PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 8 of the Air Force (Constitution) Act, 1917, it is enacted that:—

(1) for the purpose of the administration of matters relating to the Air Force and to the defence of the realm by air there shall be established an Air Council consisting of one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, who shall be President of the Air Council, and of other members who shall be appointed in such manner and subject to such provisions as His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct.

(2) His Majesty may, by Order in Council, make provision with respect to the proceedings of the Air Council and the manner in which the business of the Council is to be distributed among the members thereof:

And whereas His Majesty, by Order in Council dated the 28th day of July, 1938, made

provision with respect to the constitution of the Air Council and the manner of the appointment of the members thereof:

And whereas by Section 14 of the Air Force (Constitution) Act, 1917, Orders in Council made under that Act may be varied and revoked by subsequent Orders in Council:

And whereas it is expedient to make provision for the reconstitution of the Air Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

(1) The Air Council shall consist of the following members, that is to say:—

One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State who shall be President of the Air Council.

The Parliamentary Under-Secretary of State for Air.

The Chief of the Air Staff.

The Air Member for Personnel.

The Air Member for Development and Production.

The Air Member for Supply and Organization.

The Permanent Under-Secretary of State for Air.

(2) Of the members of the Air Council (other than the President) the Chief of the Air Staff shall be appointed by His Majesty and the other members shall be appointed by the Secretary of State.

(3) There may be included in the Air Council such additional members (if any) not exceeding three, as may be appointed by the Secretary of State.

(4) The Secretary of State is to be responsible to His Majesty and Parliament for all the business of the Air Council.

All business, other than business which the Secretary of State specially reserves to himself, is to be transacted in the following principal divisions:—

(a) The Parliamentary Under-Secretary of State for Air to be Vice-President of the Air Council and to be responsible to the Secretary of State for so much of the business of the Air Council as may be assigned to him from time to time by the Secretary of State.

(b) The Chief of the Air Staff, who shall be the first and Senior Air Member of Council and principal adviser of the Secretary of State in the direction of the Air Force, the Air Member for Personnel, the Air Member for Development and Production, and the Air Member for Supply and Organization, to be responsible to the Secretary of State for the administration of so much of the business of the Air Council relating to the command, disposition, organization, personnel, training, equipment, armament and maintenance of the Air Force as may be assigned to them, or each of them, from time to time by the Secretary of State.

(c) The Permanent Under-Secretary of State for Air, in relation to the Air Council and concurrently with his corresponding duties in respect of the general business of the Air Ministry, to be responsible for such duties discharged by the Air Council as are not assigned to other members of Council; for financial advice and, as Accounting Officer, for the control of all expenditure; for the general conduct of correspondence, the direction of the organization and the co-ordination and furtherance of the business of the Air Council; and also to be designated Secretary of the Air Council and as such charged with the preparation of all official communications of the Council.

(5) Subject to the foregoing provisions, the powers and duties of the Air Council may be exercised and performed by any three of their number and notwithstanding that any office, the holder of which is a member of the Air Council, is temporarily vacant, provided, however, that documents may be signed on behalf of the Air Council by any two members of the Air Council.

(6) This Order in Council shall be substituted for the Order in Council dated the 28th day of July, 1938.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1935 (33 & 34 Vict. c. 52; 36 & 37 Vict. c. 60; 58 & 59 Vict. c. 33; 6 Edw. 7. c. 15; 22 & 23 Geo. 5. c. 39; 25 & 26 Geo. 5. c. 25), it was, amongst other things, enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to

fugitive criminals who are in, or suspected of being in, the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas a Treaty was signed on the 31st day of March, 1873, between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and His late Majesty the King of Denmark for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, which Treaty applies to Iceland.

And whereas the said Treaty was duly ratified (see S.R. & O. Revised 1904. V.).

And whereas under the provisions of Article 3 of the Supplementary Convention signed on the 25th day of October, 1938, between His Majesty and His Majesty the King of Iceland and Denmark for the mutual extradition of criminals, the terms whereof were recited in the Iceland (Extradition) Order in Council, 1939, and are as follows:—

His Majesty The King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India (hereinafter referred to as His Majesty The King and Emperor), and His Majesty The King of Iceland and Denmark.

