PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1935 (33 & 34 Vict. c. 52; 36 & 37 Vict. c. 60; 58 & 59 Vict. c. 33; 6 Edw. 7. c. 15; 22 & 23 Geo. 5. c. 39; 25 & 26 Geo. 5. c. 25), it was, amongst other things, enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in, or suspected of being in, the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions; exceptions and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas a Treaty was signed on the 31st day of March, 1873, between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and His late Majesty the King of Denmark for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, which Treaty applies to Iceland:

And whereas the said Treaty was duly ratified (See S.R. & O. Revised 1904, V.):

And whereas under the provisions of Article 3 of the Supplementary Convention signed on the 25th day of October, 1938, between His Majesty and His Majesty the King of Iceland and Denmark for the mutual extradition of criminals, the terms whereof were recited in the Iceland (Extradition) Order in Council, 1939, and are as follows:—

His Majesty The King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the

Seas, Emperor of India (hereinafter referred to as His Majesty The King and Emperor), and His Majesty The King of Iceland and Denmark,

Desiring to make further provision for the reciprocal extradition of fugitive criminals, have resolved to conclude a Supplementary Convention to this end, and for this purpose have appointed as their plenipotentiaries:

His Majesty The King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India:

For Great Britain and Northern Ireland:

The Rt. Hon. The Viscount Halifax, K.G., G.C.S.I., G.C.I.E., T.D., His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs;

His Majesty The King of Iceland and Denmark:

For Iceland:

Count Eduard Reventlow, His Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary in London;

Who, having communicated to each other their full powers found in good and due form, have agreed as follows:—

## ARTICLE 1.

From the date of the coming into force of the present Convention Article 1 of the Extradition Treaty signed at Copenhagen on the 31st March, 1873, shall be amended by the addition of the following clause:—

"Extradition may also be granted at the discretion of the High Contracting Party applied to in respect of any other crime or offence for which, according to the laws of both of the High Contracting Parties for the time being in force, the grant may be made."

## ARTICLE 2.

The foregoing amendment shall apply to extradition proceedings between Iceland on the

one hand, and, on the other hand, the following territories of His Majesty The King and Emperor, that is to say, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, Newfoundland, British Colonies, British Protectorates to which the Extradition Treaty of the 31st March, 1873, applies, and mandated territories to which the said Treaty has been or may be extended, and in respect of which the mandate is exercised by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

#### ARTICLE 3.

The High Contracting Parties agree that His Majesty The King and Emperor may accede to the present Convention in respect of any other Member of the British Commonwealth of Nations, whose Government may desire that such accession be effected, by a notice given to that effect by the appropriate diplomatic representative of His Majesty The King and Emperor at Copenhagen. From the date that such notice comes into force the amendment set forth in Article 1 shall apply to extradition proceedings between Iceland on the one hand, and, on the other, the territory of the Member of the Commonwealth concerned.

Any notice given under the first paragraph of this Article in respect of any Member of the British Commonwealth of Nations may include any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty The King and Emperor and is exercised by the Government of the Member concerned.

#### ARTICLE 4.

The present Convention shall be ratified. The ratifications shall be exchanged at London as soon as possible.

#### ARTICLE 5.

The present Convention shall enter into force three months after the exchange of ratifications, and shall have the same duration as the Extradition Treaty of the 31st March, 1873.

In faith whereof the above-named plenipotentiaries have signed the present Convention and have affixed thereto their seals.

Supplementary Convention of the 25th October, 1938.

This Order may be cited as the "Iceland (Extradition: New Zealand) Order in Council, 1940".

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Supplementary Scheme bearing date the 23rd day of November, 1939, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Supplementary Scheme under the 11th Section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, for making certain alterations in the provisions of the Order in Council dated the 21st day of March 1929, and published in the London Gazette on the 26th day of the same month (hereinafter called the original Order) for effecting the union of the Benefice of Itchen Abbas and the Benefice of Avington, both in the County of Southampton and in the Diocese of Winchester:

"Whereas by Clauses 3 and 4 of the original Order it was directed that upon the union of the said Benefices taking effect (1) the Parsonage House belonging to the said Benefice of Avington should become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and (2) the whole of the Itchen Abbas Parsonage House Fund in the hands of the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty, being or representing the proceeds of the sale of the Parsonage House formerly belonging to the said Benefice of Itchen Abbas excepting a sum to be determined by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in consultation with the Bishop of Winchester, but not to exceed £500 should be appropriated and held by the said Governors for the benefit of the Benefice of New Alresford in the Diocese of Winchester and the excepted sum should be applied by the said Governors for or towards the cost of improvements to the Parsonage House of the United Benefice:

"And whereas the said union has not yet taken effect:

"And whereas the Itchen Abbas Parsonage House Fund in the hands of the said Governors amounts to a sum of £3,011 8s. od.:

"And whereas it has been represented to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and we are satisfied that the said Parsonage House belonging to the Benefice of Avington is not suitable to become the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice but that a Parsonage House could more conveniently be erected or acquired at Itchen Abbas for the said Benefice of Itchen Abbas which would be suitable to become the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and

towards the erection or acquisition of which the Itchen Abbas Parsonage House Fund would, but for the provisions of the original Order, now be available:

"And whereas, in order to give effect to such representation, it appears to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, expedient that the original Order should be altered as hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"Now, therefore, we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners with the consents of the Right Reverend Cyril, Bishop of Winchester, of the Reverend Rowland Charles Mugliston, being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Itchen Abbas and of the Reverend Canon Andrew John Robertson, being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of New Alresford (testified by their signing this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the provisions contained in Clauses 3 and 4 of the original Order shall be rescinded.

"2. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House (if any) belonging to the said Benefice of Itchen Abbas shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Avington and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and the net proceeds of such sale shall be applied by us for the benefit of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect a part of the total endowment of the said Benefice of Itchen Abbas, that is to say, the sum of £2,511 os. od. being part of the sum of money appropriated or to be appropriated by the said Governors to the said Benefice of Itchen Abbas pursuant to the provisions of Part II paragraph 2 of the Third Schedule to the Tithe Act, 1936, and paragraph 1 of the Eighth Schedule to the same Act shall be severed or diverted from the said Benefice of Itchen Abbas and from the United Benefice and shall be appropriated by the said Governors for the augmentation of the said Benefice of New Alresford.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Supplementary Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Supplementary Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas an objection has been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objection have deemed right to make no alteration in such draft Supplementary Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Supplementary Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Winchester has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Supplementary Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Supplementary Scheme:

And whereas the said Supplementary Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council is pleased hereby to affirm the said Supplementary Scheme and to order and direct that the said Supplementary Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Winchester.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Trevalga, the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Forrabury and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Minster all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Cornwall and in the Diocese of Truro:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Joseph Wellington, Bishop of Truro, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the desirability of the union of the Benefices of Trevalga, Forrabury, Minister and Saint Juliot with Lesnewth, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Truro and

therein recommended the union of the said three Benefices of Trevalga, Forrabury and Minster only and the terms for effecting the union and the said Bishop of Truro signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said three Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop embodies a modification thereof:

"And whereas the said Benefices are now all full, the Reverend William Samuel Cave Palmer, being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Trevalga and the Reverend Frank Weston holding the said Benefices of Forrabury and Minster in plurality under the authority of a dispensation:

"And whereas the Patronage of each of the said Benefices of Forrabury and Minster belongs to one and the same Patron:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Joseph Wellington, Bishop of Truro, and with the consent of the said Frank Weston (testified by their signing this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Trevalga, the said Benefice of Forrabury and the said Benefice of Minster shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Forrabury and Minster with Trevalga' but that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue in all respect distinct.

"2. That (a) if upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme all of the said three Benefices shall be vacant or if upon the said day the said Benefice of Trevalga only shall be vacant the union of such three Benefices shall forthwith take effect, but (b) if upon that day the said Benefice of Trevalga is full the said Benefices of Forrabury and Minster shall pending the union of all of the three said Benefices forthwith be united into one Benefice with Cure of Souls, but so that the Parishes of the said Benefices of Forrabury and Minster shall continue in all respects distinct, and the union of all of the three said Benefices shall take effect upon the next avoidance thereafter of the said Benefice of Trevalga.

