"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction payment of such allowance with effect from the 7th December, 1939.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134; of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49; and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a District Chapelry to the consecrated Church known as Christ Church situate in the Parish of Clevedon in the County of Somerset and in the Diocese of Bath and Wells:

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Francis, Bishop of Bath and Wells (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said Parish of Clevedon which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church known as Christ Church situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Christ Church, Clevedon.'

"And with the like consent of the said Francis, Bishop of Bath and Wells (testified as

aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church known as Christ Church, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees or dues to be received in respect of the publication of banns and of the solemnization or performance of marriages, churchings and burials should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always that so long as the Reverend James Ernest Pugh, the present Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Clevedon, shall continue to be such Vicar or Incumbent, all the fees or dues which may be received in respect of such publication, solemnization or performance at the said Church known as Christ Church, situate as aforesaid, shall be paid over by the Minister thereof to the said James Ernest Pugh.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Christ Church, Clevedon, being:—

"All that part of the Parish of Clevedon, in the County of Somerset and in the Diocese of Bath and Wells, which is bounded upon part of the south and upon part of the east by the New Parish of All Saints, East Clevedon, upon the remaining part of the east and upon part of the north by the Parish of Walton in Gordano, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the north, upon the north-west, upon the south-west and upon the remaining part of the south, by an imaginary line commencing at the point near Oldpark House where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Walton in Gordano from the said Parish of Clevedon reaches the northern side of Robin Lane, and extending thence first south-westward to and then generally westward and along the middle of Robin Lane for a distance of  $4\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the footpath leading into Park Road, and extending thence south-westward to, and along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of  $13\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the eastern side of Park Road, and extending thence first south-westward across Park Road to, and then first south-westward and then in various directions along the middle of the footpath which leads into Hill Road for a distance of  $11\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the north-eastern side of Hill Road near its junction with Bellevue Road, and extending thence south-westward across Hill Road to and along the middle of Bellevue Road for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Linden Road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Linden Road for a distance of  $13\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to its junction with Prince's Road and Lower Linden Road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Lower Linden Road for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Chapel Hill and Highdale Avenue, and extending thence first south-eastward and then eastward along the middle of Highdale Avenue for a distance of 13 chains or thereabouts to the boundary

which divides the said Parish of Clevedon from the said New Parish of All Saints, East Clevedon."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of a part or share of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Churches and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said United Benefice') of Cockley Cley with Gooderstone in the County of Norfolk and in the Diocese of Norwich:

"Whereas under the terms of an Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council dated the 6th day of February, 1925, and published in the London Gazette on the 10th day of the same month for effecting the union of the Benefice of Cockley Cley and the Benefice of Gooderstone a part or share of and in the Advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said United Benefice of Cockley Cley with Gooderstone (that is to say the first and third turns in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the

said United Benefice after the union) was assigned to the Patron of Cockley Cley:

"And whereas the union of the said Benefices of Cockley Cley and Gooderstone took effect on the 6th day of October, 1938:

"And whereas the said part or share of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said United Benefice of Cockley Cley with Gooderstone is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in Sir Samuel Roberts, Baronet, of Cockley Cley Hall in the said County of Norfolk:

"And whereas the said Samuel Roberts is desirous that the said part or share of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said United Benefice of Cockley Cley with Gooderstone now vested in him, as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Norwich for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Bertram, now Bishop of Norwich, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of Patronage which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parishes or Districts in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parishes of Cockley Cley and Gooderstone:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Samuel Roberts (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the said part or share of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said United Benefice of Cockley Cley with Gooderstone now vested in him, the said Samuel Roberts as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Penkrige and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Stretton both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Stafford and in the Diocese of Lichfield:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Edward Sydney, Bishop of Lichfield, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Penkrige and Stretton duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Lichfield and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Lichfield signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Penkrige is now full the Reverend Cyril Edgar Jarman being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Stretton is at present vacant:

"And whereas the patronage of the said Benefice of Stretton belongs to Major Reginald Francis Percy Monckton, of Stretton Hall, in the said County of Stafford:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Edward Sydney, Bishop of Lichfield, and of the said Cyril Edgar Jarman (testified by their signing this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Penkrige and the said Benefice of Stretton shall be permanently united together and form one

Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Penkrige with Stretton' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Cyril Edgar Jarman if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Penkrige shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Penkrige shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Stretton and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us as an addition to the Curate Fund hereinafter referred to.

