“And whereas we are of opinion that in consideration of the arduous nature of their duties ratings employed as Sweepers in these turrets should be included in the ratings entitled to payment of the allowance:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction payment of Tropical Allowance at the rate of 1s. 6d. a day to Turret Sweepers (two per turret) when employed for a full day in the turrets of 8-inch and 6-inch gun Cruisers.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.
