

testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Stow Bedon with Breccles shall be transferred to the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Norwich.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 108, and of the Act of the 21st and 22nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 57, which Acts are known as "The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts", and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1936, and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1938, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 2nd day of November, 1939, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 108, and of the Act of the 21st and 22nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 57, which Acts are known as 'The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts', and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1936, and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1938, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in

Council the following Scheme relating to the Benefice of Hessle, in the County of York and in the Diocese of York:

"Whereas the annual value of the said Benefice of Hessle has been improved under and by virtue of certain sales of glebe lands formerly belonging to the said Benefice which sales have been effected under the authority of the said Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts and of the Act of the 51st and 52nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 20, which Act is known as 'The Glebe Lands Act, 1888':

"And whereas the proceeds of the said sales have been invested in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Acts, and the investments so made include a sum of £2,000 Local Loans £3 per centum per annum Stock (*inter alia*) a sum of £2,393 14s. 5d. £3 10s. per centum per annum Conversion Stock, and a sum of £2,447 Glasgow Corporation £3 10s. per centum per annum Irredeemable Stock which sums of Stock are now held by us in trust to pay to the Vicar or Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice the annual interest or dividends from time to time arising or accruing therefrom or thereupon, but subject nevertheless to the provisions contained in the said Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts and the said Measures with respect to making a certain portion of the improved value arising to the said Benefice from the said sales payable to us for the benefit of our Common Fund to be applied in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts:

"And whereas the improvement in the annual value of the said Benefice arising from or by means of the said sales amounts to the annual sum of £198, and after the appropriation hereinafter recommended to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of our Common Fund, the average annual income of the said Benefice will still be considerably in excess of £600:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Hessle is now full, the Reverend Prebendary Charles Henry Lenton being the Vicar or Incumbent thereof:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day of the date at which the said Benefice of Hessle shall from whatsoever cause be next voided a sum of £1,993 6s. 8d. Local Loans £3 per centum per annum Stock (being a portion of the aforesaid sum of the same Stock) the said sum of £2,393 14s. 5d. £3 10s. per centum per annum Conversion Stock and a sum of £1,606 5s. 7d. Glasgow Corporation £3 10s. per centum per annum Irredeemable Stock (being a portion of the aforesaid sum of the same Stock) shall cease to be held by us for the benefit of the Vicar or Incumbent of the said Benefice of Hessle and shall be held by us for the benefit of our Common Fund to be applied in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or Measures or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament or of any
