The Congregation of Cardinals appointed to examine the Arch-Bishop of Cambray's Book, have at last resolved to condemn the Opinions contained therein, But some Things having been represented to the Pope in the Arch-Bishop's behalf, by a Person whom he has sent hither to act as his Agent in this Affair, Orders are given, That the Pronouncing of the Sentence, and the Publishing of the Bull in pursuance thereof, be delayed, till such time as this Matter is further enquired into. Several Persons are appointed to inspect the new Works that are making at the Port of Anzo, and to take care that they be sinished with all possible diligence. The Cardinals, Carpagna, Calanatta, and Marestotti, are frequently in Conference together, having Orders from the Pope to consider of several Matters relating to the Presentation of Bishopricks, and other Ecclesiastical Benefices in Poland. We have received an Account, that the Queen-Dowager of Paland arrived the 9th Instant at Fervara, where she was splendidly entertained by Cardinal Afally, and that she intended the next day to continue her Journey to Bologna, where she will pass the Carnaval.

Cardinal Cavallerini is lately dead, which makes 2 Sixth Vacancy in the College of Cardinals.

The Committee of the Senate, to whom the Affair of Elbing is referred, are to meet this week, to consider of the Instructions to be given to the King's Ministers appointed for this Treaty. The Sieur Gomelinsky, who is to reside on the part of this Crown at the Imperial Court, will be going thither in a few days. Vienna, March 4. The Publick Diversions on the occasion of the Marriage of the King of the Romans, have been continued here several days. On Saturday last, in the evening, the Court were Entertained with very fine Musick, both Vocal and Infrumental, performed by Persons representing Hymen, Venus, Apollo, the Muses, and other Heathen Gods and Goddess, seated in several rich Triumphal Chariots which were brought into the Great Court of the Palace, and so placed, that their Imperial Majesties, accompanied with the King and Queen of the Romans, the Arch Duke and Arch Dutchess, heard the same from the Windows of their Apartment. On Sanday there was a Firework; On Monday the Arch Dutchess, and divers Ladies of Quality, acted a Comedy, atter which, there was a Ball; And last night these Diversions were concluded with a Masquerade, and a Ball. An Express is arrived here from Hungary, which brings Advice, that the Venetian Ambassador having received the Senate's Orders for signing the Treaty for a Truce of 25 Years with the Turks, on the Conditions stipulated for that Republick by his Imperial Majesty, had immediately sent Notice thereof to the Mediators and Turkss Ministers at Belgrade, desiring they might have a Meeting to put the finishing hand to this Great Work, and that accordingly they met, and had a Conserence, in which the Treaty between the Republick and the Port was signed by both Parties, and fair Transcripts thereof were immediately dispatched to Venice and Andrinople to be Ratisfed. Signior Leredano, Ambassador from the Republick of Venice at this Court, had his first Audience of the Emperor some days ago. Count Philip of Districhfein is made Masser of the Horse in the room of Count Harrach, whom the Emperor has made High-Steward. Prince Leopold of Dietrichfein, Son to the late Prince of Dietrichfein who was High-Steward to the Emperor, has lately received from Spain the Order of the Kingdom of Bohemia, and one of the Emperor's Chief Ministers of State, died here the 27th of the 1st Month, 1c's b ineved, t

Berlin, Feb. 25. The Heer Heims, Resident from the Emperor, had Audience on the 12th Instant of the Elector of Brandenburgh, and norified the Marriage of the King of the Romans, upon which occasion there was a very solemn Festival at this Court on the 14th, and the next day the Resident gave a splendid Entertainment to all the Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Quality here. On the 13th, Brigadier Goer of Hanzuer went from hence on his Journey to Warfam, being sent with the Character of Envoy Extraordinary from the House of Lunenburgh to the King of Poland. The Elector has given the Command of the Garrison in the City of Elbing to Brigadier Hanza who is accordingly gone thither, and has Directions to repair and augment the Fostifications of Elbing.

The Elector of Bavaria Bruffels, March 15. continues at Marimont, where he gave Audience on Friday last so the Marquis de Pompone, who is sent by the Most Christian King as his Envoy Extraordinary, to make the Compliment of Con-doleance at this Court on the Death of the Electoral Prince of Bavaria; and he has fince had Audience of the Electoress.