"3. That upon the union of all of the three said Benefices taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Forrabury shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the union referred to in Clause 1 of the Scheme has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination the Patron of the said Benefice of Trevalga shall have the first turn and the Patron of the said Benefices of Forrabury and Minster shall have the second and third turns.

"Provided that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Truro has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Truro.

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 47th and 48th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 65, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Saint Paul, Daybrook, and the District of Saint James, Porchester, both in the County of Nottingham and in the Diocese of Southwell:

“ Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 13th day of May, 1896, and published in the London Gazette on the 19th day of the same month, a Consolidated Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Paul, Daybrook, situate in the Parish of Arnold in the said County and Diocese, and the said Consolidated Chapelry was named ‘ The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Paul, Daybrook ’:

“ And whereas the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Paul, Daybrook, has under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become a New Parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above-mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

“ And whereas by the authority of an Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council bearing date the 6th day of June, 1935, and published in the London Gazette on the following day a separate district for spiritual purposes was constituted out of the Parish of Gedling, the New Parish of Saint Ann, Nottingham, and the New Parish of Saint Paul, Carlton in the Willows, all in the said County and Diocese and the said District was named ‘ The District of Saint James, Porchester ’:

“ And whereas there is not yet within the existing limits of the said District of Saint James, Porchester, a consecrated Church:

“ And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Daybrook, and the said District of Saint James, Porchester, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry, Bishop of Southwell (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in

the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Daybrook, and the said District of Saint James, Porchester, shall be altered so that all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Daybrook, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said District of Saint James, Porchester.

“ And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

“ The territory to be dissevered from the New Parish of Saint Paul, Daybrook, in the County of Nottingham and in the Diocese of Southwell, and to be annexed to the District of Saint James, Porchester, in the said County and Diocese, being:—

“ All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Daybrook, which is bounded upon the north-east by the Parish of Arnold, upon the south-east by the said District of Saint James, Porchester, upon the south-west by the New Parish of Saint Jude, Nottingham, upon the west by the New Parish of Saint Martin, Sherwood, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the north-west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Martin, Sherwood, from the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Daybrook, at the centre of the bridge which carries the Nottingham Suburban Branch Line of the London and North Eastern Railway over Thackeray’s Lane and extending thence first north-eastward and then northward along the middle of Thackeray’s Lane for a distance of 26 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Hickling’s Lane and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Hickling’s Lane for a distance of 38 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Gedling Road upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Daybrook, from the said Parish of Arnold.”

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwell.

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowsons or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Churches and Cures (hereinafter called ‘the said Benefices’) of Stow Bardolph with Wimbotsham and Shouldham with Shouldham Thorpe both in the County of Norfolk and in the Diocese of Ely:

“Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefices of Stow Bardolph with Wimbotsham and Shouldham with Shouldham Thorpe is now limited and settled to uses under which Sir Thomas Leigh Hare of Stowe Hall in the said County of Norfolk is tenant for life and is therefore the patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the said two Benefices or either of them in case the same were now vacant:

“And whereas the said Thomas Leigh Hare is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefices of Stow Bardolph with Wimbotsham and Shouldham with Shouldham Thorpe now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Ely for the time being:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Claude, Bishop of Peterborough, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the re-arrangement by way of union or unions of certain Benefices in the Diocese of Peterborough including the said two Benefices of Greatworth and Marston Saint Lawrence

with Warkworth duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Peterborough and therein made no recommendation for union affecting the said two Benefices but recommended certain alterations of boundaries affecting the Parishes of the said two Benefices and the said Bishop of Peterborough signified in writing his approval of the said Report conditionally upon the consideration by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, of a modification in the terms thereof:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said alterations of boundaries, which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report, but subject to the modification aforesaid:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Marston Saint Lawrence with Warkworth is now full, the Reverend Colin Francis Scott being the present Incumbent thereof, and the said Benefice of Greatworth is at present vacant:

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 11th day of January, 1940, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Dowles situate partly in the County of Worcester and partly in the County of Salop and the Benefice (being an United Benefice) of Ribbesford with Bewdley situate in the County of Worcester and both in the Diocese of Worcester:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Arthur, Bishop of Worcester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Dowles and Ribbesford with Bewdley duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Worcester and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union and also an alteration of the boundaries of the Parish of the said Benefice of Dowles and the said Bishop of Worcester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said union and alteration of boundaries which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report, but with the assent of the said Bishop of Worcester embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Ribbesford with Bewdley is now full the Reverend Charles Raymund Hollis being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Dowles is at present vacant:

