WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme, bearing date the 2nd day of November, 1939, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the Parish of Twickenham in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London and being a Benefice in the Metropolis or in the vicinity thereof as those terms are defined by the Union of Benefices Acts 1860 and 1898, that is to say, the Acts of the 23rd and 24th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 142 and the Act of the 61st and 62nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 23:

“ Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Twickenham is a Cure wherein or in part whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient

for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it appears to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said Parish of Twickenham which is mentioned and described in the Schedule to this Scheme and is delineated on the map or plan annexed to this Scheme should be constituted a separate District for ecclesiastical purposes in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

“ And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

“ And whereas by an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 23rd day of April, 1937, and published in the London Gazette on the 27th day of the same month, the Benefice of Saint Edmund the King with Saint Nicholas Acons, and the Benefice of All Hallows, Lombard Street, with Saint Benet, Gracechurch, Saint Leonard, Eastcheap, and Saint Dionis, Blackchurch, both in the City of London and in the said Diocese of London were united into one Benefice and it was by the same Order provided (inter alia) (1) that out of the proceeds of the sale or sales of the site and materials of the Church of All Hallows, Lombard Street, Churches shall be built for three or more ecclesiastical districts constituted or to be constituted within the limits of the Metropolis or in the vicinity thereof; (2) that the first of such Districts shall be formed within the Diocese of London, that the Church of such District shall be consecrated by the name and style of All Hallows, and that the Patronage thereof shall be vested in the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Christ in Canterbury; (3) that upon certain events

which have not yet happened the endowments of the said United Benefice shall be charged with two equal perpetual annual rent-charges amounting together to £800 per annum for the endowment of two new Districts, one being the proposed District of which the Church is to be consecrated by the name and style of All Hallows, as aforesaid; and (4) that pending the provision of such permanent endowment a sum of £20,000 out of the proceeds of the said sale or sales shall be invested by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and the income therefrom shall be paid in equal moieties to the Ministers or Incumbents of the said two new Districts:

“ And whereas the District hereinafter proposed to be constituted has been selected as the District for which a Church to be consecrated by the name and style of All Hallows shall be built and endowed as provided by the above-mentioned Order in Council:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Geoffrey Francis, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said Parish of Twickenham which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day upon which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes by the name of ‘ The District of All Hallows, Twickenham ’.

“ And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed District and, when such District shall have become a New Parish; then of such New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall, as provided by the said Order in Council bearing date the 23rd day of April, 1937, be vested in and exercised by the said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Christ in Canterbury.

“ And we further recommend that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or to any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

“ The District of All Hallows, Twickenham, being:—

“ All that part of the Parish of Twickenham, in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London, which is bounded upon the east by the New Parish of Saint Stephen, East Twickenham, upon the north partly by the New Parish of All Souls, Saint Margaret's on Thames, and partly by the New Parish of Saint John, Isleworth, upon the west partly by the New Parish of Saint Philip and Saint James, Whitton, and partly by the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Twickenham, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south-east, by an imaginary line commencing upon

the boundary which divides the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Twickenham, from the said Parish of Twickenham, at the centre of the bridge leading into Marsh Farm Road across the Windsor line of the Western Section of the Southern Railway and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 29 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries London Road across the said line of railway and extending thence north-westward along the middle of London Road for a distance of 5½ chains or thereabouts to the centre of Cole Bridge which carries such road across the River Crane and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the River Crane for a distance of 24 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Twickenham, from the said New Parish of Saint Stephen, East Twickenham.”

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbent of the Parish of Twickenham out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme

for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the New Parish (sometime Particular District) of Saint James, Shirley, and partly out of the Parish of Millbrook, both in the County of Southampton and in the Diocese of Winchester:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of Saint James, Shirley, and the said Parish of Millbrook are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said New Parish of Saint James, Shirley, and of the said Parish of Millbrook which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter III:

"And whereas there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church within and for the said proposed separate District:

"And whereas the contributors of the said capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church have nominated to us the Bishop of Winchester for the time being as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Cyril Forster, Bishop of Winchester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said New Parish of Saint James, Shirley, and of the said Parish of Millbrook, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your

Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Peter, Maybush, Southampton.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of such New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Cyril Forster, Bishop of Winchester, and his successors for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Peter, Maybush, Southampton, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the New Parish (sometime Particular District) of Saint James, Shirley, and of the Parish of Millbrook, both in the County of Southampton and in the Diocese of Winchester, which, taken together, are bounded upon the north-west partly by the Parish of Nursling and partly by the New Parish of Rownhams, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the east, upon the south and upon the south-west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Rownhams from the said New Parish of Saint James, Shirley, at a point in the centre of Aldermoor Bridge which carries Aldermoor Road across Tanners Brook and extending thence generally southward along the middle of Tanners Brook (thereby following for a short distance the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint James, Shirley, from the said Parish of Millbrook) for a distance of 1 mile and 60 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge or culvert which carries Oakley Road across such brook and extending thence generally north-westward along the middle of Oakley Road for a distance of 35½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Wimpson Road and Mansel Road and extending thence generally north-westward along the middle of Mansel Road for a distance of 70 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Brown Hill upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Millbrook from the said Parish of Nursling."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such

Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Winchester.

“ And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship:

“ And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall

“ And whereas the contributors of the said capital sum of £5,000 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church have nominated to us the Right Honourable Thomas Walker Hobart Viscount Caldecote, the Reverend Herbert William Hinde, of Oak Hill Cottage, Southgate, in the said County of Middlesex, Clerk in Holy Orders and a Prebendary of the Cathedral Church of Saint Paul in London, Robert Abercromby Gordon, K.C., of Number 1, Temple Gardens, in the City of London, Esquire, the Reverend Bryan William Isaac, of 7, Malcolm Road, Wimbledon, in the County of Surrey Clerk in Holy Orders and the Reverend Alfred St. John Thorpe of The Vicarage, Watford, in the County of Hertford, Clerk in Holy Orders and an Honorary Canon of the Cathedral Church of Rochester (being the Patronage Trustees of the Church Pastoral Aid Society), as the persons to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District, and when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof, should be assigned:

" The District of Saint Matthew, Muswell Hill, being:—

" All that part of the New Parish (sometime Chapelry District) of Saint James, Muswell Hill, in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London, which is bounded upon the west partly by the New Parish of All Saints, East Finchley, partly by the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Finchley, and partly by the New Parish of Christ Church, North End, Finchley, upon the north east by the Parish of Friern Barnet, upon the east partly by the said Parish of Friern Barnet, partly by the District Chapelry of Saint Peter Le Poer, Friern Barnet, and partly by the New Parish of Saint Andrew, Alexandra Park, all in the said County and Diocese and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Alexandra Park, from the said New Parish of Saint James, Muswell Hill, at the junction of Colney Hatch Lane with Page's Lane, and extending thence westward along the middle of Page's Lane for a distance of 20 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Tetherdown and extending thence southward along the middle of Tetherdown for a distance of 1 $\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to its junction with Burlington Road, and extending thence westward along the middle of Burlington Road and in a straight line in continuation thereof (thereby crossing the Tollington School Playing Field) for a distance in all of 23 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint James, Muswell Hill, from the said New Parish of All Saints, East Finchley."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbent of the New Parish of Saint James, Muswell Hill, out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patron and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 108, and of the Act of the 21st and 22nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 57, which Acts are known as "The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts," and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 23rd day of November, 1939, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 108, and of the Act of the 21st and 22nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 57, which Acts are known as 'The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts,' and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme relating to the Benefice of Enfield, in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London:

" Whereas the annual value of the said Benefice of Enfield has been improved under and by virtue of certain sales and also of certain leases of glebe lands belonging to the said Benefice which sales and leases were executed under the authority of the said Acts, with the concurrence of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, by former Vicars or Incumbents of the said Benefice of Enfield:

" And whereas the proceeds of the said sales have from time to time as the same have been received by us been invested in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Acts, and the investments so made include (inter alia) a sum of £2,000 Local Loans £3 per centum per annum Stock, a sum of £3,429 1s. 8d. £3 10s. per centum per annum Conversion Stock, a sum of £5,522 3s. India £3 per centum per annum Stock, and a sum of £8,984 2s. 11d. £3 per centum per annum Redemption Stock, which sums of Stock are now held by us in trust to pay to the Vicar or Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice the annual interest or dividends from time to time arising or accruing therefrom or thereupon, but subject nevertheless to the provisions contained in the said Acts and Measure with respect to making a certain portion of the improved value arising to the said Benefice from the said sales and leases payable to us for the benefit of our Common Fund to be applied as in the said Acts mentioned:

