Rome, Feb. 21. N.S.

THE Congregation of Cardinals appointed to examine the Arch-Bishop of *Cambrai's* Book, have at last resolved to condemn the Opinions contained therein, But some Things having been represented to the Pope in the Arch-Bishop's behalf, by a Person whom he has sent hither to act as his Agent in this Affair, Orders are given, That the Pronouncing of the Sentence, and the Publishing of the Bull in pursuance thereof, be delayed, till such time as this Matter is further enquired into. Several Persons are appointed to inspect the new Works that are making at the Port of *Anzo*, and to take care that they be finished with all possible diligence. The Cardinals, *Carpagna*, *Casaniata*, and *Marescotti*, are frequently in Conference together, having Orders from the Pope to consider of several Matters relating to the Presentation of Bishopsricks, and other Ecclesiastical Benefices in *Poland*. We have received an Account, that the Queen-Dowager of *Poland* arrived the 9th Instant at *Ferrara*, where she was splendidly entertained by Cardinal *Asally*, and that she intended the next day to continue her Journey to *Bologna*, where she will pass the Carnival.

Turin, Feb. 21. A new Reinforcement of Regulated Troops, and a Body of the Militia, are ordered to march against the Rebels of *Mondovi*, who have intrenched themselves at a place called *Vico*, and from thence make Excursions into the Neighbouring Country. The Duke of *Savoy* has promised a Pardon to such of them as shall surrender themselves before the 25th Instant. The Duke of *Seffo*, who was sent hither by the Prince of *Vaudemont* Governor of *Milan*, to confer with the Duke of *Savoy* concerning the Pretensions his Royal Highness makes to some Lands about *Final*, is returned to *Milan*.

Venice, Feb. 27. Count *Nigrelli*, Envoy Extraordinary from the Duke of *Modena*, had Audience of the College last Monday, and in the Name of the Duke his Master, returned Thanks to them for the Honour and Respect they paid to the Queen of the *Romans* in her passage through their Dominions. The Senate are to meet this week, to make choice of an Ambassador to be sent to the Grand Signior, and it's thought, Signior *Zen*, who has served the Republick in the same Quality at *Vienna*, will be appointed for that Employment. Our Doge is dangerously ill. Signior *Antonio Grimani* died yesterday, and it's believed, will be succeeded as Procurator of St. Mark by Signior *Venier*, who was lately Ambassador from this Republick to His Majesty of Great-Britain. Cardinal *Cavallerini* is lately dead, which makes a Sixth Vacancy in the College of Cardinals.

Warsaw, Feb. 28. *Te Deum* was sung here on the 24th Instant for the Conclusion of the Peace with the *Turks*. The Committee of the Senate, to whom the Affair of *Elbing* is referred, are to meet this week, to consider of the Instructions to be given to the King's Ministers appointed for this Treaty. The Sieur *Gomulinsky*, who is to reside on the part of this Crown at the Imperial Court, will be going thither in a few days. The Starost of *Chehm* makes Preparations for his Journey to the Port, as Ambassador from this Crown.

We hear from *Lemberg*, that the *Tartars* of *Caminnie* have lately made an Incurfion into *Podolia*, and carried off a considerable Booty.

Vienna, March 4. The Publick Diversions on the occasion of the Marriage of the King of the *Romans*, have been continued here several days. On Saturday last, in the evening, the Court were Entertained with very fine Musick, both Vocal and Instrumental, performed by Persons representing *Hymen*, *Venus*, *Apollo*, the Muses, and other Heathen Gods and Goddesses, seated in several rich Triumphal Chariots which were brought into the Great Court of the Palace, and so placed, that their Imperial Majesties, accompanied with the King and Queen of the *Romans*, the Arch-Duke and Arch-Duchesses, heard the same from the Windows of their Apartment. On Sunday there was a Firework; On Monday the Arch-Duchesses, and divers Ladies of Quality, acted a Comedy; after which, there was a Ball; And last night these Diversions were concluded with a Masquerade, and a Ball. An Express is arrived here from *Hungary*, which brings Advice, that the *Venetian* Ambassador having received the Senate's Orders for signing the Treaty for a Truce of 25 Years with the *Turks*, on the Conditions stipulated for that Republick by his Imperial Majesty, had immediately sent Notice thereof to the Mediators and *Turkish* Ministers at *Belgrade*, desiring they might have a Meeting to put the finishing hand to this Great Work, and that accordingly they met, and had a Conference, in which the Treaty between the Republick and the Port was signed by both Parties, and fair Transcripts thereof were immediately dispatched to *Venice* and *Andrinople* to be Ratified. Signior *Loredano*, Ambassador from the Republick of *Venice* at this Court, had his first Audience of the Emperor some days ago. Count *Philip* of *Dietrichstein* is made Master of the Horse in the room of Count *Harrach*, whom the Emperor has made High-Steward. Prince *Leopold* of *Dietrichstein*, Son to the late Prince of *Dietrichstein* who was High-Steward to the Emperor, has lately received from *Spain* the Order of the Golden Fleece. Count *Kinsky*, Great-Chancellor of the Kingdom of *Bohemia*, and one of the Emperor's Chief Ministers of State, died here the 27th of the last Month; It's believed, the Count of *Webma* will succeed him in the Office of Chancellor of *Bohemia*.

