PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 11th day of January, 1940, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice of Temple Sowerby and the Benefice of Kirkby Thore, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Westmorland and in the Diocese of Carlisle:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Henry Herbert, Bishop of Carlisle, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Temple Sowerby and Kirkby Thore duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Carlisle and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Carlisle signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent

of the said Bishop of Carlisle embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Temple Sowerby and Kirkby Thore are now full the Reverend George Harding being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Temple Sowerby and the Reverend Tufnel Sealy Douglas Barrett being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Kirkby Thore:

"And whereas the Patronage of each of the said Benefices of Temple Sowerby and Kirkby Thore now belongs to one and the same Patron or Patrons:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Henry Herbert, Bishop of Carlisle (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Temple Sowerby and the said Benefice of Kirkby Thore shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Kirkby Thore with Temple Sowerby' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith: and if the said Benefice of Temple Sowerby only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the first

Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Kirkby Thore and the then Incumbent of Temple Sowerby shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and if the said Benefice of Kirkby Thore only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Temple Sowerby and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Temple Sowerby if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Kirkby Thore shall have been instituted to Kirkby Thore subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall have been instituted to the said Benefice of Kirkby Thore before that date and shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the said Benefice of Kirkby Thore following such avoidance of the said Benefice of Temple Sowerby and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Temple Sowerby shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Kirkby Thore shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Temple Sowerby and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and applied by us as a Fabric Fund for and in connection with the Parish Church of Temple Sowerby. Provided always that it shall be lawful for us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at any time and at our discretion to transfer the said Fabric Fund or the balance thereof to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the said Diocese of Carlisle or to any other body willing to accept and hold the same as trustees for the purpose of a Fabric Fund for the said Parish Church as aforesaid.

" 4. That upon the union taking effect there shall be appropriated out of the moneys, securities or other funds then held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the benefit of the United Benefice a capital sum of £500 for and towards the improvement of the Parsonage House of the United Benefice.

" 5. That upon the union taking effect a part of the total endowment of the Benefice hereinbefore recommended and proposed to be constituted an United Benefice that is to say a part sufficient to produce £70 per annum of the sum of money appropriated or to be appropriated by Queen Anne's Bounty to the said

Benefice of Temple Sowerby pursuant to the provisions of Part II paragraph 2 of the Third Schedule to the Tithe Act, 1936, and paragraph 1 of the Eighth Schedule to the same Act shall be severed or diverted from the said Benefice of Temple Sowerby and from the United Benefice, and shall be appropriated by Queen Anne's Bounty (a) as to a sum of £50 per annum for the augmentation of the Benefice of Kirkby Stephen, and (b) as to a sum of £20 per annum for the augmentation of the Benefice of Stainmore, both in the said Diocese of Carlisle.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Carlisle has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been proceeded with to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Carlisle.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme, bearing date the 11th day of January, 1940, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the Parish of Corby, situate in the County of Northampton and in the Diocese of Peterborough:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Corby is a Cure wherein or in part whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said Parish of Corby which is hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111.

"And whereas there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church within and for the said proposed separate District:

"And whereas the principal contributors of the said capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church have nominated to us the Bishop of Peterborough for the time being as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District and, when such District

shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Claude, Bishop of Peterborough (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said Parish of Corby which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Columba, Corby.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of such New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Claude, Bishop of Peterborough, and his successors for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Columba, Corby, being:—

"All that part of the Parish of Corby, in the County of Northampton and in the Diocese of Peterborough, which is bounded upon the north partly by the Parish of Gretton and partly by the Parish of Rockingham, upon the west by the Parish of Cottingham, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Cottingham from the said Parish of Corby crosses the middle of Cottingham Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Cottingham Road for a distance of 1 mile and 27 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries it across the Kettering and Manton Line of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway, and extending thence northward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 1 mile and 42 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Corby from the said Parish of Gretton."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the

secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbent of the Parish of Corby out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken:

And whereas the Patron and the Incumbent of the said Parish of Corby have offered certain objections to the said Scheme:

And whereas notwithstanding the said objections the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Peterborough.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 23rd day of November, 1939, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of South Molton and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Nymet St. George both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Devon and in the Diocese of Exeter:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Charles, Bishop of Exeter, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of South Molton and Nymet St. George duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Exeter and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Exeter signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report; but with the assent of the said Bishop of Exeter contains certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of South Molton and Nymet St. George are now full the Reverend Harold Edwards Nuttall being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of South Molton and the Reverend Thomas Macgrigor Keogh being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Nymet St. George:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent

of the said Charles, Bishop of Exeter (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of South Molton and the said Benefice of Nymet St. George shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of South Molton with Nymet St. George' and that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided.

