WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 25th day of September, 1939 (N. 8692/39), in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council dated the 25th July, 1939, sanction was given for the payment of Marriage Allowance in respect of Seamen, Marines and Reservists of the age of 20 years and over:

“And whereas by Order in Council dated the 13th August, 1920, sanction was given to the continuance of Marriage Allowance, together with an amount equal to the appropriate qualifying allotment, for four weeks following the notification of the death of the man concerned:

“And whereas we are of opinion that during the period of present hostilities Marriage Allowance should be issuable whatever the age of the husband:

“And whereas we are further of opinion that during the period of hostilities Marriage Allowance, with the appropriate qualifying allotment, should be continuable for a longer period than four weeks after the death of the man:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction, with effect from the 7th September, 1939, the payment of Marriage Allowance in respect of Seamen, Marines and Reservists of any age, and the payment of Marriage Allowance, with a payment equal to the appropriate qualifying allotment, for thirteen weeks following the notification of the death of the man concerned, subject to any adjustments that may be necessary to avoid an overlap with pension should one be payable.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"And whereas by Orders in Council dated 3rd March, 1900 and 9th October, 1903, an allowance of 6d. a day for charge of medical stores is payable to Sick Berth Chief Petty Officers when acting as Wardmasters in Royal Naval Hospitals, Sick Quarters and Hospital Ships:

"And whereas we consider that this allowance should also be payable, with effect from 14th September, 1939, to Hospital Staff Sergeants at the Royal Marine Infirmaries:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction payment accordingly.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 20th day of July, 1939, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the substitution of the Church of Saint Saviour, Plymouth, for the Church of the Holy Trinity, Plymouth, as the Parish Church of the Parish of the United Benefice of Holy Trinity with Saint Saviour, Plymouth,

in the County of Devon and in the Diocese of Exeter, and for matters arising in connection therewith:

"Whereas by an Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council bearing date the 12th day of August, 1924, and published in the London Gazette on the same day provision was made for the union, under the style of the United Benefice of the Holy Trinity and Saint Saviour, Plymouth, of the Benefice and Parish of the Holy Trinity, Plymouth, and the Benefice and Parish of Saint Saviour, Plymouth, and it was also provided, *inter alia*, that the Church of the Parish of the Holy Trinity, Plymouth, should be the Parish Church of the United Parish:

"And whereas the said union has since taken effect:

"And whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Charles, Bishop of Exeter, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into all the facts and circumstances of the said United Benefice and Parish relevant to the question of substituting the said Church of Saint Saviour, Plymouth, for the said Church of the Holy Trinity, Plymouth, as the Parish Church of the United Parish duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Exeter and therein recommended the said substitution and the said Bishop of Exeter signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said substitution based upon the terms recommended in the said Report, but which, with the assent of the said Bishop of Exeter, embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas the said United Benefice is at present vacant:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Charles, Bishop of Exeter (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Church of Saint Saviour, Plymouth, shall be substituted for the said Church of the Holy Trinity, Plymouth, as the Parish Church of the Parish of the said United Benefice.

"2. That the register books of baptisms, marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the Church of the Holy Trinity, Plymouth, shall be transferred to the Parish Church of the United Parish but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of the Holy Trinity, Plymouth, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

"3.—(a) That so soon as conveniently may be the Church of the Holy Trinity, Plymouth, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Measures.

(b) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after payment of the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall be applied by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as follows, that is to say, firstly in payment of the compensation or compensations hereinafter mentioned or in repayment of any advance made for the purpose of such compensation or compensations, and any balance shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

(c) That the font, communion table, and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said Church of the Holy Trinity, Plymouth, shall not be sold but shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures and as the Bishop of the Diocese may direct be transferred to the Church of Saint Saviour, Plymouth, being the Parish Church of the United Benefice or to some other Church or Churches within the said Diocese of Exeter and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of the Holy Trinity, Plymouth, or such of them as the Bishop of Exeter shall select, shall be appropriated by the Bishop of Exeter for use in some other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of Exeter which the Bishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Church of the Holy Trinity, Plymouth, as aforesaid.

(d) That in the event of the services of any Church officers and servants of the said Church of the Holy Trinity, Plymouth, being dispensed with by reason of the union taking effect, such Church officers and servants shall out of any moneys to be received by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under the provisions of this clause receive such reasonable compensation as having regard to age, length of service, and other circumstances of the case shall seem to us and to the Bishop of Exeter equitable and proper. Provided always that it shall be lawful for us if we shall see fit so to do in all or any of these cases to advance the compensation money or any part thereof out of the said Expenses Fund.

"Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the sale and disposal of the Church of the Holy Trinity, Plymouth, shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Measures are made requisite to the sale under the powers conferred by those Measures of the site of any Church shall be obtained to the sale and disposal hereby proposed of the said Church of the Holy Trinity, Plymouth, and of the site thereof together with any ground annexed or belonging thereto.