Berlin, Feb. 25. The Heer *Heims*, Resident from the Emperor, had Audience on the 12th Instant of the Elector of *Brandenburgh*, and notified the Marriage of the King of the *Romans*, upon which occasion there was a very solemn Festival at this Court on the 14th, and the next day the Resident gave a splendid Entertainment to all the Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Quality here. On the 13th, Brigadier *Gorr* of *Hannover* went from hence on his Journey to *Warsaw*, being sent with the Character of Envoy Extraordinary from the House of *Lunenburgh* to the King of *Poland*. The Elector has given the Command of the Garrison in the City of *Elbing* to Brigadier *Horne*, who is accordingly gone thither, and has Directions to repair and augment the Fortifications of *Elbing*.

Frankfurt, March 11. Two Companies of the Forces of *Hesse Darmstadt*, and two of the Landgrave

of Hesse Cassel, are come to Philipburgh, to remain in Garrison there. The Conferences touching the Pretensions of the Dutchess of Orleans on the Palatinate, have been discontinued for some time; and its believ'd, they will not be renewed before Easter; when the Abbot Theſſi, one of the French Commissioners, who is gone to Paris to receive New Instructions, is expected back.

Hamburgh, March 13. On the 24th past, here were publick Rejoicings, with a very fine Fire-work by order of our Magistrates, for the Marriage of the King of the Romans. Our Letters from Copenhagen say, the Sieur de Chamilly, Ambassador from the Most Christian King, made his Publick Entry there the 28th past. Letters from Moscow of the 24th of January give an Account, that Monsieur Printz, Envoy from the Elector of Brandenburg arrived there that day; the Czar was then at a Country-house near Moscow, but would return to Moscow and give him Audience the 31st. The same Letters say, a great number of Persons had been Executed by the Czar's Order, for having been concerned in a Conspiracy against him; and that the Princess Sophia, his Sister, is put into a Nunnery. They had received Advice at Moscow, that a great Rebellion was broke out in Persia, at the Head of which was one, who pretended to be descended from the true Family of the Sophy's of that Country, and had already got together near Tauris about 100000 Men.

Brussels, March 15. The Elector of Bavaria continues at Marimont, where he gave Audience on Friday last to the Marquis de Pomponne, who is sent by the Most Christian King as his Envoy Extraordinary, to make the Compliment of Condolence at this Court on the Death of the Electoral Prince of Bavaria; and he has since had Audience of the Electores. The Regulations concerning the Forces to be kept on foot in the Spanish Netherlands, will now in a short time be put in Execution. Directions are given for making a Canal from Bruges to the Scheld.

Hague, March 17. The Heer Cleverkirke, Ambassador from the States-General to His Majesty of Great-Britain, is gone for England, in order to take his Audiences of Leave, and after that to return hither; And in the mean time, the Heer Geldermalsen, who is to succeed him, prepares for his departure. The Heer Opdam, whom the States have appointed to be their Envoy to the Elector of Brandenburg, and their Plenipotentiary at the Conferences for adjusting the Affair of Elbing, will go from hence in few days to Berlin. The States having lately granted Pensions to divers French Officers who have served in Savoy and Piedmont, and who are banished from thence on account of their Religion, appeared yesterday before the Council of State, to take an Oath of Fidelity to this State.

Plimouth, March 7. The Harrison of London, Richard Merry's Master, came into this Port yesterday from Lisbon; The Sedgwick of London, James Smith's Master, likewise came in here from Jamaica: And the Fortune of Stockholm, with Deals from Stockholm; The May Fortune of London, Thomas Barnes's Master, for Barbadoes; And the St. Francis of St. Sebastian, Anthony Lefrancis's Master, bound home from London.

Comes, March 8. Yesterday came in here the O-Porto Merchant, George Fairfax's Master, with Wine and Fruit from O-Porto, bound to London; the Richard and John of Weymouth, Theo. Friend's Master, and the Happy Return of London, Tho. Parsons's Master, both bound to Falmouth; The Mary Galley of London, Robert Hirschcock's Master,

bound to Newfoundland, and the Coronation of London to O-Porto.
