*River Trent Catchment Board.**Scunthorpe Internal Drainage District.*

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him under Section 4 (3) of the Land Drainage Act, 1930, proposes to make an Order confirming a Scheme submitted to him by the River Trent Catchment Board, under Section 4 (1) (b) of the Act, making provision for the constitution of the Scunthorpe Internal Drainage District and of a Drainage Board therefor, the abrogation of the powers of the Commissioners of Sewers for the county of Lincoln, city of Lincoln and county of the said city and part of the county of Nottingham so far as such powers are exercisable within the proposed new district, and for certain matters supplemental thereto.
