BY THE KING.

A PROCLAMATION

DIRECTING THAT CERTAIN BRITISH SUBJECTS SHALL BECOME LIABLE UNDER THE NATIONAL SERVICE (ARMED FORCES) ACT, 1939, TO BE CALLED UP FOR SERVICE IN THE ARMED FORCES OF THE CROWN.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS by the National Service (Armed Forces) Act, 1939, (2 & 3 Geo. 6. c. 81) it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for Us by Proclamation to direct that, save as therein otherwise provided, all Our male subjects who at the date of Our Proclamation have attained such age, not being less than eighteen years, as We may specify by such Proclamation and have not attained such greater age, not being more than forty-one years, as We may so specify, and who at the date of Our Proclamation are within Great Britain, or not having been in Great Britain on that date subsequently enter it, shall, on the date of Our Proclamation or on the date on which they first enter Great Britain after the date of Our Proclamation as the case may be, become liable under the said Act to be called up for service in Our Armed Forces:

And whereas it is further enacted by the said Act that no person shall be liable thereunder to be called up for service who—

(a) is a person not ordinarily resident in Great Britain who is, under the provisions of any Act in force in any part of Our dominions outside Great Britain, a national

or a citizen of that part within the meaning of that Act, or is a person born or domiciled in any such part of Our dominions or in a British protectorate, a mandated territory, or any other country or territory being a country or territory under Our protection or suzerainty; or

(b) is a person employed in the service of the Government of a part of Our dominions outside Great Britain, or in the service of the Government of a British protectorate, a mandated territory or some other country or territory which is under Our protection or suzerainty, being a person whose presence in Great Britain is occasioned solely by his employment in that service; or

(c) is a member of any of Our Armed Forces; or

(d) is undergoing training as a cadet at the Royal Military Academy, the Royal Military College, or the Royal Air Force College; or

(e) is a man in holy orders or a regular minister of any religious denomination; or

(f) is the subject of an order or inquisition under the Lunacy and Mental Treatment Acts, 1890 to 1930, or is being detained in pursuance of section twenty-five of the Lunacy Act, 1890, or as a criminal lunatic or in pursuance of an order made under the Criminal Lunatics Act, 1884, or is undergoing treatment as a temporary patient under section five of the Mental Treatment Act, 1930, or is a person placed in an institution or a certified house, or under guardianship, under section three of the Mental Deficiency Act, 1913, or is the subject of an

order under section six, eight, or nine of that Act, or is under supervision provided under paragraph (b) of section thirty of that Act or is an inmate of a home approved under section fifty of that Act, or is the subject of a notification under subsection (2) of section fifty-one of that Act; or

(g) is the subject of an order or warrant for his detention or custody under the Lunacy (Scotland) Acts, 1857 to 1919, or is being entertained and kept in an asylum in pursuance of section fifteen of the Lunacy (Scotland) Act, 1866, or is a person for whose safe custody during Our pleasure We are authorised to give order or is a prisoner whom the Secretary of State or the Prisons Department for Scotland has, in pursuance of any Act, directed to be removed to a criminal lunatic asylum or to the criminal lunatic department of Perth prison or to an asylum, or is a person placed in an institution or a certified house or under guardianship under section four of the Mental Deficiency and Lunacy (Scotland) Act, 1913, or is the subject of an order under section seven, nine, or ten of that Act; or

(h) is certified by a local authority, as defined by the Blind Persons Acts, 1920 and 1938, to be registered as a blind person under arrangements made by the authority under those Acts.

And whereas it is also enacted by the said Act that any person who at the commencement of that Act was registered under the Military Training Act, 1939, or who was required to be so registered at any time before the commencement of the National Service (Armed Forces) Act, 1939, shall be liable to be called up for service under the last mentioned Act notwithstanding that he may not be so liable by virtue of any Proclamation made under that Act:

And whereas by Our Proclamation dated the first day of October, 1939, We did in pursuance of the said Act direct, declare and proclaim that with the exceptions therein mentioned all Our male subjects who on the said first day of October, 1939, had attained the age of twenty years and had not attained the age of twenty-two years and who were at the said date within Great Britain or who not having been in Great Britain at that date subsequently entered it were on the date of the said Proclamation or on the date on which they first subsequently entered Great Britain after the date thereof liable under the said Act to be called up for service in Our Armed Forces:

Now, therefore, We do in pursuance of the said Act hereby direct, declare and proclaim that with the exceptions hereinbefore mentioned all Our male subjects who on the date of this Our Proclamation shall have attained the age of twenty years and shall not have attained the age of twenty-three years and who are at the date of this Our Proclamation within Great Britain, or who not having been in Great Britain at that date subsequently enter it, are, on the date hereof or on the date on which they first subsequently enter Great Britain after the date hereof, by this Our Proclamation liable under the said Act to be called up for service in Our Armed Forces.

