

By Part III of the Second Schedule to the said Act, it is provided that if any person aggrieved by an Order desires to question its validity on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Act or that any requirement of the Act has not been complied with, he may, within six weeks after the publication of this notice, make an application for the purpose to the High Court, and if any such application is duly made, the Court, if satisfied that the Order is not within the powers of the Act or that the interests of the applicant have been substantially prejudiced by any requirements of the Act not having been complied with, may quash the Order either generally or in so far as it affects the applicant.

LAND DRAINAGE ACT, 1930.

South West Sussex Rivers Catchment Area.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries hereby gives notice that the South West Sussex Rivers Catchment Board have made application under sub-section (3) of Section 5 of the Land Drainage Act, 1930, that the statutory map of the Catchment Area be varied so far as relates to the extent of the "main river" by the addition of certain watercourses to the "main river" as at present defined on the map.

Plans on the one inch scale on which the proposed additions are shown by lines in red colour may be inspected, together with a copy of the Statutory map of the Catchment Area on which the proposed variations are to be made, at the Office of the Clerk of the Catchment Board, County Hall, Chichester, or at the Offices of the Ministry.

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) SPECIAL ORDER NO. 17 OF 1940.

SUBJECT.

I. Contracts the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area around Hartlip, Kent, as from the 1st February, 1940, so as to comprise an area of approximately 5 miles radius round the Infected Place at Hartlip. This Area is situate wholly in the county of Kent.

II. Releases the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area around Hartlip, Kent, and revokes Order No. 5915 as from the 8th February, 1940.
