“And whereas we consider that this Officer should be retained on the Active List of the Royal Navy for a further year whilst holding the appointment of Director of Education Department, Admiralty:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the retention of the said Instructor Captain Arthur

Edward Hall, C.B., C.B.E., A.R.C.S., on the Active List of the Royal Navy until the 1st February, 1941.

" And whereas it is now necessary that certain ratings serving in Your Majesty's Navy during hostilities should undergo training for the duties of Rating Observer without having first qualified as Air Gunner, and we are of opinion that such ratings should receive an appropriate allowance during the period of their training:

" We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty by Your Order in Council may be graciously pleased to sanction, with retrospective effect, payment of an allowance of 2s. 9d. a day to naval ratings while undergoing training for Rating Observer, provided that no other non-substantive pay or allowance is issued concurrently.

of the Parish of Thornton both in the County of Leicester and in the Diocese of Leicester:

"Whereas it has been represented to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and it appears to us to be desirable that the boundaries of the said Parishes should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Benefices of Markfield and Thornton are now full, the Reverend Hubert Woodall Bevan being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Markfield and the Reverend David Morley Sale being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Thornton and the said Hubert Woodall Bevan and David Morley Sale have signified their consent to the proposals hereinafter mentioned by signing this Scheme:

"And whereas the Diocesan Committee of the Diocese of Leicester appointed pursuant to the first section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have by a Resolution passed at a meeting of the said Diocesan Committee held on the 13th day of February, 1939, signified their consent to the alteration of boundaries herein proposed:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Cyril Charles Bowman, Bishop of Leicester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said Parish of Markfield and of the said Parish of Thornton shall be altered so that all that part of the said Parish of Thornton which is comprised within the Civil Parish of Stanton under Bardon and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said Parish of Markfield.

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 14th day of December, 1939, in the words and figures following that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the disunion of the Benefice of Brighton (being a Vicarage) with West Blatchington (being a Rectory) in the County of Sussex and in the Diocese of Chichester and the constitution of the separate Benefices of Brighton and West Blatchington:

"Whereas by deed dated the 1st day of August, 1744, the Right Reverend Matthias, Bishop of Chichester, with the consents therein recited did by his ordinary and episcopal authority pronounce and decree the Vicarage of Brighton and the Rectory of West Blatchington in the said County and in the said Diocese to be for ever united, annexed, consolidated, incorporated and appropriated into one Benefice:

"And whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Chichester, pursuant to the said Union of Benefices Measures to inquire into and report upon the disunion of the said Benefice of Brighton with West Blatchington duly made their Report to the said George, Bishop of Chichester, and therein recommended such disunion and the terms for effecting the same and the said Bishop of Chichester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, have prepared this Scheme for the disunion of the said Benefice of Brighton with West Blatchington based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Brighton with West Blatchington is now full, the Reverend Geoffrey Hodgson Warde being the present Incumbent thereof:

"And whereas the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Brighton with West Blatchington belongs solely to one patron;

" Now therefore we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, with the consent of the said George, Bishop of Chichester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

" 1. That upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Brighton with West Blatchington occurring after the day of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the present union of the said Benefice of Brighton and the said Benefice of West Blatchington in the said Benefice of Brighton with West Blatchington shall be dissolved and the Vicarage of Brighton and the Rectory of West Blatchington shall each become and shall thereafter be a separate Benefice with Cure of Souls.

" 2. That the limits of the Parish to belong or be assigned to the said Vicarage of Brighton so constituted a separate Benefice shall be conterminous with the boundaries of the Parish of Brighton.

" 3. That the Parish Church at Brighton shall be the Parish Church of the said Benefice of Brighton.

" 4. That the Parsonage House at Brighton of the said Benefice of Brighton with West Blatchington shall belong to the Benefice of Brighton.

" 5. That the limits of the Parish to belong or be assigned to the said Rectory of West Blatchington shall be conterminous with the boundaries of the Parish of West Blatchington.

" 6. That the Parish Church at West Blatchington shall be the Parish Church of the said Benefice of West Blatchington.