And We do hereby order the Right Honourable Alfred Ernest Brown, M.C., Our Minister

of Labour and National Service, to give all necessary directions herein accordingly.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace this First day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine, and in the Third year of Our Reign.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 23rd day of November, 1939, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the Parish of Catterick, of the Parish of Easby and of the Parish of Hudswell, all in the County of York and in the Diocese of Ripon:

“ Whereas it has been represented to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and it appears to us to be desirable that the boundaries of the said Parish of Catterick, of the said Parish of Easby and of the said Parish of Hudswell should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

“ And whereas the Benefices of Catterick, Easby and Hudswell are now full, the Reverend Reginald Frederick Bradley being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Catterick, the Reverend John Woods being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Easby and the Reverend Edgar Edward Hart being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Hudswell, and such Incumbents have signified their consents to the proposals hereinafter mentioned by signing this Scheme:

“ And whereas the Diocesan Committee of the Diocese of Ripon appointed pursuant to the first section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have by a Resolution passed at a meeting of the said Diocesan Committee held on the 30th day of March, 1939, signified their consent to the alterations of boundaries herein proposed:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Geoffrey, Bishop of Ripon (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said Parish of Catterick, of the said Parish of Easby and of the said Parish of Hudswell shall be altered so that all those detached portions of the said Parish of Catterick and of the said Parish of Easby

which are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured pink shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said Parish of Hudswell.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Ripon has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Ripon.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70; of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97; and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55; duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Representation, bearing date the 2nd day of November, 1939, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty,

Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Gabriel, Fullbrook, Walsall, situate within the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint Paul, Wood Green, Wednesbury, in the County of Stafford and in the Diocese of Lichfield:

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Wood Green, Wednesbury, of the Parish of Walsall, of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Michael and All Angels, Caldmore, of the New Parish (sometime particular District) of Saint Mary and All Saints, Palfrey, Walsall, and of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Pleck and Bescot, all in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such Parish and New Parishes respectively:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Parish and New Parishes should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Gabriel, Fullbrook, Walsall, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward Sydney, Bishop of the said Diocese of Lichfield, as such Bishop and also as the patron in right of his See of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Wood Green, Wednesbury, of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Caldmore, and of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Mary and All Saints, Palfrey, Walsall, and with the consent of the Right Honourable Orlando, Earl of Bradford, as the Patron of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Walsall and with the consent of the Reverend Horace John Carpenter, Clerk in Holy Orders, Vicar or Incumbent of the last mentioned Vicarage, and as such Vicar or Incumbent the Patron of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Pleck and Bescot, (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Wood Green, Wednesbury, of the said Parish of Walsall, of the said New Parish of St. Michael and All Angels, Caldmore, of the said New Parish of Saint Mary and All Saints, Palfrey, Walsall, and of the said New Parish of Pleck and Bescot which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Gabriel, Fullbrook, Walsall, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Gabriel, Fullbrook, Walsall'.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Gabriel, Fullbrook, Walsall, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the New Parish of Saint Paul, Wood Green, Wednesbury, of the Parish of Walsall, of the New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Caldmore, of the New Parish of Saint Mary and All Saint, Palfrey, Walsall, and of the New Parish of Pleck and Bescot, all in the County of Stafford and in the Diocese of Lichfield, which taken together are bounded upon part of the south-west by the District of Saint Francis, West Bromwich, upon the south-east and upon part of the east by the Parish of Great Barr, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the east, upon the north, upon the west and upon the remaining part of the south-west, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Great Barr from the said Parish of Walsall crosses the middle of the Rushall Canal and extending thence northward along the middle of the Rushall Canal for a distance of 21 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Birmingham Road across such Canal and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Birmingham Road for a distance of 51 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Broadway and extending thence first south-westward and then westward along the middle of Broadway (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said Parish of Walsall from the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Caldmore, and also the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Caldmore, from the said New Parish of Saint Mary and All Angels, Palfrey, Walsall) for a distance of 72 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Broadway West and extending thence westward along the middle of Broadway West (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mary and All Saints, Palfrey, Walsall, from the said New Parish of Pleck and Bescot) for a distance of 57 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries it across the Birmingham and Wolverhampton line of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway and extending thence first southward and then south-eastward along the middle of the said line of railway (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Pleck and Bescot from the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Wood Green, Wednesbury) for a distance of 1 mile and 5 chains or thereabouts to the point where it is crossed by the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Wood Green, Wednesbury, from the said District of Saint Francis, West Bromwich."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Lichfield.

