WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 2nd day of November, 1939, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Scottow and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Lammas with Little Hautbois, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Norfolk and in the Diocese of Norwich :

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Scottow and Lammas with Little Hautbois duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Norwich and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Norwich signified in writing his approval of the said Report :

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report :

“ And whereas both of the said Benefices are at present vacant :

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Scottow and the said Benefice of Lammas with Little Hautbois shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of Scottow with Lammas and Little Hautbois ’ but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

“ 2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the other of the said two Benefices; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of that one of the said two Benefices which shall last be avoided after the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme.

“ 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Lammas with Little Hautbois shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

“ 4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate

to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Scottow having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patrons of the said Benefice of Lammias with Little Hautbois having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

“ Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.”

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Norwich has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Norwich.

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Edward Sydney, Bishop of Lichfield, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Newborough, All Saints, and Christ Church-on-Needwood, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Lichfield and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Lichfield signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but, with the assent of the said Bishop of Lichfield, embodies a modification thereof:

“ And whereas the said Benefice of Newborough, All Saints, is now full, the Reverend William Sargeant being the present Incumbent thereof, and the said Benefice of Christ Church-on-Needwood is at present vacant:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Edward Sydney, Bishop of Lichfield, and with the consent also of the said William Sargeant (testified by their signing this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Newborough, All Saints, and the said Benefice of Christ Church-on-Needwood shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of Newborough, All Saints with Christ Church-on-Needwood ’ but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

“ 2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said William Sargeant if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Newborough, All Saints, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

“ 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Christ Church-on-Needwood shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

“ 4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the

said Benefice of Christ Church-on-Needwood having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Newborough, All Saints, having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 2nd day of November, 1939, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Churches and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Stow Bedon with Breccles, in the County of Norfolk and in the Diocese of Norwich.

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Stow Bedon with Breccles is vested in Douglas Bremner, Esquire, and Edward William Hugh Arliss, Esquire, both of No. 38, New Broad Street, in the City of London, as trustees of the Will dated the 31st day of July, 1925, of the late Kenneth Bremner, of Airlie Lodge, Berrylands Road, Surbiton, in the County of Surrey, and No. 38, New Broad Street, aforesaid, Merchant, and the beneficiaries under the said Will are the said Douglas Bremner, Florence Rose Schlotel, Wife of Herbert Colling Schlotel, of No. 32, Balaclava Road, Surbiton, aforesaid, Esquire, and Violet Maud Carter, Wife of Edward Carter, of 'The Chestnuts,' Catherine Road, Surbiton, aforesaid, Esquire:

"And whereas the said Douglas Bremner and Edward William Hugh Arliss with the consents of the said Florence Rose Schlotel and Violet Maud Carter are willing that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Stow Bedon with Breccles now vested as aforesaid should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Norwich for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Bertram now Bishop of Norwich is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Stow Bedon with Breccles which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parishes of Stow Bedon and Breccles:

"Now, therefore, with the consents of the said Douglas Bremner, Edward William Hugh Arliss, Florence Rose Schlotel and Violet Maud Carter (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich (in

testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Stow Bedon with Breccles shall be transferred to the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 108, and of the Act of the 21st and 22nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 57, which Acts are known as 'The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts', and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1936, and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1938, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in

Council the following Scheme relating to the Benefice of Hessle, in the County of York and in the Diocese of York:

"Whereas the annual value of the said Benefice of Hessle has been improved under and by virtue of certain sales of glebe lands formerly belonging to the said Benefice which sales have been effected under the authority of the said Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts and of the Act of the 51st and 52nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 20, which Act is known as 'The Glebe Lands Act, 1888':

"And whereas the proceeds of the said sales have been invested in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Acts, and the investments so made include a sum of £2,000 Local Loans £3 per centum per annum Stock (*inter alia*) a sum of £2,393 14s. 5d. £3 10s. per centum per annum Conversion Stock, and a sum of £2,447 Glasgow Corporation £3 10s. per centum per annum Irredeemable Stock which sums of Stock are now held by us in trust to pay to the Vicar or Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice the annual interest or dividends from time to time arising or accruing therefrom or thereupon, but subject nevertheless to the provisions contained in the said Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts and the said Measures with respect to making a certain portion of the improved value arising to the said Benefice from the said sales payable to us for the benefit of our Common Fund to be applied in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts:

