His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the King's Police Medal for gallantry to Donald Gainsford, Esq., Senior Superintendent of Police, Alexander Adam Mackeith, Esq., Assistant Superintendent of Police, and the late Foot Constable Abdul Rehman of the Lahore District Police, in recognition of their gallantry on the 8th October, 1939, in an encounter with an armed military deserter. The officers displayed complete disregard for their personal safety, and the Foot Constable was fatally shot before the deserter was himself brought down.