Desiring to make further provision for the reciprocal extradition of fugitive criminals, have resolved to conclude a Supplementary Convention to this end, and for this purpose have appointed as their plenipotentiaries:

His Majesty The King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India:

For Great Britain and Northern Ireland:

The Rt. Hon. the Viscount Halifax, K.G., G.C.S.I., G.C.I.E., T.D., His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs;

His Majesty The King of Iceland and Denmark:

For Iceland:

Count Eduard Reventlow, His Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary in London;

Who, having communicated to each other their full powers found in good and due form, have agreed as follows:—

#### ARTICLE 1.

From the date of the coming into force of the present Convention Article 1 of the Extradition Treaty signed at Copenhagen on the 31st March, 1873, shall be amended by the addition of the following clause:—

"Extradition may also be granted at the discretion of the High Contracting Party applied to in respect of any other crime or offence for which, according to the laws of both of the High Contracting Parties for the time being in force, the grant may be made."

#### ARTICLE 2.

The foregoing amendment shall apply to extradition proceedings between Iceland on the one hand, and, on the other hand, the following territories of His Majesty The King and Emperor, that is to say, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, Newfoundland, British Colonies, British Protectorates to which the Extradition Treaty of the 31st March, 1873, applies, and mandated territories to which the said Treaty has been or may be extended, and in respect of which the mandate

is exercised by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

#### ARTICLE 3.

The High Contracting Parties agree that His Majesty The King and Emperor may accede to the present Convention in respect of any other Member of the British Commonwealth of Nations, whose Government may desire that such accession be effected, by a notice given to that effect by the appropriate diplomatic representative of His Majesty The King and Emperor at Copenhagen. From the date that such notice comes into force the amendment set forth in Article 1 shall apply to extradition proceedings between Iceland on the one hand, and, on the other, the territory of the Member of the Commonwealth concerned.

Any notice given under the first paragraph of this Article in respect of any Member of the British Commonwealth of Nations may include any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty The King and Emperor and is exercised by the Government of the Member concerned.

#### ARTICLE 4.

The present Convention shall be ratified. The ratification shall be exchanged at London as soon as possible.

#### ARTICLE 5.

The present Convention shall enter into force three months after the exchange of ratifications, and shall have the same duration as the Extradition Treaty of the 31st March, 1873.

In faith whereof the above-named plenipotentiaries have signed the present Convention and have affixed thereto their seals.

And whereas His Majesty has been advised by His Ministers in the Commonwealth of Australia to take the necessary steps to cause the said recited Acts to be applied in the case of Iceland in respect of the Commonwealth of Australia (including the Territories of Papua and Norfolk Island) in accordance with the said Supplementary Convention:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Him by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the 13th day of December, 1939, the said Acts shall apply in respect of the Commonwealth of Australia (including the Territories of Papua and Norfolk Island) in the case of Iceland under and in accordance with the said Treaty of the 31st March, 1873, as modified by the Supplementary Convention of the 25th October, 1938.

This Order may be cited as the "Iceland (Extradition: Commonwealth of Australia) Order in Council, 1939."

WHEREAS by section 35 of the Solicitors Act, 1932, it is provided that where, as respects a superior court in a British possession, His Majesty in Council is satisfied on the report of a Secretary of State:—

(a) that the regulations respecting the admission of solicitors of that court are such as to secure that those solicitors possess proper qualifications and competency; and

(b) that by the law of that possession solicitors of the Supreme Court in England will be admitted as solicitors of the superior court in that possession on terms as favourable as those on which it is proposed to admit solicitors of that superior court in pursuance of that section as solicitors of the Supreme Court in England;

His Majesty may by Order in Council apply that section to the said superior court and British possession subject to any exceptions, conditions and modifications specified in the Order, and by the same or any subsequent Order in Council may, as respects that court and possession, provide for all matters authorised by that section to be prescribed and for all matters appearing to His Majesty to be necessary or proper for giving effect to the Order and to the said Act:

And whereas by the Foreign Jurisdiction Acts, 1890 and 1913, it is amongst other things provided that it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council by Order to direct that the Colonial Solicitors Act, 1900, or any enactment for the time being in force amending or substituted for the same, shall extend, with or without any exceptions, adaptations, or modifications in the Order mentioned, to any foreign country in which for the time being His Majesty has jurisdiction, and that thereupon the Act shall, to the extent of that jurisdiction, operate as if that country were a British possession:

