BOROUGH OF BRIDLINGTON.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1932.

BRIDLINGTON CENTRAL AREA PLANNING
SCHEME.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the twelfth day of September, 1939, the Minister of Health notified his approval of a Resolution passed

by the Town Council of the Borough of Bridlington on the thirty-first day of May, 1939, deciding to prepare the above Planning Scheme with reference to areas situate in the Borough of Bridlington, which areas are those shown enclosed within the inner edge of black borders on the Map referred to in the said Resolution.

The Map defining the areas to which the Resolution applies has been deposited at the office of the Borough Engineer and Surveyor, Town Hall, Bridlington, and will be open for inspection by all persons interested without payment between the hours of 10 and 12 in the forenoon of any weekday and 2 and 4 in the afternoon of any weekday except Saturday.

Any person who is or claims to be an owner of any property in any of the areas to which the Resolution applies, and any association representing owners of property within the Borough and any local association representing business or industry, may by notice in writing, specifying in the case of an owner the property of which he claims to be the owner, require the Council to register without charge his or their name and address for the service of subsequent notices relating to the Scheme.

Under the Town and Country Planning (General Interim Development) Order, 1933,* the development of land in the areas to which the said Resolution applies during the preparation of the Scheme is permitted to the extent specified in the Order, and in addition, the Council are empowered to permit other development in such areas during this period with a view, in either case to protecting the development from risk of removal or alteration without compensation under the Scheme when approved and in operation. A print of the Order has been deposited together with the aforesaid Map.

Any suggestions as to the proposals to be included in the Draft Scheme should be sent in writing to the undersigned.