"And whereas the improvement in the annual value of the said Benefice arising from or by means of the said sales amounts to the annual sum of £198, and after the appropriation hereinafter recommended to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of our Common Fund, the average annual income of the said Benefice will still be considerably in excess of £600:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Hessle is now full, the Reverend Prebendary Charles Henry Lenton being the Vicar or Incumbent thereof:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day of the date at which the said Benefice of Hessle shall from whatsoever cause be next voided a sum of £1,993 6s. 8d. Local Loans £3 per centum per annum Stock (being a portion of the aforesaid sum of the same Stock) the said sum of £2,393 14s. 5d. £3 10s. per centum per annum Conversion Stock and a sum of £1,606 5s. 7d. Glasgow Corporation £3 10s. per centum per annum Irredeemable Stock (being a portion of the aforesaid sum of the same Stock) shall cease to be held by us for the benefit of the Vicar or Incumbent of the said Benefice of Hessle and shall be held by us for the benefit of our Common Fund to be applied in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or Measures or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament or of any

other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England."

And whereas the Notice of the foregoing Scheme which is required by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts has been given by the said Commissioners to the Patron of the said Benefice of Hessele and the said Patron has not made any objection to the said Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme, under the 11th Section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, for making certain alterations in the provisions of the Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council dated the 31st day of January, 1922, and published in the London Gazette on the 3rd day of the month following (hereinafter called the original Order) for effecting the union of the Benefice of Chalvington and the Benefice of Ripe, both in the County of Sussex and in the Diocese of Chichester:

"Whereas by Clause 4 of the original Order it was directed that, upon the union of the said Benefices taking effect, the Parsonage House then belonging to the said Benefice of Ripe should become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice, and so soon as conveniently might be the Parsonage House then belonging to the said Benefice of Chalvington and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds theretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith should be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and that the net proceeds from such sale should be applied (a) in defraying the cost of such improvements to the Parsonage House belonging to the said Benefice of Ripe and intended to be the Parsonage House of the United Benefice as to us should seem sufficient and (b) as to any balance as part of the fund created by the 13th Section of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919:

"And whereas the said union has not yet taken effect:

"And whereas it has been represented to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and we are satisfied that the Parsonage House belonging to the said Benefice of Chalvington is more suitable to become the house of residence of the Incumbent of the United Benefice than the said Parsonage House belonging to the said Benefice of Ripe and it appears to us expedient that the provisions contained in the original Order as aforesaid should be altered as hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, with the consent of the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Chichester, do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That Clause 4 of the original Order shall be rescinded.

"2. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Chalvington shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Ripe and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

" And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said union of Benefices and alterations of boundaries based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

" And whereas both of the said Benefices of Weyhill and Penton Mewsey are now full the Reverend Edward Joseph Northcote-Green being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Weyhill and the Reverend William Arthur Badger being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Penton Mewsey:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Cyril, Bishop of Winchester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

" 1. That the said Benefice of Weyhill and the said Benefice of Penton Mewsey shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Weyhill with Penton Mewsey' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

" 2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London

Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the other of the said two Benefices; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of that one of the said two Benefices which shall last be avoided after the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme.

" 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Penton Mewsey shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Weyhill and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

" 4. That upon the union taking effect a part of the total endowments of the Benefices hereinbefore recommended and proposed to be constituted an United Benefice, that is to say, a capital sum producing £115 per annum being part of the sum of money appropriated or to be appropriated by Queen Anne's Bounty to the said Benefice of Weyhill pursuant to the provisions of Part II paragraph 2 of the Third Schedule to the Tithe Act, 1936, and paragraph 1 of the Eighth Schedule to the same Act shall be severed or diverted from the said Benefice of Weyhill and from the United Benefice and shall be appropriated by Queen Anne's Bounty for the augmentation of the said Benefice of Appleshaw.

" 5. That with the consents of the Patrons and Incumbent of the said Benefice of Appleshaw, namely the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of The Holy Trinity, Saint Peter, Saint Paul and Saint Swithun at Winchester, being the Patrons of the said Benefice of Appleshaw (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common or Capitular Seal to be affixed to the Scheme), and the Reverend Walter Wynne Hall, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Appleshaw (testified by his signing this Scheme), upon the union taking effect there shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Appleshaw all that part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Weyhill which lies to the west and north of an imaginary line following the middle of the road leading along the eastern boundary of Bucklands Copse to Nutbane, then following the middle of Nutbane Lane to its junction with Penton Lane, then following the middle of Penton Lane to its junction with Back Lane, then following the middle of Back Lane to its junction with the road leading from Clanville to Weyhill, then following the middle of the lastly mentioned road to its junction with and then following the middle of the road leading to Tilly Down (all which part is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the map

or plan annexed hereto and thereon coloured green).

6. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices of Weyhill and Penton Mewsey alternately, and if under any of the provisions of Clause 2 of this Scheme an Incumbent of the said Benefice of Weyhill shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice then the first turn shall belong to the Patron of the said Benefice of Penton Mewsey, but otherwise the first turn shall belong to the Patrons of the said Benefice of Weyhill.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices, have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Winchester has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Winchester.

WIRELESS OPERATORS AND WATCHES (MERCHANT SHIPS) ORDER, 1939.

By Command of the
Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty.

In pursuance of Regulation 45 of the Defence Regulations, 1939, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty hereby make the following Order:—

1. Every British ship to which the Merchant Shipping (Wireless Telegraphy) Rules, 1938, apply, whose hours at sea exceed eight, not being a ship of war or a Dominion ship, shall be provided with not less than two operators if so required by the Admiralty or a person authorised by the Admiralty.

2. Every British ship to which the Merchant Shipping (Wireless Telegraphy) Rules, 1938, apply, not being a ship of war or a Dominion ship, shall, when at sea, maintain such wireless watches as may be ordered by the Admiralty or a person authorised by the Admiralty, and in the absence of other instructions from such authority shall, when at sea, maintain wireless watches as follows:—

(a) When three or more operators are carried, a continuous watch.

(b) When two operators are carried, then
(i) if the hours at sea do not exceed 48, a

continuous watch; and (ii) if the hours at sea exceed 48, for not less than sixteen hours a day, including the times specified in the last column of the Schedule to this Order.

(c) When one operator only is available, then for not less than eight hours a day, including the times specified in the penultimate column of the Schedule to this Order, provided that, if the hours at sea do not exceed eight, wireless watch shall be kept during the whole time that the ship is at sea.

3. Wireless watches in accordance with this Order shall be maintained by an operator, notwithstanding that the ship may be provided with an auto alarm or similar device.

4. For the purpose of this Order the persons authorised by the Admiralty include the Senior Naval Officer of any port, the Officer in charge of any convoy, any Officer appointed for naval control service duties and any Officer appointed by any of the aforesaid Officers or by the Admiralty to act in these matters.

5. This Order shall come into force forthwith and may be cited as the Wireless Operators and Watches (Merchant Ships) Order, 1939.

LEEDS CORPORATION TRAMWAYS
(CESSER OF POWERS) ORDER, 1939.

WHEREAS by the Pudsey Corporation Tramways Order 1905 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order of 1905") the Pudsey Corporation were authorised to construct and maintain certain tramways to be wholly situate within the borough of Pudsey in the west riding of the county of York part of which are described in the Schedule hereto and are hereinafter referred to as "the abandoned tramways."

And whereas by the Leeds Corporation Act 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1908") the powers and obligations of the Pudsey Corporation under the Order of 1905 and the enactments incorporated therewith and the tramways or works constructed in pursuance thereof were transferred to the Leeds Corporation (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation").

And whereas Part III of the Tramways Act, 1870 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1870"), is incorporated with the Order of 1905, and the Act of 1908.

And whereas by virtue of the Ministry of Transport Act, 1919, and the Ministry of Transport (Board of Trade Exception of Powers) Order, 1919, the powers and duties of the Board of Trade under Part III of the Act of 1870, have been transferred to the Minister of Transport.

And whereas the Corporation have applied to the Minister of Transport for an order under Section 41 of the Act of 1870, declaring that the powers of the Corporation in respect of the abandoned tramways shall be at an end and it has been proved to the satisfaction of the Minister of Transport that the working of the abandoned tramways has been discontinued for the space of three calendar months.

Now therefore the Minister of Transport in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred on him by Section 41 of the Act of 1870, hereby orders and declares that the powers of the Corporation in respect of the abandoned tramways shall from the date of this Order be at an end.

This Order may be cited as the Leeds Corporation Tramways (Cesser of Powers) Order, 1939.