And whereas section 35 of the Solicitors Act, 1932, has been substituted for the Colonial Solicitors Act, 1900, so far as the latter Act related to England:

And whereas His Majesty has jurisdiction in Northern Rhodesia:

And whereas His Majesty in Council, on the report of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, is satisfied that the regulations respecting the admission of solicitors of the High Court of Northern Rhodesia are such as to secure that those solicitors possess proper qualifications and competency, and that by the law of Northern Rhodesia solicitors of the Supreme Court in England will be admitted as solicitors of the High Court of Northern Rhodesia on terms as favourable as those on which it is proposed to admit solicitors of the High Court of Northern Rhodesia in pursuance of section 35 of the Solicitors Act, 1932, as solicitors of the Supreme Court in England:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers conferred on Him by the Foreign Jurisdiction Acts, 1890 and 1913, and section 35

of the Solicitors Act, 1932, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that section 35 of the Solicitors Act, 1932, shall apply to the High Court of Northern Rhodesia and to the territory of Northern Rhodesia and that solicitors of the High Court of Northern Rhodesia may be admitted by virtue of the latter Act to be solicitors in England, subject to the conditions hereinafter specified:—

(1) A solicitor of the High Court of Northern Rhodesia (hereinafter called the applicant) who, having been in practice before that Court for not less than three years, is desirous of being admitted to be a solicitor of the Supreme Court in England, shall be a British subject, and shall have been articled for five years to a solicitor in Northern Rhodesia, and shall have passed the Intermediate and Final Examinations held by the Law Society before admission to practise in Northern Rhodesia.

(2) The applicant shall, four calendar months at least before the first day of the month in which he proposes to make formal application for admission as hereinafter provided, leave with the Registrar of Solicitors his original certificate of admission in the High Court of Northern Rhodesia together with—

(a) A certificate from the authority of Northern Rhodesia in whose custody the Roll of the solicitors of the said Court is kept, stating that his name is still upon the Roll and has never been removed therefrom and that no order has ever been made directing him to be suspended from practising his profession:

(b) One or more certificates of fitness and character signed by two resident practising solicitors of at least five years' standing in the said Court, and by at least one of the Judges or Officers next in rank of the said Court:

(c) A statutory declaration in terms of, or to the effect of, that set out in the Schedule A hereunto annexed.

(3) The leaving of the before-mentioned documents shall be equivalent to notice of intention to apply for admission within the meaning of the Acts regulating the admission of solicitors in England.

(4) The applicant shall further make formal application for admission as hereinafter provided.

(5) The application for admission to be a solicitor in England shall be made by petition to the Law Society as Registrar of Solicitors, and, on the Master of the Rolls being satisfied by a certificate under the hand of the Registrar that the applicant has complied with the provisions of section 35 of the Solicitors Act, 1932, and of this Order, the Master of the Rolls shall cause him to be admitted a solicitor and his name to be enrolled on the Roll of Solicitors, which admission shall be stamped with the stamps required by clause (6) of this Order.

(6) The admission of the applicant as a solicitor in England shall be stamped with the stamps required to be impressed on the Admission of solicitors in England and shall be impressed with such further stamp as shall, together with the amount of stamps paid on articles of clerkship and admission

in Northern Rhodesia (such amount being certified by a Judge of the High Court of Northern Rhodesia in the form set out in the Schedule B hereunto annexed), be equal in amount to the stamp duty payable on articles of clerkship in England.

(7) The following fee shall be paid by the applicant in England to the Law Society:—

name of the Benefice, in respect of which capital sum, so long as the same or any part thereof shall remain in our hands, there shall be paid by us to the Incumbent for the time being of the Benefice the yearly sum the amount of which is stated in the seventh column of the said Schedule opposite to the name of the Benefice, or such part thereof as shall be proportionate to any balance of the same capital sum which shall so remain in our hands, the yearly sums so payable in respect of the benefaction and of the grant to commence as from the date stated in the eighth column of the said Schedule opposite to the name of the Benefice. or stipend or for such part thereof our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine: Provided also that such yearly sum or stipend is granted upon and is payable only subject to satisfaction of the conditions (if any) stated with reference thereto at the foot of the said Schedule and is in lieu of and in substitution for the temporary grant (if any) shown in the fifth column of the said Schedule which will cease to be payable as from the date stated in the sixth column of the said Schedule: Provided lastly that this Instrument which is intended to be executed in several parts (one part for each Diocese concerned) shall operate only as a single grant in favour of each of the Benefices mentioned in the said Schedule.