"And whereas the Patrons of the said Benefice of Dowles are willing to surrender their

patronage in favour of the Patron of the said United Benefice of Ribbesford with Bewdley as hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Arthur, Bishop of Worcester, and of the said Charles Raymund Hollis (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Dowles and the said Benefice of Ribbesford with Bewdley shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Ribbesford with Bewdley' and that the Parish of Bewdley and the Parish of the said Benefice of Dowles shall, subject to the provisions of Clause 8 of this Scheme, be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided.

"2. That upon the said union taking effect the Church of the Parish of Bewdley shall be the Parish Church of the said United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Bewdley shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the said United Parish.

"3. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Charles Raymund Hollis if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ribbesford with Bewdley shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That upon the union taking effect the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Dowles shall be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

"5. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at Bewdley at present belonging to the said Benefice of Ribbesford with Bewdley shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"6. That upon the union taking effect provision shall be made by the Incumbent of the United Benefice for obtaining the services of a Curate or occasional clerical or lay assistance and a portion of the endowments of the United Benefice, namely, the whole of the endowments (other than the glebe) of the said Benefice of Dowles shall be charged with a sum of £100 per annum as a fund to meet the expenses of providing for the services of a Curate or for occasional clerical or lay assistance as aforesaid which fund of £100 per annum shall be held and administered by the Incumbent of the United Benefice but shall be applicable only to the purposes aforesaid.

"7. That with the consents of the Honourable Gerard, Vernon, Wallop (commonly called Viscount Lymington) of Farleigh House, near Basingstoke, in the County of Southampton, and of Major John Digby Mills, M.P., of Bisterne, Ringwood, in the said County of Southampton, being the Patrons of the said Benefice of Dowles (in testimony of which consents they have signed this Scheme), upon the said union taking effect the patronage of the said Benefice of Dowles shall be surrendered and the patronage of the said United Benefice

of Ribbesford with Bewdley shall belong wholly to the present Patron of the said Benefice of Ribbesford with Bewdley.

"8. That with the consent (testified as aforesaid) of the said Bishop of Worcester as the Patron in right of his See of the Benefice of Kidderminster, and with the consents also of the Reverend Canon Laurence Banks Sladen, being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Kidderminster (testified by his signing this Scheme) and of the said Charles Raymund Hollis (testified as aforesaid) upon the said union taking effect all that part of the said Parish of Dowles which lies on the eastern side of the middle of the River Severn shall be severed from the said Parish and shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Kidderminster.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Worcester has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures:

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Worcester.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Westminster Abbey Measure, 1929, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme relating to the Dean and Chapter of the Collegiate Church of Saint Peter, Westminster, of which Corporation Your Majesty is Visitor:

"Whereas by an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 9th day of November, 1935, and relating to the Dean and Chapter of the said Collegiate Church of Saint Peter, Westminster, which Order was published in the London Gazette on the 12th day of November, 1935, it was provided (*inter alia*) that there should continue to be paid to the Fabric Fund out of the annual income of the Dean and Chapter the annual sum of £3,250 and that there should be applied out of the annual income of the Dean and Chapter (next after the provision of the said annual sum of £3,250) the annual sum of £9,600 for the yearly stipend of the Dean and the five Canons, being £3,000 for the Dean, £1,200 for each of the two Canons to whose Canonries Rectories are annexed and £1,400 for each of the other three Canons (these stipend payments to be taken to include and cover any compensation allowance or expense incurred by reason of the suspension of a canonry and the reduction of the number of canons from six to five) and that the residue of the annual income of the Dean and Chapter should be applied for the maintenance of the services of Westminster Abbey and other expenses of the Dean and Chapter:

"And whereas it was further provided by the same Order that the hereinbefore recited provisions should continue in force only for the period of five years from the 29th day of September, 1934:

"And whereas it appears to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to be expedient that the said provisions should continue in force for a further period and also that the caputal accounts of the Dean and Chapter of Westminster should annually be sent to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

