The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday, 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

### HUDDERSFIELD.

Whereas the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Huddersfield (hereinafter called the Corporation) have made application to the Minister of Health for the issue of a Provisional Order under Sections 297 and 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, partially to repeal, alter or amend the Huddersfield Corporation Act, 1937, hereinafter called the "local Act", so as:—

(1) To extend until the 31st day of December, 1943, or the expiration of a period of three years from the termination of the present war (whichever may be the later) the time limited by section 16 of the local Act for the compulsory purchase of such of the lands and interests in land as the Corporation are by sections 14 and 15 of the local Act authorised to acquire but have not yet acquired for the following purposes, viz.:—

(a) the construction of the waterworks numbered 1 to 11 (inclusive) authorised by sub-section (1) of section 24 of the local Act;

(b) the construction of the subsidiary works authorised by sub-section (2) of the last mentioned section; and

(c) the protection of the aforementioned works, the other waterworks acquired by the Corporation under the local Act and for other the purposes of the water undertaking.

(2) To extend until the 31st day of December, 1950, or the expiration of a period of ten years from the termination of the present war (whichever may be the later) the time limited by section 29 of the local Act for the construction of the waterworks referred to in sub-paragraphs (a) and (b) of the immediately preceding paragraph.

(3) For the several purposes of the Application or for purposes connected with, incidental to, or consequent on those purposes to make any such alteration or amendment of the said Local Act, or of any other Local Act or of any Act confirming a Provisional Order made in pursuance of any of the sanitary Acts or of the Public Health Act, 1875, and in force in the said Borough as may be necessary or desirable:

And whereas it is proposed that a Provisional Order should be issued in compliance with the said Application;

Where such net annual value is above fifty pounds at a rate per centum not exceeding ten pounds.

(2) To empower the Minister of Health in certain circumstances by Order to vary by way of increase or decrease the rates and charges for the supply of water and to alter the basis of such rates and charges.

(3) To empower the Council to charge for each supply of water by meter a minimum sum not exceeding fifteen shillings per quarter and

to charge such sum as they think fit in respect of every fixed bath having a capacity in excess of fifty gallons.

(4) To give the Council within the limits of supply all the powers of an urban authority under Part IV of the Public Health Act, 1936, as if the limits of supply were the district.

(5) To make further provision in regard to the Council's water undertaking and in particular—

(i) to prescribe the basis on which two or more houses or buildings in one occupation shall be assessed for water rates;

(ii) to empower the Council within their district to collect the water rates or charges with the general rate;

(iii) to make further provision with regard to the recovery of water rate from persons removed from premises supplied with water by the Council;

(iv) to extend the powers of the Council to make byelaws for preventing waste of water;

(v) to make provision as to the maintenance of common pipes, as to the connection and repair of communication pipes and as to the breaking up of streets in connection with the maintenance of pipes or apparatus;

(vi) to prescribe penalties for interfering with valves and other apparatus;

(vii) to enlarge the powers of the Council in regard to the inspection of premises for the purpose of ascertaining whether there is any waste or misuse of water;

(viii) to provide for the breaking up in certain circumstances of streets forming the boundary of the limits of supply;

(ix) to empower the Council to require stop-cocks to be fitted in communication pipes;

(x) to empower the Council to require cisterns to be provided for high level supplies;

(xi) to make provision as to the removal of meters and fittings;

(xii) to empower the Council to require that water used for a swimming bath or bathing pool shall be taken by measure;

(xiii) to authorise the Council to make allowance by way of discount for prompt payment of water rates;

(xiv) to enable the Council to provide and maintain meters to measure water or to detect waste;

(xv) to make provision as to the recovery summarily of sums due for fittings, etc.;

(xvi) to make provision with regard to the authentication and service of notices and demands, arbitration and the recovery of demands and penalties.