" And whereas the said leases of glebe lands belonging to the said Benefice include the leases described in the Schedule hereunto annexed:

" And whereas the improvement in the annual value of the said Benefice arising from or by means of the said sales and leases exceeds the annual sum of £800, and after the appropriation hereinafter recommended to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of our Common Fund, the average annual income of the said Benefice will still be in excess of £600:

" And whereas the said Benefice of Enfield is now vacant:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme (first) the said sum of £2,000 Local Loans £3 per centum per annum Stock, the said sum of £3,429 1s. 8d. £3 10s. per centum per annum Conversion Stock, a sum of £1,333 6s. 8d. India £3 per centum per annum Stock (being a portion of the aforesaid sum of the same Stock) and a sum of £6,666 13s. 4d. £3 per centum per annum Redemption Stock (being a portion of the aforesaid sum of the same Stock) shall cease to be held by us for the benefit of the Vicar or Incumbent of the said Benefice of Enfield and shall be held by us for the benefit of our Common Fund to be applied as in the said Acts mentioned, and (secondly) all those the lands, tenements and

hereditaments described in the said schedule hereunder written, subject to all leases, tenancies or agreements affecting the same, and with the benefits of the rents thereby reserved and the covenants and conditions therein contained, shall be transferred to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and shall become and be absolutely vested in us for the benefit of our Common Fund to be applied as in the said Acts mentioned.

" And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or Measure or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England.

" THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

(a) In any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave;

(b) In the said Churchyard, in any grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed of the body of any person for whom or of any member of a family for which such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

THE CORONERS (AMENDMENT) ACT, 1926.

#### *Order for the Alteration of Coroners' Districts.*

Whereas by an Order made by one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State on the third day of November, 1930, in pursuance of the power vested in him by section 12 of the Coroners (Amendment) Act, 1926, the County of London was divided into six coroners' districts as set out in the schedule to such order.

And whereas by an Order made by one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State on the sixth day of August, 1932, in pursuance of the said power alterations were made in the area of two of the said districts.

And whereas by section 4 of the said Act it is provided that the right of any person having power to appoint a franchise coroner shall cease on the next vacancy in the office which occurs after the passing of that Act and that for all purposes relating to coroners the area in which the franchise coroner had jurisdiction shall thereupon, if and so far as it is not situated in a borough the Council of which has power to appoint a borough coroner, be merged in the County.

And whereas on the tenth day of May, 1939, a vacancy occurred in the office of franchise coroner for the Liberty of the Tower in the County of London.

And whereas the London County Council has, pursuant to section 12 of the Coroners (Amendment) Act, 1926, and to the Coroners (Orders as to Districts) Rules, 1927, submitted to the Secretary of State a draft Order providing for the alteration of the existing division of the County of London into coroners' districts so as to reduce the number of such districts to five and to include in one of the districts the area which, on the occurrence of the said vacancy, merged in the said County.

Now, therefore, I, the undersigned, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of the power vested in me by section 12 of the Act above recited, do hereby order that the existing division of the County of London into coroners' districts shall be altered and that the said County shall be divided into five coroners' districts which shall be named and constituted as set out in the schedule hereto and substituted for the existing districts, and that the area in which the franchise coroner for the Liberty of the Tower had jurisdiction shall form part of the eastern coroner's district.

This Order shall come into operation on the first day of January, 1940.

As a result of the coolness and efficiency of her Chief Officer, "Lochgoil" was eventually beached by tugs.

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Towards daybreak, "Goodwood" was struck without warning by an enemy torpedo. Both the Master's knees were broken by the explosion. With the words "Look after yourself, never mind me" he refused the Second Officer's help. The Chief Officer, whose heel was broken, threw out lifebelts to the crew. The Second Officer saw to the lowering of a lifeboat, which could not be brought alongside. The Second Officer, therefore, dived from the lifeboat to fetch the Master from the bridge, where he was lying wounded. He lost his lifebelt, and being in difficulties returned to the boat. The Chief Officer then called for volunteers to go with the Second Officer to rescue the Master. The ship was still under way and about to settle. Two able seamen came forward and the three of them carried the Master to the side, lowered him carefully into the water, and swam with him to the lifeboat, which was still towing at an angle from the ship.