The KING has been graciously pleased to give orders for the following appointments to the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire:—

*To be Additional Officers of the Civil Division
of the said Most Excellent Order:—*

Captain Thomas Huntley Farrar, Master, s.s. "Baharistan" (Messrs. J. Redhead and Sons Limited, Newcastle).

This ship was not armed. She was suddenly attacked at dead of night by an enemy submarine at very short range not far off shore near the Lands End. The U-boat fired from ahead of her on her seaward bow, so that to escape she had to turn towards the land. The Master could not have been blamed for heaving to and abandoning ship. But he determined at great risk to defy the enemy and at once brought the gun flash astern. The submarine now brought her searchlight to bear, extinguished it, and continued firing. All shots fell very close, but by the bold decision and ready skill of her Master, "Baharistan" made good her escape and anchored safely in Mounts Bay to await daylight.

Commander Edward Templeton Grayston, D.S.C., R.D., R.N.R. (retired), Master, s.s. "Karamea" (Messrs. Shaw, Savill and Albion Company, Limited, London).

This ship was not armed. She was chased for four hours by the U-boat which sank "Bretagne". The enemy fired at least 30 shells, many of which fell within a few feet of her hull. She surfaced so near that it was made difficult for "Karamea" to avoid ramming her. On this account and from her merciless treatment of "Bretagne", the Master felt that he could expect no quarter. He therefore made up his mind to defy the enemy and to attempt escape. He was supported by the whole crew in this courageous, if reckless, resolve. His only hope was the intervention of one of H.M. Ships or Aircraft. His act of faith was justified in the event and saved his ship.

Captain Albert Angel White, Master, s.s. "Stonepool" (Sir R. Ropner and Company, West Hartlepool).

On sighting a U-boat "Stonepool" manned her gun in about two minutes and exchanged shot for shot with the enemy, with guns of a similar calibre at a fair rate of fire. The shooting was good and the fifteenth shot may well have hit or damaged the U-boat whose thirteenth or fourteenth shot holed "Stonepool" two feet above the water line. By his resolute and skilful action the Master saved his ship. The discipline was excellent and the gunlayer and gun's crew did very well. This is the first straight fight in this war between a defensively armed merchantman and a U-boat.

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Aihman Sing Dhanwar, Mahout, Forest Department, Jalpaiguri, Rajshahi Division, Bengal.

Aihman Sing assisted Mr. A. V. Pullan, Manager of Kartick Tea Estate, to follow up a tigress that had been wounded and had mauled one of the coolies on Turturi Tea Estate.

The tigress, which was lying up in dense jungle, leapt out unexpectedly at close quarters and put to flight the elephant on which Mr. Pullan was riding. In the course of its flight the elephant stumbled and threw off her mahout and Mr. Pullan who was seized and badly mauled by the tigress.

The second elephant, driven by Aihman Sing mahout, also took fright and bolted. Aihman Sing pulled her up in a short distance and brought her back towards the scene of the accident. He was unable to bring her right up to Mr. Pullan. By a great effort the latter, although suffering from a fractured leg and arm and other injuries, managed to crawl towards Aihman Sing who seated his elephant and hauled him on to the pad and thus got him away to safety.

The tigress meanwhile attempted to get at the other mahout who had climbed a small tree. Having delivered Mr. Pullan to safety Aihman Sing returned to the scene and rescued the other mahout by running his elephant under the tree and so enabling him to leap on to the pad.

Aihman Sing Dhanwar undoubtedly saved the life of Mr. Pullan and possibly also of the other mahout.
