

Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 47th and 48th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 65, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme or Representation, bearing date the 14th day of December, 1939, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 47th and 48th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 65, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Saint Paul, Daybrook, and the District of Saint James, Porchester, both in the County of Nottingham and in the Diocese of Southwell:

“ Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 13th day of May, 1896, and published in the London Gazette on the 19th day of the same month, a Consolidated Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Paul, Daybrook, situate in the Parish of Arnold in the said County and Diocese, and the said Consolidated Chapelry was named ‘ The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Paul, Daybrook ’:

“ And whereas the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Paul, Daybrook, has under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become a New Parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above-mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

“ And whereas by the authority of an Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council bearing date the 6th day of June, 1935, and published in the London Gazette on the following day a separate district for spiritual purposes was constituted out of the Parish of Gedling, the New Parish of Saint Ann, Nottingham, and the New Parish of Saint Paul, Carlton in the Willows, all in the said County and Diocese and the said District was named ‘ The District of Saint James, Porchester ’:

“ And whereas there is not yet within the existing limits of the said District of Saint James, Porchester, a consecrated Church:

“ And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Daybrook, and the said District of Saint James, Porchester, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry, Bishop of Southwell (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in

the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Daybrook, and the said District of Saint James, Porchester, shall be altered so that all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Daybrook, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said District of Saint James, Porchester.

“ And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

“ The territory to be dissevered from the New Parish of Saint Paul, Daybrook, in the County of Nottingham and in the Diocese of Southwell, and to be annexed to the District of Saint James, Porchester, in the said County and Diocese, being:—

“ All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Daybrook, which is bounded upon the north-east by the Parish of Arnold, upon the south-east by the said District of Saint James, Porchester, upon the south-west by the New Parish of Saint Jude, Nottingham, upon the west by the New Parish of Saint Martin, Sherwood, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the north-west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Martin, Sherwood, from the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Daybrook, at the centre of the bridge which carries the Nottingham Suburban Branch Line of the London and North Eastern Railway over Thackeray’s Lane and extending thence first north-eastward and then northward along the middle of Thackeray’s Lane for a distance of 26 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Hickling’s Lane and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Hickling’s Lane for a distance of 38 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Gedling Road upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Daybrook, from the said Parish of Arnold.”

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.