"2. That the Church of the Parish of South Molton shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of South Molton shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

"3. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Nymet St. George only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the said Benefice of South Molton shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent, or if the Bishop shall not approve, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of South Molton and the then Incumbent of Nymet St. George shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice; and if the said Benefice of South Molton only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Nymet St. George and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Nymet St. George if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of South Molton shall have been instituted to South Molton subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall have been instituted to the said Benefice of South Molton before that date and shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the said Benefice of South Molton following such avoidance of the said Benefice of Nymet St. George and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Nymet St. George shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That upon the union taking effect the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Nymet St. George shall be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

"5. That upon the said union taking effect and pending the provision of a new Parsonage House more conveniently situated the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of South Molton shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 6. That upon the said union taking effect provision shall be made by the Incumbent of the United Benefice for obtaining the services of a Curate and there shall be appropriated as a Fund towards the payment of the stipend of such Curate (a) £60 per annum being part of a Curate Grant at present payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the said Benefice of South Molton and (b) a sum sufficient to produce £96 per annum of the sum of money appropriated or to be appropriated by the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty to the said Benefice of Nymet St. George pursuant to the provisions of Part II paragraph 2 of the Third Schedule to the Tithe Act, 1936, and paragraph 1 of the Eighth Schedule to the same Act and the income accruing in respect of such fund shall be paid by us and by the said Governors respectively to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese as trustees to apply the same for the purpose of making provision towards the stipend of the said Curate.

" 7. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union the Patron of the said Benefice of Nymet St. George shall have the first turn and the Patron of the said Benefice of South Molton shall have the second and the third turns.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Exeter has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been proceeded with to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures against the said Scheme or

any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Exeter.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 16th and 17th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 50, and of the Act of the 23rd and 24th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 124, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 15th day of February, 1940, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 16th and 17th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 50, and of the Act of the 23rd and 24th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 124, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Pilton situate in the County of Devon and in the Diocese of Exeter, by way of exchange for a share of the advowson or right of patronage of and presentation to the United Benefice of Saint Olave with All Hallows on the Wall, Exeter, situate in the same County and Diocese:

" Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Pilton is vested in the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Saint Peter at Exeter:

" And whereas under the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 2nd day of February 1939 and published in the London Gazette on the 7th day of the same month the right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Olave with All Hallows on the Wall, Exeter, is at present exercised alternately by the Right Honourable Thomas Walker Hobart, Viscount Caldecote, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, acting on behalf of Your Majesty, and by the said Dean and Chapter:

" And whereas it has been proposed to us that the patronage of the said two Benefices should be assigned and transferred by way of exchange in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

" And whereas we have made due inquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative value of the said two Benefices and of the patronage thereof respectively and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council that the circumstances and present values of the said two Benefices are as set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed:

" Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Thomas Walker Hobart, Viscount Caldecote, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, acting on behalf of Your Majesty (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Saint Peter at Exeter (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common or Capitular Seal to be affixed to this Scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted order the whole advowson or perpetual right of

patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Pilton shall be transferred from the said Dean and Chapter and from their successors and shall thereupon and thenceforth belong to Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors, to the intent that the same shall from time to time and at all times be exercised on Your Majesty's behalf by the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain and that in exchange for the same the share of the patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Olave with All Hallows on the Wall, Exeter, which is now, as aforesaid, exercised upon Your Majesty's behalf by the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain shall in like manner and upon and from the same date be assigned and transferred from Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors and shall thereupon and thenceforth belong to the said Dean and Chapter to the intent that the whole right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Olave with All Hallows on the Wall, Exeter, may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said Dean and Chapter and their successors.

" And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

" THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

The Medal of the Civil Division of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, for Gallantry.

Harold Francis Charrington, Esq., Assistant Civil Engineer, Air Ministry Works Department, Middle East Command (now Civil Engineer, Air Ministry Works Department, Mediterranean Command).

Mr. H. F. Charrington and Mr. B. M. Timbers, Civil Servants of the Air Ministry Works Directorate, were travelling on duty as passengers in an aircraft which was flying in bad weather conditions in Palestine. The pilot was in the front cockpit and Timbers and Charrington in the rear cockpit in that order.

At a height of about 7,500 feet the machine went into an uncontrollable spin, whereupon the pilot gave the order to jump. Timbers attempted to climb over the side of the cockpit, but the pressure held him down. He then managed to assume a position across the cockpit with one side of the coaming under his back and his feet braced against the opposite side, in an endeavour to get out backwards and head first. He was still unable to get away and Charrington stayed and helped him to get clear, instead of going over the side himself.

When Timbers had jumped, Charrington, with great difficulty, left the machine. When he made his escape he was so close to the ground that a few seconds' delay would have been fatal. He met the ground almost immediately after his parachute opened.

The route followed by the aircraft lay over mountains which rise to a height of 3,000 feet. When the spin commenced thick cloud, enveloping the aircraft, obscured all sight of the ground. In delaying his jump until he had helped Timbers out, Charrington showed bravery of a very high order. The pilot was killed.
