is hereby further given that on account of urgency the Public Works Loan Commissioners with the approval of the Treasury have under section two of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, made the following Provisional Regulations, dated the twenty-second September, 1939, to continue in force until Regulations have been made in accordance with the provisions of section one of that Act.

PROVISIONAL RULES AND ORDERS.

Whereas by section forty-one of the Public Works Loans Act, 1875, the Public Works Loan Commissioners are empowered to make regulations for carrying into effect that Act, and in particular (amongst other things) with respect to loans under that Act, with respect to the forms to be used and with respect to the relations between the Public Works Loan Commissioners, the National Debt Commissioners and the Bank of England:

And whereas by the said section forty-one regulations made under that section may be from time to time rescinded, altered, and added to in like manner as the original regulations:

Now, therefore, the Public Works Loan Commissioners in pursuance of the said section forty-one hereby make the following Regulations and certify under section two of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that on account of urgency it is expedient that they should come into operation immediately as provisional rules:—

1. When the Public Works Loan Commissioners (hereinafter referred to as "the Loan Commissioners") have determined the amount of any loan to be under section nine of the Public Works Loans Act, 1875, to any person, the Secretary to the Loan Commissioners shall forthwith certify to the National Debt Commissioners the amount of the loan, and at the foot of the certificate shall state the name of the person by whom the certificate is to be presented to the National Debt Commissioners.

2. When the certificate has been lodged at the office of the National Debt Commissioners for such number of days as may from time to time be agreed upon between the National Debt Commissioners and the Secretary to the Loan Commissioners, the Comptroller-General or other proper officer of the National Debt Commissioners shall sign an order appended to the certificate and addressed to the cashiers of the Bank of England for the payment of the sum mentioned in the certificate to the person named at the foot thereof.

3. The regulations made on the first day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven under the Public Works Loans Act, 1875, are hereby rescinded.

And whereas it has seemed to Us desirable to make provision Ourselves for this Order.

We do by these Presents declare that the Rules and Regulations made in the past from time to time for the governance of the said Order shall be cancelled and We are pleased to make for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, the following Ordinances in substitution of the same:—

First. It is ordained that the Order shall be named "The Indian Order of Merit" and shall be divided into a Civil Division and a Military Division.

Secondly. It is ordained that the Civil Division of the Order shall consist of one Class and that appointment to it may be made only by Our Viceroy. Any of Our subjects of Indian origin or any subject of a Ruler of an Indian State may be appointed to the Order for any act of conspicuous personal bravery in aid of public authority or the safety of others.

Thirdly. It is ordained that the Insignia of the Civil Division of the Order shall be a Badge consisting of an eight pointed star 1 inch in diameter composed of rays, with in the centre a circular ground of dark blue enamel surrounded by a laurel wreath. On the enamel ground there shall be the Royal Cypher surmounted by a Crown encircled with the words "For Bravery." The Badge shall be of silver and the laurel wreath and the design in

the centre shall be of gold. The Badge shall be worn on the left breast pendant from a dark red Ribbon with blue edges.

Fourthly. It is ordained that the Military Division of the Order shall consist of two Classes and that appointments to it may be made only by Our Viceroy on the recommendation of the Commander-in-Chief of Our Forces in India. Viceroy's Commissioned Officers, Indian Warrant Officers and Indian other ranks in Our Armed Forces (including Frontier Corps and Military Police) or any members of Indian States' Forces may be appointed to the Second Class for any act of conspicuous gallantry performed in connection with their duties. Appointments to the First Class shall be made only from members of the Second Class for any similar act performed by them.

Fifthly. It is ordained that the Insignia of the Military Division of the Order shall be a Badge consisting of an eight pointed silver star $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch in diameter, with in the centre two crossed swords around which shall be inscribed the words "Reward of Gallantry," all on a circular ground of dark blue enamel and surrounded with a laurel wreath. In the Badge of the First Class the laurel wreath and the design in the centre shall be of gold. In the Badge of the Second Class the laurel wreath and the design in the centre shall be of silver. The Badge shall be worn on the left breast pendant from a dark blue Ribbon with red edges.

Sixthly. It is ordained that Our Viceroy may cancel and annul the appointment to the Order of any member and that thereupon the said member shall be required to surrender his Insignia, provided that Our Viceroy may subsequently abrogate any such cancellation and annulment.

Seventhly. It is ordained that the members of the Order may use the letters "I.O.M." after their names.