" 7. That the endowments and property of the said Benefice of Brighton with West Blatchington shall be divided, appropriated and distributed as follows, that is to say, there shall be assigned and annexed to the said Benefice of West Blatchington and vested in the Incumbent thereof and his successors (a) a capital sum of £51 16s. 5d. being part of a larger capital sum now held by the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty in trust for the said Benefice of Brighton with West Blatchington and (b) the following sums of stock now held by the said Governors in trust for the said Benefice of Brighton with West Blatchington, that is to say, the sum of £173 2s. 5d. £3 per cent. "Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 27th day of August, 1864, and published in the London Gazette on the 30th day of the same month, a District Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Leonard, situate at Broad Blunsdon in the Parish of Highworth, in the said County of Wilts and at that time in the Diocese of Gloucester and Bristol but now in the said Diocese of Bristol, and the said District Chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Broad Blunsdon':

"And whereas the said District Chapelry of Broad Blunsdon has, under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become a New Parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above-mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Broad Blunsdon should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"All that portion of the Parish of Cricklade Saint Sampson, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon the south by the Parish of Blunsdon Saint Andrew, in the said County and Diocese, upon the north-east partly by the said New Parish of Broad Blunsdon and partly by the Parish of Latton, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing at the point in the middle of

the River Ray near Seven Bridges where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Latton from the said Parish of Cricklade Saint Sampson diverges south-eastward from following the middle of the said river and extending thence generally southward along the middle of the said river for a distance of 1 mile and 50 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Cricklade Saint Sampson from the said Parish of Blunsdon Saint Andrew."

The Medal of the Military Division of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, for Meritorious Service:—

No. M.T. 507836 Lance-Naik Mathura Lal Sah, No. 2 Motor Ambulance Unit, Royal Indian Army Service Corps.

On the 31st May, 1939, Lance-Naik Mathura Lal Sah was off duty and walking along the road by the side of the lake at Naini Tal when his attention was attracted by a crowd of people at the edge of the lake who were shouting. He saw three men (afterwards ascertained to be Police Recruits) in the water, about 15 yards from the bank. One man managed to gain the steps leading down to the lake, but the other two were obviously in difficulties and unable to reach the shore.

Without hesitation Lance-Naik Mathura Lal Sah thereupon plunged, fully clothed, into the lake and succeeded in bringing one man to land. He then dived in again and brought the second man in; the latter was exhausted and Lance-Naik Mathura Lal Sah had to revive him with artificial respiration.

An enquiry was subsequently held by P. J. Moore, Esq., Sub-Divisional Magistrate, Naini Tal, from the findings of which,

it is apparent that Lance-Naik Mathura Lal Sah acted with great gallantry and without regard for his personal safety. The Naini Tal lake is not only deep but is notorious for a thick growth of weeds near the banks which impede a swimmer. These facts render the gallantry of Lance-Naik Mathura Lal Sah all the more conspicuous and worthy of recognition. There is no doubt that one or both men would have been drowned, not being swimmers, had he not effected their rescue so promptly.

KAISAR-I-HIND MEDAL.

ROYAL WARRANT.

GEORGE THE SIXTH, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, to all to whom these Presents shall come:

Greeting!

Whereas Her late Majesty Queen Victoria did by Warrant under Her Royal Sign Manual, bearing date the tenth day of April, one thousand nine hundred, in the sixty-third year of Her Reign, institute and create a decoration to be styled "The Kaisar-i-Hind Medal for Public Service in India," and did make certain Rules and Ordinances for the government of the same:

And whereas by the said Royal Warrant power was reserved to Us of annulling and altering the said Rules and Ordinances or any part thereof by a Notification under Our Royal Sign Manual:

And whereas alterations and amendments in the said Rules and Ordinances were made by His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh by Warrant under His Royal Sign Manual bearing date the eighth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and one and by His late Majesty King George the Fifth by Warrants under His Royal Sign Manual bearing date the ninth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, and the second day of November, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, and by Us under our Royal Sign Manual bearing date the twenty-fourth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight:

And whereas We desire to make certain further alterations and amendments in the said Rules and Ordinances:

Now know Ye that We do by these Presents for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, make the following alterations and amendments in the said Rules and Ordinances, that is to say:—

1. For the Third Rule the following shall be substituted: "Thirdly—It is ordained that there shall be three grades of the Decoration, to be styled respectively 'The Kaisar-i-Hind Gold Medal for Public Service in India,' 'The Kaisar-i-Hind Silver Medal for Public Service in India,' 'The Kaisar-i-Hind Bronze Medal for Public Service in India.'"

2. In the Fourth Rule, for the words "Medal of the First Class" shall be substituted the words "Gold Medal."

3. In the Fifth Rule, for the words "Medal of the Second and Third Class" shall be substituted the words "Silver and Bronze Medals."

4. In the Sixth Rule, for the words "in Gold for the First Class, in Silver for the Second Class and in Bronze for the Third Class" shall be substituted the words "in Gold, in Silver or in Bronze."

5. For the Seventh Rule the following shall be substituted: "Seventhly—It is ordained that the names of those persons to whom one of these Medals may be awarded shall be published in the Gazette of India and that a register of such names shall be kept by such person as Our Viceroy may direct.

6. In the Ninth Rule, for the words "Medal of the First Class" and "Medals of the Second or the Third Class" appearing in both clauses shall be substituted "Gold Medal" and "Silver and Bronze Medals."

NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE ACT, 1936.
