At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 5th day of *October*, 1939.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 27th day of September, 1939 (L. 7436/39), in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by Section 3. of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 13th day of October, 1922, and by subsequent Orders in Council, authority was given for the establishment of the Royal Marine Police Force, and of the rates of pay and conditions of service therein:

“And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 13th August, 1935, sanctioned the grant of extra duty pay of 1s. a day to the two Sergeants of the R.M. Police employed as clerks on the Headquarters staff of the Chief Constable, R.M. Police, in consideration of the additional responsibilities entailed in their appointments:

“And whereas we are of the opinion that it has now become necessary to increase the Headquarters staff of the Chief Constable, R.M. Police, by the addition of an Inspector, R.M. Police:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the grant of extra duty pay of 1s. a day to the Inspector of the R.M. Police employed on the Headquarters staff of the R.M. Police with effect as from 28th August, 1939.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
