##### River Roding Catchment Board.

##### Internal Drainage Districts Scheme, 1939.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made an Order under the Land Drainage Act, 1930, confirming a Scheme submitted to him by the River Roding Catchment Board, under Section 4 (1) (b) of that Act, making provision for the abolition of the Ilford Bridge to Ongar and Canfield Internal Drainage District and for the constitution of the Ilford Bridge to Loughton Internal Drainage District, the Abridge to Hallsford Bridge Internal Drainage District and the Chipping Ongar to Canfield Internal Drainage District; and that the Order will become final and have effect as an Act of Parliament, unless within thirty-one days from the date of this Notice a memorial is presented to the Minister by some person or body affected and having an interest sufficient for the presentation of a memorial, praying that the Order shall not become Law without confirmation by Parliament.