- (ac) To cease on the 6th April, 1941.
- (ad) To cease in the event of the Benefice being united or held in plurality with another.
- (ae) To cease on the next vacation of the Benefice.
- (af) Subject to variation or withdrawal at the discretion of the Commissioners upon the cesser of the charge at present subsisting on the Benefice in respect of a pension to a former Incumbent of Mistley with Bradfield.
- (ag) Subject to variation or withdrawal at the discretion of the Commissioners upon the next vacation of the Benefice of Newbold on Avon.
- (ah) Subject to deduction from the first payment of an amount advanced by the Diocesan Board of Finance in respect of the grant.
- (aj) Subject to a payment of £25 per annum to the Incumbent by the London Diocesan Fund and to cease on the next vacation of the Benefice.
- (ak) To cease (1) in the event of the Benefice being united or held in plurality with another or (2) on the next vacation of the adjoining Benefice of Terwick.
- (al) To cease on the 29th September, 1940.
- (am) To cease on the 1st April, 1939.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter III, section 5, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, make out of our Common Fund to the Incumbent for the time being of each of the Benefices whereof the names and the names of the counties and dioceses wherein the same are respectively situate are stated in the first three columns of the Schedule hereto, and to his successors Incumbents of the same Benefice, a grant of a sum to be calculated at the yearly rate stated in the fourth column of the said Schedule opposite to the name of the Benefice, for the period commencing as from the date stated in the fifth column of the said Schedule and terminating on the 1st day of May, 1940 (unless at any time before the expiration of the said period the grant of such sum shall have been cancelled or withdrawn by a resolution of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners) and to be payable so long as the same shall continue in quarterly instalments on the 1st day of February, the 1st day of May, the 1st day of August, and the 1st day of November: Provided always that the sum so granted or any quarterly portion thereof shall

be payable only upon the production to us on or after each of the said quarterly days of payment of a certificate (in such form as may be required by us) under the hand of the Bishop of the Diocese in which the Benefice is situate certifying that, during the quarter then ended, there has been employed within the Parish of the Benefice and duly licensed by such Bishop such Assistant Curate as is indicated in the sixth column of the said Schedule, and that such Assistant Curate has been in receipt of a stipend after a rate of not less than £150 per annum: Provided also that such sum is granted upon and is payable only subject to the satisfaction of the further conditions (if any) stated with reference thereto at the foot of the said Schedule: Provided lastly that this Instrument which is intended to be executed in several parts (one part for each Diocese concerned) shall operate only as a single grant in favour of each of the Benefices mentioned in the said Schedule.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter III, section 5, do hereby subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant out of our Common Fund to the Incumbent for the time being of each of the Benefices named in the Schedule hereto, one yearly sum or stipend of £60, or such less sum as is indicated at the foot of the said Schedule, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable for the period commencing on the 2nd November,

1938, or such later date as may be stated in the said Schedule and terminating on the 1st day of November, 1942, unless at any time before the expiration of the said period the grant of such stipend shall have been cancelled or withdrawn by a resolution of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and to be payable so long as the same shall continue in four equal portions on the first day of February, the first day of May, the first day of August and the first day of November in each year: Provided always that no portion of any

such yearly sum or stipend shall be payable except upon the production to us of a certificate (at such time and in such form as we may require) under the hand of the Bishop of the Diocese in which the Benefice is situate certifying that an Assistant Curate has been employed within the Parish at a stipend of not less than £120 per annum: Provided also that such yearly sum or stipend is granted upon and is payable only subject to satisfaction of the further conditions stated with reference thereto in or at the foot of the said

Schedule: Provided lastly that this Instrument which is intended to be executed in several parts (one part for each Diocese concerned) shall only operate as a single Grant in favour of each of the Benefices mentioned in the said Schedule.
