DEFENCE OF THE REALM.

THE REGULATION OF TRAFFIC (BURNTISLAND) ORDER, 1940.

Notice is hereby given that, in virtue of his powers under the Defence (General) Regulations, 1939, the Minister of Transport on 2nd February, 1940, made an Order establishing one-way working for traffic in Somerville Street, Burntisland, between Kirkgate and Links Place.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made an Order under the Land Drainage Act, 1930, confirming a Scheme submitted to him by the River Trent Catchment Board, under Section 4 (1) (b) of that Act, making provision for the constitution of the Gainsborough Internal Drainage District and of a drainage board therefor, the abrogation of the powers of the Commissioners of Sewers for the County of Lincoln, City of Lincoln and County of the said City and part of the County of Nottingham within the Catchment Area, and for certain matters supplemental thereto; and that the Order will become final and have effect as an Act of Parliament unless within thirty-one days from the date of this Notice a memorial is presented to the Minister by some person or body affected and having an interest sufficient for the presentation of a memorial, praying that the Order shall not become law without confirmation by Parliament.

A copy of the Sealed Order has been deposited, together with a copy of the Scheme, as amended, and of the map referred to therein, at the Northern Area Offices of the River Trent Catchment Board, 2, Morton Terrace, Gainsborough, for public inspection for a period of thirty-one days from the date of this Notice, and may be inspected during the ordinary hours of business.