"Now we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the said Westminster Abbey Measure, 1929, and after consultation as thereby prescribed with the Dean and Chapter of Westminster and with the approval of the Right Honourable Thomas Walker Hobart, Viscount Caldecote, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, exercising the authority of Your Majesty as Visitor as aforesaid, such approval being testified by his signature and seal being subscribed and affixed to this Scheme, do humbly recommend and propose that from and after the 29th day of September, 1939, first, there shall continue to be paid to the Fabric Fund out of the annual income of the Dean and Chapter an annual sum of £3,250; secondly, there shall be applied out of the annual income of the Dean and Chapter (next after the provision of the lastly mentioned annual sum of £3,250) the annual sum of £9,600 for the yearly stipends of the Dean and the five Canons, being £3,000 for the Dean, £1,200 for each of the two Canons to whose canonries Rectories are annexed and £1,400

for each of the other three Canons, and that these payments shall be taken to include and cover any compensation allowance or expense incurred by reason of the suspension of a Canonry and the reduction of the number of Canons from six to five, and thirdly, that the residue of the annual income of the Dean and Chapter after the specific appropriations hereinbefore directed shall be appropriated and applied to the maintenance of the services of Westminster Abbey and other expenses of the Dean and Chapter; and that each of the foregoing provisions shall continue in force only for a further period of five years from the 29th day of September, 1939:

"And we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further recommend and propose that the Dean and Chapter of Westminster shall annually within three months after the close of the year to which they relate send to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, the capitular accounts in full."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the Diocese of London.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church

and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Skelton in the County of York and in the Diocese of York:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Skelton is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in the Public Trustee as executor of the Will dated the 15th day of January, 1929, of the late Edwin Wilson Gresham Williams-Hepworth of Skelton Manor in the said County of York formerly a Major in Your Majesty's Army, who died on the 24th day of May, 1937:

"And whereas the said Public Trustee is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Skelton now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Archbishop of York for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William, now Archbishop of York, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said William, Archbishop of York, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Skelton which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Skelton:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Public Trustee (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said William, Archbishop of York (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Archbishop's Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Skelton now vested in him, the said Public Trustee as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said William, Archbishop of York, and his successors in the same Archbishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said William, Archbishop of York, and by his successors in the same Archbishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of York.

WHEREAS by the Sierra Leone (Legislative Council) Order in Council, 1924 (hereinafter called "the Principal Order"), as amended by the Sierra Leone (Legislative Council) Amendment Order in Council, 1931, provision is made for the constitution of a Legislative Council for the Colony and Protectorate of Sierra Leone:

And whereas it is expedient to amend the provision contained in those Orders in regard to the composition of the said Legislative Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of all powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Sierra Leone (Legislative Council) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1939.

2. Article 3 of the Principal Order is hereby amended by the addition thereto of the following paragraph:—

"(3) For the purposes of this Order, no person shall be regarded as holding an office of emolument under the Crown in Sierra Leone by reason only of his being in receipt of a pension or other like allowance from Sierra Leone Funds."

3. The Sierra Leone (Legislative Council) Amendment Order in Council, 1931, and Articles 4, 5, 8, 10, 11, 12 and 13 of the Principal Order as amended by that Order, are hereby revoked, but without prejudice to any appointment lawfully made or to anything lawfully done thereunder, and the Principal Order shall have effect as if the following Articles were inserted therein in place of the said Articles:—

"4. The Council shall consist of:—

The Governor as President;  
eleven Official Members;  
three Elected Unofficial Members; and  
not more than seven Nominated Unofficial Members, of whom three shall be Paramount Chiefs of the Protectorate."

"5.—(1) The Official Members of the Council shall be the persons for the time being lawfully discharging the functions of Colonial Secretary, Attorney-General, Colonial Treasurer, Director of Medical Services, Secretary for Protectorate Affairs,

Comptroller of Customs, Director of Public Works, Director of Education, General Manager of Railways, Director of Agriculture, and such other Office as the Governor, with the approval of His Majesty, may from time to time designate by Instrument under the Public Seal.

(2) Whenever the person for the time being lawfully discharging the functions of Attorney-General is unable to attend a meeting of the Council the person for the time being lawfully discharging the functions of Solicitor-General shall be a Member in his place and with the same precedence."

