At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 22nd day of *February*, 1940.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 13th day of February, 1940 (C.W.964/40), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, sanction was given to the payment of Establishment Allowance of 10s. a day to Flag Officers and Commodores 1st Class, when in charge of an Establishment or Service and not in receipt of Table Money:

“And whereas we consider that this allowance should be extended to Flag Officers and Commodores 1st Class when appointed as Chief of Staff:

“And whereas we consider that Establishment Allowance of 10s. a day should also be paid to Commodores 2nd Class when appointed, in future, as Chief of Staff, instead of Command Money of 7s. a day and Entertaining Allowance of 5s. a day as at present authorised: .

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by your Order in Council to sanction such revised allowances.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
