The Commanding Officer of the warship reports that the Chief Officer, by his inspiration and example, did much to ensure the very high standard of courage and morale among the rescued.

William Harvey, Boatswain, s.s. "Athenia" (Donaldson Atlantic Line Limited, Glasgow).

After the torpedoing of s.s. "Athenia" Mr. Harvey shewed outstanding coolness and efficiency on getting the boats away on the promenade deck, and setting a high example to the other men in this arduous and responsible work. On being hit "Athenia" at once heeled to an angle of some 8°, which gradually increased to 12°. This greatly added to his difficulties but all were filled and sent off well within an hour without mishap of any kind.

He also voluntarily returned to "Athenia" with the Chief Officer to rescue an unconscious woman who had by mistake been left in the hospital quarters. Shortly afterwards "Athenia" sank.
