PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty has been pleased to approve a change in the Constitution of the Army Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The Secretary of State is to be responsible to His Majesty and Parliament for all the business of the Army Council. All business other than business which the Secretary of State specially reserves to himself is to be transacted in the following principal subdivisions:—

(a) The Parliamentary Under-Secretary of State shall be responsible to the Secretary of State for the administration of business affecting the Territorial Army Associations and War Department Lands, and for so much of the other business of the Army Council as may be assigned to him, from time to time, by the Secretary of State.

(b) The First Military Member of the Army Council (the Chief of the Imperial General Staff), the Second Military Member of the Army Council (the Adjutant-General to the Forces), and the Third Military Member of the Army Council (the Quartermaster-General to the Forces) shall be responsible to the Secretary of State for the administration of so much of the business relating to the organisation, disposition, personnel, armament, and maintenance of the Army, as may be assigned to them, or each of them, from time to time, by the Secretary of State.

(c) The Finance Member of the Army Council (Financial Secretary of the War Office) shall be responsible to the Secretary of State for the finance of the Army and for so much of the other business of the Army Council as may be assigned to him, from time to time, by the Secretary of State.

(d) The Permanent Under-Secretary of State shall be a Member, and Secretary, of the Army Council, and responsible to the Secretary of State for the preparation of all official communications of the Council and for the interior economy of the War Office: he shall also be responsible, on his appointment as Accounting Officer of Army Votes, Funds and Accounts, for the control of expenditure, and for advising the Secretary of State and the Administrative Officers at the War Office and in Commands on all questions of Army expenditure.

He shall further be charged with such other duties as may be assigned to him, from time to time, by the Secretary of State.

2. This Order in Council shall be substituted for the Order in Council dated 3rd July, 1939.

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for authorising the sale and disposal of certain property situate in the County of Gloucester now vested in us:

“ Whereas the property, particulars whereof are set forth in the Schedule hereunder

written, is now vested in us not subject to any outstanding beneficial lease or grant but in possession and we are desirous of selling the same or some portion thereof for the improvement of our Common Fund:

“ Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty that we may be authorised and empowered to sell or dispose of and duly to transfer or convey from time to time all or part of the said property described in the said Schedule for such consideration as shall appear to us to be just and reasonable.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the Diocese of Gloucester.

##### WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORITIES.

(PATRICK JOSEPH WALLACE).

Whereas Patrick Joseph Wallace, M.B., B.Ch. Irel., whose registered address is Wood-end, Upton, near Pontefract, has been convicted of an offence against the Dangerous Drugs Acts, 1920 to 1932.

And whereas the said Patrick Joseph Wallace cannot, in my opinion, properly be allowed to be in possession of or to supply any drug or preparation to which the Dangerous Drugs

Regulations, 1937, or any drug to which the Raw Opium, etc. Regulations, 1937, apply:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Regulation 7 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937, and by Regulation 5 of the Raw Opium, etc. Regulations, 1937, I hereby withdraw from the said Patrick Joseph Wallace the authorities conferred by the said Regulations upon him to be in possession of and to supply the drugs or preparations to which the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937, and the drugs to which the Raw Opium, etc. Regulations, 1937, apply:

And I hereby direct that it shall not be lawful for the said Patrick Joseph Wallace to give prescriptions for the purposes of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937.

## SHEEP SCAB MOVEMENT AND DOUBLE-DIPPING AREAS.

The following areas are "Movement Areas" for the purposes of Part II of the Sheep Scab Order of 1938:—

*Inverness.*—An area comprising:—

The Islands known as the Outer Hebrides (*except the Islands of St. Kilda, Dune, Soay, Boreray and Harris; and except the parish of North Uist and all the Islands therein, together with the island of Berneray in the parish of Harris and all the grazing islands attached thereto and the island of Barra and the adjacent islets attached to the holdings of Barra*), in the County of Inverness.

*Westmorland and Yorkshire.*—An area comprising:—

So much of the counties of Westmorland and the North and West Ridings of Yorkshire as lies within the following boundary, namely:—Commencing at Kirkby Stephen Church thence proceeding along the road in a southerly direction via Nateby and Outhgill to Moor Cock Inn, thence in a generally south westerly direction along the road via Garsdale Head, Dent Station, Cowgill House, Dent Church, Gawthrop and Peas Gill House to Barbon, thence in a generally northerly direction along the road via Middleton, Middleton Station, Borrett and Ingmire Hall to Bridge End; thence in a northerly direction along the River Lune to Lune's Bridge near Roger Howe: thence in a northerly direction along the road to Cross Keys Inn: and thence in an easterly direction along the road via Kellath, Ravenstonedale Station, Coldbeck and Kirkby Stephen Station to the point of commencement.
