The KING has been graciously pleased to approve of the undermentioned awards in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:-

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross.

(1) Squadron Leader William Henry Nigel Turner (26216).

Squadron Leader Turner was the captain of one of the aircraft which attacked the seaplane base at Sylt on the night of 19-20th March 1940. In the face of severe antiaircraft fire he showed great determination and ability in attacking his target effectively.

Both small arm and heavy artillery fire surrounded his aircraft in conditions that gave the defence every opportunity, but he calmly and accurately completed his task of bombing the hangars.

(2) Acting Flight Lieutenant James Johnson Bennett (39056).

Flight Lieutenant Bennett was the captain. of one of the aircraft which attacked the seaplane base at Sylt on the night of the 19-20th March 1940. In spite of being held and dazzled by searchlights he descended to 1,000 feet over the base and pressed home his attacks at this low altitude under heavy antiaircraft fire with great deliberation and resolution, securing direct hits on the seaplane base and causing an outbreak of fire.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Medal.

564192 Sergeant John Laurence Fletcher.

Sergeant Fletcher was the captain of one of the aircraft which attacked the seaplane base at Sylt on the night of 19-20th March 1940. He set the highest example of gallantry by successfully attacking the hangars and slipway at a height which brought him, and his crew, up against the full force of the antiaircraft fire of this heavily defended base.
