BY THE KING.

A PROCLAMATION DIRECTING THAT CERTAIN BRITISH SUBJECTS SHALL BECOME LIABLE UNDER THE NATIONAL SERVICE (ARMED FORCES) ACT, 1939, TO BE CALLED UP FOR SERVICE IN THE ARMED FORCES OF THE CROWN.

GEORGE R.I.

Whereas by the National Service (Armed Forces) Act, 1939 (2 & 3 Geo. 6. c. 81) it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for Us by Proclamation to direct that, save as therein otherwise provided, all Our male subjects who at the date of Our Proclamation have attained such age, not being less than eighteen years, as We may specify by such Proclamation and have not attained such greater age, not being more than forty-one years, as We may so specify, and who at the date of Our Proclamation are within Great Britain, or not having been in Great Britain on that date subsequently enter it, shall, on the date of Our Proclamation or on the date on which they first enter Great Britain after the date of Our Proclamation as the case may be, become liable under the said Act to be called up for service in Our Armed Forces:

And whereas it is further enacted by the said Act that no person shall be liable thereunder to be called up for service who—

(a) is a person not ordinarily resident in Great Britain who is, under the provisions of any Act in force in any part of Our dominions outside Great Britain, a national or a citizen of that part within the meaning of that Act, or is a person born or domiciled in any such

part of Our dominions or in a British protectorate, a mandated territory, or any other country or territory being a country or territory under Our protection or suzerainty; or

(b) is a person employed in the service of the Government of a part of Our dominions outside Great Britain, or in the service of the Government of a British protectorate, a mandated territory or some other country or territory which is under Our protection or suzerainty, being a person whose presence in Great Britain is occasioned solely by his employment in that service; or

(c) is a member of any of Our Armed Forces; or

(d) is undergoing training as a cadet at the Royal Military Academy, the Royal Military College, or the Royal Air Force College; or

(e) is a man in holy orders or a regular minister of any religious denomination; or

(f) is the subject of an order or inquisition under the Lunacy and Mental Treatment Acts, 1890 to 1930, or is being detained in pursuance of section twenty-five of the Lunacy Act, 1890, or as a criminal lunatic or in pursuance of an order made under the Criminal Lunatics Act, 1884, or is undergoing treatment as a temporary patient under section five of the Mental Treatment Act, 1930, or is a person placed in an institution or a certified house, or under guardianship, under section three of the Mental Deficiency Act, 1913, or is the subject of an order under section six, eight, or nine of that Act, or is under supervision provided under paragraph

(b) of section thirty of that Act or is an inmate of a home approved under section fifty of that Act, or is the subject of a notification under subsection (2) of section fifty-one of that Act; or

(g) is the subject of an order or warrant for his detention or custody under the Lunacy (Scotland) Acts, 1857 to 1919, or is being entertained and kept in an asylum in pursuance of section fifteen of the Lunacy (Scotland) Act, 1866, or is a person for whose safe custody during Our pleasure We are authorised to give order or is a prisoner whom the Secretary of State or the Prisons Department for Scotland has, in pursuance of any Act, directed to be removed to a criminal lunatic asylum or to the criminal lunatic department of Perth prison or to an asylum, or is a person placed in an institution or a certified house or under guardianship under section four of the Mental Deficiency and Lunacy (Scotland) Act, 1913, or is the subject of an order under section seven, nine, or ten of that Act; or

(h) is certified by a local authority, as defined by the Blind Persons Acts, 1920 and 1938, to be registered as a blind person under arrangements made by the authority under those Acts.