"And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the

provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Exeter has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures:

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Exeter.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 20th day of July, 1939, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the unions of (1) the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Manningham, Saint Jude, with a part of the Benefice (being an United Benefice) of Bradford, Christ Church with Saint Thomas; (2) the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Bradford, Saint Michael and All Angels, with a further part of the said Benefice of Bradford, Christ Church with Saint Thomas; and (3) the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Bradford (Saint Peter) with the remaining part of the said Benefice of Bradford, Christ Church with Saint Thomas, all of which Benefices are situate in the City of Bradford in the County of York and in the Diocese of Bradford:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Alfred, Bishop of Bradford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures, to inquire into and report upon the unions (1) of the said Benefice of Manningham, Saint Jude, with a part of the said United Benefice of Bradford, Christ Church with Saint Thomas, (2) of the said Benefice of Bradford, Saint Michael and All Angels, with a further part of the said United Benefice of Bradford, Christ Church with Saint Thomas, and (3) of the said Benefice of Bradford (Saint Peter) with the remaining part of the said United Benefice of Bradford, Christ Church with Saint Thomas, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Bradford and therein recommended the said unions and the terms for effecting the same, and the said Bishop of Bradford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said unions which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefices are all now full the Reverend Edgar Osborne Williams being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Manningham, Saint Jude, the Reverend Arthur Page being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bradford, Saint Michael and All Angels, the Very Reverend Edward Worsfold Mowll being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bradford (Saint Peter) and the Reverend Reginald Guy Frushard Waddington being the present Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Bradford, Christ Church with Saint Thomas:

"And whereas the Parish of the said United Benefice of Bradford, Christ Church with Saint Thomas, is an United Parish whereof Christ Church is the Parish Church and wherein there is no other consecrated Church:

"And whereas the patronage of the said United Benefice of Bradford, Christ Church with Saint Thomas, now belongs to the Bishop of Bradford for the time being and the Vicar or Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Bradford (Saint Peter) jointly:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consents of the said Alfred, Bishop of Bradford, and of the said Edgar Osborne Williams, Arthur Page and Edward Worsfold Mowll (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Manningham, Saint Jude, and the part (containing the Parish Church) of the said United Benefice of Bradford, Christ Church with Saint Thomas, which lies to the north-east and north of a line following the middle of the road called Westgate, the middle of Godwin Street, the middle of Duke Street, the middle of the road called Cheapside and the middle of the road called Kirkgate shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls and one Parish for all ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The Benefice of Manningham, Saint Jude' (hereinafter referred to as the United Benefice of Manningham, Saint Jude).

"2. That the Church of the Parish of Manningham, Saint Jude, shall be the Parish

Church of the United Parish of Manningham, Saint Jude, and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Manningham, Saint Jude, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the same United Parish.

"3. That the said Benefice of Bradford, Saint Michael and All Angels, and the part (containing no consecrated Church) of the said United Benefice of Bradford, Christ Church with Saint Thomas, which lies to the south-west and west of a line following the middle of the said road called Westgate and the middle of Godwin Street shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls and one Parish for all ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The Benefice of Bradford, Saint Michael and All Angels' (hereinafter referred to as the United Benefice of Bradford, Saint Michael and All Angels).

"4. That the said Benefice of Bradford (Saint Peter) and the remaining part (containing no consecrated Church) of the said United Benefice of Bradford, Christ Church with Saint Thomas, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls and one Parish for all ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The Benefice of Bradford (Saint Peter)' (hereinafter referred to as the United Benefice of Bradford (Saint Peter)).

"5. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the said United Benefice of Bradford, Christ Church with Saint Thomas, shall be vacant, then the unions hereinbefore recommended and proposed shall forthwith take effect but if upon that day the said United Benefice of Bradford, Christ Church with Saint Thomas, shall be full, then the said unions shall take effect immediately upon the first vacation thereafter of the said United Benefice of Bradford, Christ Church with Saint Thomas, and in either event (a) the said Edgar Osborne Williams if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Manningham, Saint Jude, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Manningham, Saint Jude; (b) the said Arthur Page if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bradford, Saint Michael and All Angels, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Bradford, Saint Michael and All Angels; and (c) the said Edward Worsfold Mowll if he is the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bradford (Saint Peter) shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Bradford (Saint Peter).

"6. That upon the union referred to in Clause 1 of this Scheme taking effect the register books of baptisms, marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in Christ Church, Bradford, shall be transferred to the Parish Church of the United Benefice of Manningham, Saint Jude, but the marriage registers in duplicate current at Christ Church, Bradford, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

"7. That upon the said unions taking effect the Parsonage Houses at present belonging to the said Benefices of Manningham, Saint Jude, and Bradford (Saint Peter) respectively shall become and be the houses of residence for the Incumbents of the respective United Benefices

of Manningham, Saint Jude, and Bradford (Saint Peter) and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said United Benefice of Bradford, Christ Church with Saint Thomas, and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall constitute and form part of the aggregate fund hereinafter referred to.

