WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 20th day of March, 1940 (C.W. 123/40), in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Order in Council dated 28th July, 1938, sanction was given, *inter alia*, to the payment, as from 1st April, 1938, of Marriage Allowance and Children's Allowances to Officers of Your Majesty's Naval Service of such ranks and categories and at such rates and under such conditions as may be agreed between us and the Lord Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury:

“And whereas since that date we have found it necessary to introduce certain modifications of the original scheme of payment of these allowances:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the provisions contained in the annexed schedule.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these provisions.

“SCHEDULE.

“1. With effect from 1st October, 1938, payment of Marriage Allowance is extended to married officers of the rank of Colonel Commandant and Colonel Second Commandant, Royal Marines.

“2. With effect from 4th October, 1938, payment of Marriage Allowance is extended to married officers of the R.N. Shore Signal Service and R.N. Shore Wireless Service who have reached the age of 25.

“3. With effect from 29th June, 1939, the qualifying age for Marriage Allowance in respect of married Royal Naval and Royal Marine Warrant Officers is reduced from 25 to 20 years.

“4. During the present war, with effect from 11th September, 1939, the benefits of the Marriage Allowance Scheme are extended to married Commissioned Officers (below Flag rank) and married Warrant Officers of the Naval Forces who are under 30 and 20 years of age respectively.

“5. During the present war, on the death (actual or officially presumed) of a married Officer, payment may be authorised of a temporary allowance, assessable on the rate of pay and Marriage Allowance in issue for the Officer concerned, to his widow or to the guardian of his children. Such allowance to continue for a period of 13 weeks from the date of notifica-

tion of the Officer's death, or if he is first posted as missing, from the date of cessation of full pay.

“(Note.—The term ‘Marriage Allowance’ includes Children's Allowances).”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 15th day of February, 1940, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Ipswich, Saint Peter, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Ipswich, Saint Mary at the Quay, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Suffolk and in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich:

“Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Ipswich, Saint Peter, and Ipswich, Saint Mary at the Quay, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting such union, and also recommended an alteration of boundaries affecting the Parish of the said Benefice of Ipswich, Saint Mary at the Quay, the Parish of Ipswich, Saint Clement, the Parish of Ipswich, Saint Helen, and the Extra Parochial Place called or known as Shire Hall Yard, all in the said County and Diocese, and the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said Union and alteration of boundaries, which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“And whereas both of the said Benefices are now full, the Reverend Cameron Percy Newell being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ipswich, Saint Peter, and the Reverend James Walter Blanch being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ipswich, Saint Mary at the Quay:

“And whereas the patronage of the said two Benefices of Ipswich, Saint Peter, and

Ipswich, Saint Mary at the Quay, belongs to one and the same body of trustees:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

" 1. That the said Benefice of Ipswich, Saint Peter, and the said Benefice of Ipswich, Saint Mary at the Quay, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ' The United Benefice of Ipswich, Saint Peter with Saint Mary at the Quay ' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

" 2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith: and if one only of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but, if he shall not so consent, or if the Bishop shall not approve, then the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice: and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of either of the said two Benefices if the Incumbent at that time of the other of the said two Benefices shall, with the approval of the Bishop, consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 3. That upon the said union taking effect such one of the Parsonage Houses at present belonging to the said Benefices as shall be designated in writing by the Bishop of the Diocese for the purpose shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the other one of the said Parsonage Houses and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

" 4. That with the consents of John Francis William Deacon, of Mabledon Park, Quarry Hill, Tonbridge, in the County of Kent, Esquire; the Venerable Ernest Newton Sharpe, Archdeacon of London; the Reverend Canon John Ralph Strickland Taylor, Principal of Wycliffe Hall in the University of Oxford; the

Reverend William Leonard Bertram Caley, of Salisbury Square, in the City of London, Clerk in Holy Orders, and Mervyn Gurney Talbot-Rice, of Number 88, Leadenhall Street, in the said City of London, Esquire, as the Patrons of the Rectory of the said Parish of Ipswich, Saint Clement, and also as the Patrons of the Rectory of the said Parish of Ipswich, Saint Helen, with the consent of the Reverend John Christopher Knapp, being the present Incumbent of the said Rectory of the Parish of Ipswich, St. Clement, and with the consent of the Reverend Llewelyn Cradock Roberts, being the present Incumbent of the said Rectory of the Parish of Ipswich, St. Helen (all which consents are testified by the signing of this Scheme by the consenting parties) upon the union taking effect there shall be transferred for all ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Ipswich, Saint Mary at the Quay, (a) all that detached portion of the said Parish of Ipswich, Saint Helen, which lies to the west of Foundation Street, (b) all that said Extra Parochial Place called or known as Shire Hall Yard and (c) all that portion of the said Parish of Ipswich, Saint Clement, which lies to the north-west of the middle of Salthouse Street and to the south-west of the middle of Fore Street.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas an objection has been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objection have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united

shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 14th day of March, 1940, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called ‘ the said Benefice ’) of Ganarew in the County of Hereford and in the Diocese of Hereford:

“ Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Ganarew is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in the Provost and Scholars of Oriel College in the University of Oxford (hereinafter called the said Provost and Scholars):

“ And whereas the said Provost and Scholars are desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Ganarew now vested in them as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Hereford for the time being:

“ And whereas the right Reverend Lisle now Bishop of Hereford is willing to accept such transfer and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Lisle, Bishop of Hereford, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

“ And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Ganarew which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Ganarew:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Provost and Scholars (in testimony whereof they have affixed their Common or Corporate Seal to this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Lisle, Bishop of Hereford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Ganarew now vested in them, the said Provost and Scholars as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Lisle, Bishop of Hereford, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Lisle, Bishop of Hereford, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever:

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Hereford.

WHEREAS the Minister of Health, after giving 10 days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by subsequent enactments, made a Representation to His Majesty in Council that for the protection of

the Public Health, the opening of any new burial ground in the Civil Parish of Elham, in the County of Kent, save with the previous approval of the Minister of Health, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued therein as hereinafter directed:

And whereas by an Order in Council of the 22nd February, 1940, Notice of such Representation was given, and it was ordered that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 4th day of April next, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, that no new burial ground shall be opened in the said Civil Parish of Elham save with the previous approval of the Minister of Health, and that burials shall be discontinued therein as follows, viz.:—

*Elham.*—Forthwith and entirely in the Church of Saint Mary Virgin, in the said Parish, and in the Churchyard attached thereto.

Provided that—

(a) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said Churchyard burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

## SUSPENSION OF WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORISATIONS.

Whereas in pursuance of the power conferred upon the Secretary of State by Regulation 6 of the Raw Opium Regulations, 1921, as extended by the Coca Leaves and Indian Hemp Regulations, 1928, and by Regulation 7 of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928, the Authorisations granted by the aforesaid Regulations to duly qualified medical practitioners to be in possession of and to supply raw opium, coca leaves and Indian hemp and the drugs and preparations to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies, were, by Notice dated the 24th February, 1936, and published in the London Gazette and Edinburgh Gazette on the 28th February, 1936, withdrawn from Owen Cecil Hamilton-Jones, M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P., then residing at "Craig Owen," Bangor, Caernarvonshire, who had been convicted of offences against the Dangerous Drugs Acts:

And whereas at the same time a direction was given by the Secretary of State that it should not be lawful for the said Owen Cecil Hamilton-Jones to give prescriptions for the

purposes of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928.

Now therefore I hereby suspend, until further Order, the operation of the said Notice of Withdrawal and of the said direction regarding prescriptions.