"4. That upon the said union taking effect provision shall be made by the Incumbent of the United Benefice for obtaining the services of a Curate and a portion of the endowments of the United Benefice namely the whole of the income appertaining to the said Benefice of Stretton shall constitute a fund towards meeting the expenses of providing for the services of a Curate as aforesaid which fund shall be held and administered by the Incumbent of the United Benefice but shall be applicable only to the purpose aforesaid.

"5. That with the consent of the said Reginald Francis Percy Monckton (testified by his signing this Scheme) upon the said union taking effect the patronage of the said Benefice of Stretton shall be surrendered in favour of the Patron of the said Benefice of Penkrige to the intent that the Patronage of the United Benefice shall belong solely to the Patron of the said Benefice of Penkrige.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of

the Bishop of Lichfield has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Lichfield.

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Claude, Bishop of Peterborough, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Rushton and Glendon duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Peterborough and therein recommended the said union and the terms for effecting the same, and the said Bishop of Peterborough signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said union based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas both of the said Benefices are now full the Reverend Kenric Cosens Horwood being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Rushton and the Reverend Thomas Payne Adler being the present Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Rothwell with Glendon:

“ And whereas the share of the patronage of the United Benefice when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall

take effect which upon a fair and just apportionment would be assignable in respect of the interests of the Patrons of the said Benefice of Rothwell with Glendon would in our opinion be negligible:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Peterborough has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Peterborough.

unions of Benefices and Parishes as hereinafter recommended and proposed and the terms for effecting the same, and the said Bishop of Truro signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas there is a pension-charge of £45 per annum payable out of the revenues of the said United Benefice of Warbstow with Otterham in respect of a pension of £70 per annum awarded to the Reverend John Stead Patrick Fagan:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Joseph Wellington, Bishop of Truro (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consents also of the said John Allsopp, the said Jabez Herbert Howlett and the said Richard Graham Crookshank (testified by their signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 5. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the said unions of Benefices and the said union of Parishes shall forthwith take

effect and the said John Allsopp if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Jacobstow shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Jacobstow with Warbstow and the said Jabez Herbert Howlett shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Davidstow with Otterham.

" 6. That upon the unions taking effect the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Tremaine shall be sent by the Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Tresmere with Treneglos and Tremaine to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

That upon the said unions taking effect (a) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Jacobstow shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Jacobstow with Warbstow (b) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Davidstow shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Davidstow with Otterham and (c) so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said United Benefice of Warbstow with Otterham and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

That upon the said unions taking effect the endowments of the said United Benefice of Warbstow with Otterham shall be divided and appropriated as follows, that is to say, there shall be appropriated to the United Benefice of Jacobstow with Warbstow a part, namely, £130 per annum of the annual payment at present made by Queen Anne's Bounty to the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice of Warbstow with Otterham and all the other endowments of such United Benefice including the annual payment of £59 4s. at present made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of such United Benefice shall be appropriated to the United Benefice of Davidstow with Otterham.

of the said United Benefice of Warbstow with Otterham and (b) the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice of Davidstow with Otterham from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of three turns of presentation or nomination to such United Benefice the Patron of the said Benefice of Davidstow shall have the first and the third turns and the Patron of the said United Benefice of Warbstow with Otterham shall have the second turn.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

#### ROYAL AIR FORCE.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve of the undermentioned awards in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:—

*Awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross.*

(1) Squadron Leader William Henry Nigel TURNER (26216).

Squadron Leader Turner was the captain of one of the aircraft which attacked the seaplane base at Sylt on the night of 19-20th March 1940. In the face of severe anti-aircraft fire he showed great determination and ability in attacking his target effectively.

Both small arm and heavy artillery fire surrounded his aircraft in conditions that gave the defence every opportunity, but he calmly and accurately completed his task of bombing the hangars.

(2) Acting Flight Lieutenant James Johnson BENNETT (39056).

Flight Lieutenant Bennett was the captain of one of the aircraft which attacked the seaplane base at Sylt on the night of the 19-20th March 1940. In spite of being held and dazzled by searchlights he descended to 1,000 feet over the base and pressed home his attacks at this low altitude under heavy anti-aircraft fire with great deliberation and resolution, securing direct hits on the seaplane base and causing an outbreak of fire.

564192 Sergeant John Laurence FLETCHER.

Sergeant Fletcher was the captain of one of the aircraft which attacked the seaplane base at Sylt on the night of 19-20th March 1940. He set the highest example of gallantry by successfully attacking the hangars and slipway at a height which brought him, and his crew, up against the full force of the anti-aircraft fire of this heavily defended base.