And whereas it is also enacted by the said Act that any person who at the commencement of that Act was registered under the Military Training Act, 1939, or who was required to be so registered at any time before the commencement of the National Service (Armed Forces) Act, 1939, shall be liable to be called up for service under the last mentioned Act notwithstanding that he may not be so liable by virtue of any Proclamation made under that Act:

And whereas by Our Proclamations dated the first day of October, 1939, and the first day of December, 1939, We did in pursuance of the said Act direct, declare and proclaim that certain of Our male subjects therein mentioned were liable under the said Act to be called up for service in Our Armed Forces:

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 27th day of October, 1939, and made under the powers conferred by section 23 of the said Act, the provisions of the said Act were, subject to the modifications and adaptations therein specified, extended to the Isle of Man:

Now, therefore, We do in pursuance of the said Act hereby direct, declare and proclaim that with the exceptions hereinbefore mentioned all Our male subjects who on the date of this Our Proclamation shall have attained the age of nineteen years and shall not have attained the age of twenty-eight years and who are at the date of this Our Proclamation within Great Britain, or who not having been in Great Britain at that date subsequently enter it, are, on the date hereof or on the date on which they first subsequently enter Great Britain after the date hereof, by this Our Proclamation liable under the said Act to be called up for service in Our Armed Forces.

And We do hereby declare that in this Proclamation the expression "Great Britain" includes the Isle of Man.

And We do hereby order Our Minister of Labour and National Service and Our

Lieutenant Governor of the Isle of Man to give all necessary directions herein accordingly.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace this First day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and forty and in the Fourth year of Our Reign.

The KING has been graciously pleased to give orders for the following appointment to the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire:—

To be an Additional Officer of the Civil Division of the said Most Excellent Order:—

Barnett Mackenzie Copeland, Esq., Chief Officer, s.s. "Athenia" (Donaldson Atlantic Line Limited, Glasgow).

s.s. "Athenia" was torpedoed by an enemy submarine about dusk. In the gathering darkness some 750 survivors, mainly passengers, a number of whom were seriously injured, had to be put into the twenty-six lifeboats and removed from the ship, which was steadily settling. There were only seven sets of davits. There was some wind and sea. On being hit she at once heeled to an angle of some 8°, which gradually increased to 12°. This greatly added to the difficulty of getting the boats away; but all were filled and sent off well within an hour without mishap of any kind. The Officers and some of the crew remained on board and the Chief Officer visited some of the passenger accommodation in which he was convinced a shell had exploded. The many bodies lying about were completely blackened but he examined them to make sure that life was extinct. The Officers and the remaining hands were then fetched away in a motor-boat.

The Chief Officer was responsible for all the arrangements and preparations, and the actual loading and getting away of the twenty-six boats. The fact that this was done in the darkness without any kind of a hitch or loss reflects great credit on his powers of organisation and command.

He was in due course picked up and taken aboard one of H.M. Ships. He then discovered that a woman, who should have been in his boat, was missing. Earlier in the day he had himself taken her to the sick bay unconscious. After the explosion he had sent two men to help her, but they had not been able to do so. He informed the Captain of the warship, who gave him a boat in which he and the Boatswain and one Able Seaman went back to "Athenia". The woman was found in the sick bay, still unconscious. The Chief Officer examined the condition of "Athenia" for some quarter of an hour and then took back the rescued woman to the warship. Shortly afterwards "Athenia" sank.

The Commanding Officer of the warship reports that the Chief Officer, by his inspiration and example, did much to ensure the very high standard of courage and morale among the rescued.

William Harvey, Boatswain, s.s. "Athenia" (Donaldson Atlantic Line Limited, Glasgow).

After the torpedoing of s.s. "Athenia" Mr. Harvey shewed outstanding coolness and efficiency on getting the boats away on the promenade deck, and setting a high example to the other men in this arduous and responsible work. On being hit "Athenia" at once heeled to an angle of some 8°, which gradually increased to 12°. This greatly added to his difficulties but all were filled and sent off well within an hour without mishap of any kind.

He also voluntarily returned to "Athenia" with the Chief Officer to rescue an unconscious woman who had by mistake been left in the hospital quarters. Shortly afterwards "Athenia" sank.

ROYAL AIR FORCE.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve of the undermentioned awards in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:—

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross.

- (1) Squadron Leader (Acting Wing Commander) John Francis GRIFFITHS (24037).

