PETROLEUM (PRODUCTION) ACT, 1934.

The Board of Trade hereby give notice of the determination by the Licensee of five Prospecting Licences granted under the Petroleum (Production) Act, 1934, and the Petroleum (Production) Regulations, 1935, to the Gulf Exploration Co. (Great Britain), Ltd., of 3, London Wall Buildings, E.C.2. The areas concerned consisted of five licensed areas which covered about 179 square miles in the County of Kent, including the town of Maidstone, 161 square miles in the County of Sussex including the town of Battle, 162 square miles in the Counties of Wiltshire and Dorset including the town of Shaftesbury, and 15 square miles and 127 square miles in the County of Dorset including the town of Swanage and the village of Compton Valence respectively.

PETROLEUM (PRODUCTION) ACT, 1934.

The Board of Trade hereby give notice that the Anglo-American Oil Company, Limited, of 36, Queen Anne's Gate, London, S.W.I, have surrendered a portion of the area of a Prospecting Licence granted under the Petroleum (Production) Act, 1934, and the Petroleum (Production) Regulations, 1935. The area surrendered is described in the First Schedule hereto.

The Board of Trade also give notice that, in accordance with the provisions of the above Act and Regulations, they have granted to the Anglo-American Oil Company Limited an extension of the area of the above-mentioned Prospecting Licence so as to embrace the additional lands described in the Second Schedule hereto.

The boundaries of the surrendered portion and of the extension are described by reference to the one-inch Ordnance Survey Map, supplemented when necessary by reference to the sixinch Ordnance Survey Map and Admiralty Chart (scale $\frac{1}{148000}$).

A description of the boundaries of the licensed area previously granted, which covered approximately 188 square miles in the Counties of York and Durham, including the town of Middlesbrough, was published in the London Gazette on Friday, the 29th October, 1937.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

An area of approximately 20 square miles situated in the County of York.

Western and Northern Boundaries.

Commencing at the cross-roads by the Inn at High Leven about 4 miles south of Stockton-on-Tees, thence in a north-easterly direction along the main road passing over Stainton Beck, past Blue Bell Farm, the Bungalow and Ormesby Railway Station to the cross-roads about 800 feet west of Bottoms Farm.

Eastern Boundary.

Thence in a south-easterly direction along the road to the road junction by Upsall Hall, thence in a south-westerly direction past Nunthorpe Railway Station to the road junction at Marton Moor House. Thence in a south-southeasterly direction along the road past Nunthorpe Grange and Nunthorpe to the crossroads about 800 feet south of Tree Bridge Farm. Thence in an easterly direction along the road to Point 272 and continuing in a general south-easterly direction past Langbaurgh to the point where it joins the main Guisborough-Great Ayton road. Thence in a general south-westerly direction along the said road through Great Ayton past Angrove East Farm to the road junction about 600 feet east of Garden House.

Southern Boundary.

Thence along the road in a west-south-westerly direction passing through Stokesley by way of High Green and Back Lane to the road junction by Tame Bridge. Thence in a general north-westerly direction along the road past Seamer and Hilton to the cross-roads at High Leven the point of departure.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

An area of approximately 30 square miles situated in the County of York and adjacent bed of the sea.

Northern Boundary.

Commencing at the lighthouse at the mouth of the River Tees thence in a straight line eastwards to a point in Latitude 54° 38′ 50″ North and Longitude 1° 3′ West.

Eastern Boundary.

Thence in a straight line in a south-easterly direction to a point in Latitude 54° 34′ 15″ North and Longitude 0° 47′ West and continuing to a point in Latitude 54° 31′ North and Longitude 0° 38′ West. Thence in a straight line southwards to a point on the coast at high water mark about 1,000 feet east of Upgang.

Western Boundary.

Thence in a north-westerly direction along the coast at high water mark to the coastguard station at Sandsend. Thence continuing along the coast at low water mark past Runswick Bay, Staithes, Saltburn by the Sea and Redcar to the lighthouse at the mouth of the River Tees, the point of departure.