"8.—(1) The Nominated Unofficial Members of the Council shall be such persons not holding any office of emolument under the Crown in Sierra Leone as the Governor may, from time to time, by Instrument under the Public Seal appoint.

(2) Every such Member shall vacate his seat at the end of five years from the date of the Instrument by which he is appointed or at such earlier date as may be provided by that Instrument, but shall be eligible to be re-appointed by the Governor for a further period or periods, each period not exceeding five years:

Provided that if any person is provisionally appointed, as hereinafter provided, and his provisional appointment is immediately followed by his definitive appointment, the said period of five years shall be reckoned from the date of the Instrument provisionally appointing him."

"10. The Members of the Council shall take precedence as His Majesty may specially assign, and in default thereof as follows:—

First, the Official Members specified in Article 5 of this Order in the order in which their offices are therein referred to;

Secondly, Official Members provisionally appointed as hereinafter provided (if any) according to the priority of their respective appointments or, if appointed by the same Instrument, according to the order in which they are named therein;

Thirdly, the Elected Unofficial Members and the Nominated Unofficial Members according to the length of time during which they have been continuously Members of the Council, Members elected or appointed at the same time taking precedence amongst themselves according to the alphabetical order of their names:

Provided that any such Member re-elected or re-appointed immediately on the termination of his term of office shall, for the purposes of this Article, be deemed not to have ceased to be a Member for the period between such termination and re-election or re-appointment."

"11.—(1) Whenever there shall be a vacancy in the number of persons sitting as Members of the Council, by reason of the fact that—

(a) an Official Member is administering the Government of Sierra Leone; or

(b) one person is lawfully discharging the functions of more than one of the offices the holders of which are Official Members; or

(c) no person is lawfully discharging the functions of an office the holder of which is an Official Member; or

(d) an office the holder of which is an Official Member shall cease to exist; or

(e) a Member is suspended from the exercise of his functions as a Member; or

(f) a Nominated Unofficial Member is dead or has, by writing under his hand addressed to the Governor, resigned his seat on the Council, or the seat of any such Member is vacant for any other cause; or

(g) a Nominated Unofficial Member is declared by the Governor by an instrument under the Public Seal to be incapable of discharging his functions as a Member; or

(h) an Official Member or a Nominated Unofficial Member is absent from Sierra Leone;

the Governor may by an Instrument under the Public Seal appoint a person to be provisionally a Member for the period of such vacancy.

(2) The period of any such vacancy shall terminate if the provisional appointment of a person to fill it shall be superseded by the permanent appointment of a Member in the place of such person, or when the circumstances giving rise to the vacancy shall otherwise cease to exist."

"12. Every person appointed under the preceding Article shall, as long as his appointment shall subsist, be to all intents and purposes—

(a) in the case of a vacancy in the number of persons sitting as Official Members of the Council, an Official Member; and

(b) in the case of a vacancy in the number of persons sitting as Nominated Unofficial Members, a Nominated Unofficial Member."

"13.—(1) The Governor shall forthwith report to His Majesty every provisional appointment of any person as an Official Member of the Council and every appointment, whether definitive or provisional, of any person as a Nominated Unofficial Member of the Council. Every such person shall hold his place in the Council during His Majesty's pleasure.

(2) The definitive appointment of any person as a Nominated Unofficial Member of the Council may be disallowed by His Majesty through a Secretary of State (without prejudice to anything done by virtue thereof) and shall cease to have effect on notification to such person by the Governor of such disallowance.

(3) The provisional appointment of any person may be disallowed by His Majesty through a Secretary of State (without prejudice to anything done by virtue thereof) or may be revoked by the Governor by an Instrument under the Public Seal, and shall cease to have effect on notification to such person by the Governor of such disallowance or revocation or on the termination of the vacancy by reason of which the appointment was made."

4. This Order shall be published in the Sierra Leone Royal Gazette and shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by the Governor by Proclamation in the said Gazette; and the Governor shall give directions for the publication of this Order at such places and in such

manner and for such time or times as he thinks proper for giving due publicity thereto within Sierra Leone.

5. In this Order the term "the Governor" means the officer for the time being administering the government of Sierra Leone.

6. His Majesty may from time to time revoke, add to, alter, or amend this Order.