During December, 1939, in spite of adverse weather and strong enemy opposition by anti-aircraft guns and enemy fighters, this officer led his squadron of 12 aircraft, and carried out a successful reconnaissance over strong naval enemy forces. The determination with which he pressed home this reconnaissance enabled him to bring back information of vital importance. In the course of this operation his formation accounted for no less than 5 enemy aircraft. By his personal example and thoroughness, he has been largely instrumental in maintaining his unit's high standard of efficiency.

- (2) Squadron Leader Harry BROADHURST, A.F.C. (24035).

This officer was in command of the duty Squadron at an East coast aerodrome during November, 1939, when he was informed of an approaching enemy aircraft. He stated that the weather conditions were unfit for formation-flying and yet, despite the rain and clouds at ground-level, he took off alone, flying blind by means of instruments. Emerging above the cloud and endeavouring to clear an iced-up windscreen, he sighted the enemy aircraft. Squadron Leader Broadhurst attacked and caused it to turn on its side and dive vertically into cloud close to sea level. In following it down he narrowly escaped from crashing into the sea. On his return weather conditions had not improved, and it was only at the third attempt that he was able to regain his aerodrome.

- (3) Pilot Officer Kenneth Neil GRAY (40342).
(4) Pilot Officer Frank Hugh LONG (36190).

Pilot Officer Gray and Pilot Officer Long were respectively Pilot and Navigator on a night reconnaissance flight over enemy territory during November, 1939. During the operations a snowstorm was encountered and

the aircraft became badly iced-up, in addition to being subjected to anti-aircraft fire. Nevertheless the reconnaissance flight was continued but it was not found possible to reach the objective as eventually weather conditions rendered the aircraft practically impossible to control, the upper surface of one wing and half that of the other wing having been stripped of fabric and one "flap" jammed down. The wireless apparatus also failed. The journey home involved a flight of 342 miles over the sea during very heavy rainstorms and it was mainly due to the skill, courage and splendid team work of Pilot Officer GRAY and Pilot Officer LONG that the aircraft and crew were brought safely back.

- (5) Pilot Officer Selby Roger HENDERSON (40826).

During November, 1939, when pilot of a reconnaissance aircraft on duty over the North Sea, Pilot Officer Henderson encountered two large enemy flying boats. He engaged the leading boat with the utmost resolution; bursts were seen to enter the engines and after-part of the flying boat's hull, the enemy rear gunner was incapacitated and eventually the flying boat went down partially out of control. Pilot Officer Henderson then attacked the second enemy aircraft with equal determination and silenced its fire before exhausting all his ammunition.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Medal.

- (1) 563040 Corporal Alexander BICKERSTAFF.

During operations over enemy territory in December, 1939, this airman, as tail gunner, maintained a steady and accurate fire at all enemy aircraft that came within range. He himself shot down one Messerschmidt. This aircraft engaged the leader's aircraft at extremely close range. Corporal Bickerstaff quickly brought his guns to bear and directed a cool and accurate fire, his tracer being seen to pass directly through the pilot's position before the enemy aircraft burst into flames and crashed into the sea.

- (2) 562595 Corporal Cedric Charles PETTIT.

During operations over enemy territory in December, 1939, this airman, when acting as tail gunner in the leading aircraft of the second section, engaged all enemy aircraft that came within range. He brought a well-directed cross fire to bear on aircraft attacking the leading formation, in addition to engaging the enemy during their attacks on another section. He remained absolutely steady throughout the action, his standard of fire discipline being of the highest order.

- (3) 521256 Leading Aircraftman John James COPLEY.

Leading Aircraftman Copley was the tail air gunner in an aircraft taking part in a raid over enemy territory during December, 1939. When his aircraft became isolated from the formation and was attacked by an enemy fighter aircraft from astern he opened fire at a range of approximately 150-200 yards, subsequently getting in at least two bursts of 20 rounds each at point blank range, causing the aircraft to pull into a

climbing turn, stall and dive out of control. During this engagement Leading Aircraftman Copley's aircraft was hit in numerous vital places by enemy bullets, and yet despite the fact that he himself was injured by the gunfire from the attacking aircraft, he maintained control of his fire and manipulation of the gun turret, setting a very high standard for other air gunners.
