TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 23rd February, 1940, at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £60,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 26th February,

1940, to Saturday, the 2nd March, 1940, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday, 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

GEORGE THE SIXTH by the Grace of God of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas KING, Defender of the Faith, to all to whom these Presents shall come.

Greeting!

Whereas by a Resolution adopted on the fourteenth day of December, 1939, the Assembly of the League of Nations solemnly condemned the action taken by the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics against the State of Finland, and urgently appealed to every member of the League of Nations to provide the State of Finland with such material and humanitarian assistance as might be in its power, and to refrain from any action which might weaken that State's power of resistance:

And whereas by an Act passed in the Thirty-Fourth Year of the Reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria intituled "The Foreign Enlistment Act, 1870", it is amongst other things provided that certain acts, if done without Our Royal Licence, shall be offences against that Act:

Now know ye that We by these Presents under Our Royal Sign Manual are Graciously Pleased to grant Our Royal Licence unto

(a) any of Our subjects, being within Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, to accept or agree to accept any commission or engagement in the military or naval service of the State of Finland; and

(b) any of Our subjects to quit or go on board any ship with a view to quitting Our said United Kingdom with intent to accept any commission or engagement as aforesaid. And this Our Royal Licence shall remain in force until Our Pleasure be otherwise declared.

Given at Our Court at Saint James's the Eighth day of February, 1940, in the Fourth year of Our Reign.

SCHEDULE.

The South Wales District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, shall be amended as follows:—

1. In Clause 79 of the Scheme by adding the following new sub-clause (4) as under:

(4) The Executive Board shall have power out of the District (General Expenses) Fund to pay and remunerate members of the Control Board and officers, servants and staff whether of the Executive Board or of the Control Board, and in addition thereto to pay out of that Fund annuities, pensions and such other sums as it thinks fit to any such person upon his or her retirement from the service of or on ceasing to be employed by the Executive Board or the Control Board, as the case may be, or upon his or her death or upon the happening of any other event which may be specified by the Executive Board, and in connection therewith shall also have power to establish a Pensions Fund and to take out policies of insurance or indemnity and to make any payments due from the Executive Board to such Pensions Fund and under such policies of insurance or indemnity out of the District (General Expenses) Fund.

2. In the Third Schedule, Part I, Clause 4, of the Scheme, by deleting the words "remuneration and".