" 8.—(a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect Christ Church, Bradford, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Measures.

(b) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after payment of the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall together with the net proceeds of the sale as aforesaid of the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said United Benefice of Bradford, Christ Church with Saint Thomas, form one aggregate fund and shall be applied by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as follows, that is to say, (1) for the payment of the compensation or compensations hereinafter mentioned or for the repayment of any advance made for the purpose of such compensation or compensations; (2) for and towards the cost of the provision of sites for and the erection of a Church and Parsonage House for a new District in the said Diocese of Bradford, to be selected by the Bishop of Bradford; and (3) any residue of such net proceeds shall be added to the Expenses Fund of the said Diocese of Bradford established pursuant to Section 32 of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923;

(c) That the font, communion table, and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in Christ Church, Bradford, shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures and as the Bishop of the Diocese may direct be transferred to the Church of Saint Jude, Manningham, being the Parish Church of the United Benefice of Manningham, Saint Jude, or to some other Church or Churches within the said Diocese of Bradford and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of Christ Church, Bradford, or such of them as the Bishop of Bradford shall select, shall be appropriated by the Bishop of Bradford for use in the proposed Church of the said District or be removed to any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of Bradford which the Bishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of Christ Church, Bradford, as aforesaid;

(d) That in the event of the services of any Church officers or servants of Christ Church,

Bradford, being dispensed with by reason of the unions taking effect such Church officers and servants shall out of the said aggregate fund receive such reasonable compensation as having regard to age, length of service, and other circumstances of the case shall seem to us and to the Bishop of Bradford equitable and proper. Provided always that it shall be lawful for us if we shall see fit so to do in all or any of these cases to advance the compensation money or any part of it out of the said Expenses Fund.

" 9. That with the consents of the said Alfred, Bishop of Bradford, and of the said Edward Worsfold Mowll, being the present Patrons of the said United Benefice of Bradford, Christ Church with Saint Thomas, (which consents are testified as aforesaid), upon the said unions taking effect (a) a part of the endowment and property of the said United Benefice of Bradford, Christ Church with Saint Thomas, namely a sum of £35 per annum being part of a larger annual stipend at present paid by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice of Bradford, Christ Church with Saint Thomas, shall be annexed to the United Benefice of Manningham, Saint Jude, (b) a further part of the endowment and property of the said United Benefice of Bradford, Christ Church with Saint Thomas, namely a sum of £50 per annum being a further part of the said larger annual stipend shall be annexed to the United Benefice of Bradford, Saint Michael and All Angels, (c) a further part of the endowment and property of the said United Benefice of Bradford, Christ Church with Saint Thomas, namely a sum of £71 per annum being a further part of the said larger annual stipend shall be annexed to the United Benefice of Bradford (Saint Peter) and shall be held and administered by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as a Curate Fund for the said United Benefice of Bradford (Saint Peter) and (d) all other the endowment and property of the said United Benefice of Bradford, Christ Church with Saint Thomas, shall be severed from such United Benefice and from the several United Benefices hereinbefore recommended and proposed to be constituted and shall be held and accumulated by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners and by Queen Anne's Bounty (in whose hands is some part of such endowment and property) for and towards the augmentation of the new District referred to in Clause 8 (b) (2) of this Scheme. Provided always that pending the formation of such new District and if the Bishop of Bradford shall so direct the income in respect of the endowments including any accumulations thereof so held by us and Queen Anne's Bounty in favour of such new District shall be paid subject to such conditions as we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and Queen Anne's Bounty respectively shall deem expedient towards the stipend of a Curate serving the area or a part of the area intended to be comprised within such new District.

" 10. That after the said unions have taken effect (a) the patronage of the United Benefice of Manningham, Saint Jude, shall belong wholly to the Patron of the said Benefice of Manningham, Saint Jude; (b) the patronage of the United Benefice of Bradford, Saint Michael and All Angels, shall belong wholly to the Patron

of the said Benefice of Bradford, Saint Michael and All Angels; (c) the patronage of the United Benefice of Bradford (Saint Peter) shall belong wholly to the Patrons of the said Benefice of Bradford (Saint Peter); and (d) the patronage of the proposed new District referred to in Clause 8 (b) (2) of this Scheme shall belong wholly to the Patrons of the said United Benefice of Bradford, Christ Church with Saint Thomas.

" Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the sale and disposal of Christ Church, Bradford, shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Measures are made requisite to the sale under the powers conferred by those Measures of the site of any Church shall be obtained to the sale and disposal hereby proposed of Christ Church, Bradford, and of the site thereof together with any ground annexed or belonging thereto.

" And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Bradford has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.
